PACIFIC REGION AWARDS RULES

AWARDS YEAR: January 1 to December 31. All awards may be applied for annually, if merited unless otherwise noted.

ELIGIBILITY: Only National Garden Clubs (NGC) members are eligible to apply for Pacific Region (PR) awards unless otherwise noted. Members are: member garden clubs, plant societies, councils, districts, state garden clubs and individual members of the Pacific Region. Youth must be sponsored by a member garden club of the Pacific Region to be eligible.

APPLICATION ENTRY FORM:

PR adopted NGC's application format and procedure for applying for awards. The PR application entry form contains topics to be addressed along with any supporting photographs.

- There is a 3-page limit, using only the front of the page. Exceptions noted.
- Binders and vinyl sheet protectors are no longer required or allowed. Exceptions noted.
- Application entries will not be returned. Make a copy before forwarding it.
- Forms are available on the PR website and from state awards chairmen.
- Award applications are to be sent to your state awards chairman unless otherwise noted.

DEADLINES: March 1. All state entries are sent by the state awards chairman in one package with <u>a complete list of entries</u> (packing list). Do not place each entry in its own envelope. Package must be received by **March 1** by mail and/or electronically.

High School Distinguished Service Project entry to PR HS Distinguished Service Award Chairman: January 1

Youth Poetry Contest entry to PR Poetry Contest Chairman: February 1

Member Award of Honor entry to PR Awards Chairman: February 1

Garden Club Membership (formerly Publicity Press Books) entries to Chairman: January 1

Smokey Bear/Woodsy Owl Poster Contest entries to PR Smokey Bear Poster Contest Chairman: February 23

Yearbook entries to PR Awards Chairman: March 1

It is the responsibility of the state awards chairman to send entries to the appropriate PR Chairman.

PR AWARD BOOK OF EVIDENCE:

A Book of Evidence should ONLY be prepared for the following:

- Small Standard Flower Show Award: 10 pages (20 surfaces front & back)
- Garden Club Membership: Printed materials, materials for electronic publication, and publicity may be attached to the application and are not counted as part of the three-page limit
- Member Award of Honor: not to exceed 3 pages

PROCEDURE FOR APPLYING:

Applicants:

- Complete the application form and submit to your state awards chairman by the deadline set by your state.
- When one project is eligible for various awards, submitting exact duplication for the application is not acceptable. A separate application form must be completed for each award.
- Keep one copy of the completed application for your records.
- YEARBOOKS complete applicable information of the PR Application Form. Attach the completed application form to the inside front cover (send only 1 yearbook). No envelope necessary. Mail to state awards chairman.

Publications: Submit entry in an envelope with completed PR Application Form secured to outside and one enclosed inside envelope. Newsletter: submit three sample issues and state number of issues per year on PR Application Form. Printed publications or printed copies of those prepared for electronic distribution are acceptable entries. Submit entries to your state awards chairman by deadline set by your state.

State Awards Chairman:

1st place winning entries in each category must be sent by mail to **the PR Awards Chairman by March 1**, note exceptions. <u>A complete list of entries from your state should be included with submissions.</u>

Youth Awards: 1st place winning entries in each category should be submitted to the appropriate PR Chairman according to regional deadlines.

Categories by Size:

Garden Club applications shall be judged according to size determined by number of members on whom NGC and state dues are paid, including Active, Associate, Inactive, Honorary, etc.

i. Small Club: 29 members and under

ii. Medium Club: 30-59 membersiii. Large Club: 60-99 members

iv. Extra Large Club: 100+ members

State Garden Clubs applications shall be judged according to size determined by number of members on whom NGC dues are paid, including garden club members, Affiliates, State Life Members, etc.

i. Small State: 500 members and under

ii. Medium State: 501 – 4,000 members

iii. Large State: 4,001+ members

CERTIFICATES OF MERIT:

Awards: 1st, 2nd, 3rd and honorable mention certificates may be awarded. Certificates will be presented at the PR Convention when held prior to state conventions. Certificates will be mailed to state awards chairman when the PR Convention is held after state conventions. An entry must score 90 or more to be awarded first place recognition.

RETURN OF MATERIALS: State presidents are responsible to collect their state's entries at the close of the PR Convention.

SCALE OF POINTS for all Pacific Region Awards

Except Flower Shows, Publications, and Yearbooks

<u>Presentation:</u> **5 Points** – neat, concise includes all required information on the PR Application form not to exceed 3 pages (front side only).

<u>Achievement:</u> **65 points** – scope of project: need and fulfillment; benefit; accomplishments; comprehensiveness of work; activities to attain goals; evaluation of goals reached; educational value; prior planning; brief history if continuing project; financial report; other.

<u>Participation</u>: **15 Points** – size of club. Involvement of members, community, government agencies, professionals, youth, residents in facilities, others – not all of these have to be involved.

<u>Record or Documentation</u>: **15 points** – supporting data (as applicable); clear, well-labeled and neatly attached before and after photographs; landscape plan (does not have to be professionally drawn); financial report; letters of appreciation; community awards; newspaper/magazine articles, etc.

Scale of Points for Publications

Except Yearbooks

Presentation, and Record or Documentation should be on the Pacific Region award application form. See award description for number of copies of the publication to be sent.

Presentation: **5 Points** – brief description of publication.

<u>Achievement:</u> (as applicable) **65 Points** – educational; informative; accuracy; clarity of subject; quality of printing;

photography and/or graphics; general appeal; indicates a member of NGC ad PR.

Promotes NGC Objectives: 15 Points

Record or Documentation: **15 Points** – number of copies distributed/Sold; how distributed, financial information; cost of

publishing; price if sold; market exposure.

Scale of Points for Standard Flower Show Schedules

Scales of Points for Small Standard Flower Shows and Standard Flower Show Schedules will be the NGC Scale of Points found in the NGC Handbook for Flower Shows. Use PR award application form.

Scale of Points for Yearbooks:

Judged according to the NGC Scale of Points for Yearbooks found in the NGC Award Rules 2017-2019 found on NGC website and in *The National Gardener*. No Book of Evidence is required. A PR Award Application should accompany the yearbook as cover sheet.

NGC MEMBER AWARD OF HONOR DEADLINE: February 1

Youth Activities - A year's program or one workshop/event involving activities with youth education.

District

Member Award of Honor may be awarded to one NGC member in each region whose volunteer efforts during a period of five or more years, has made outstanding contributions to club and community, in one or more of the following areas: civic development, horticulture therapy, youth activities, conservation, landscape design, horticulture, floral design, or all around excellence. Eligibility: any member of a NGC state garden club who has never been a member of NGC Board of Directors. Eligibility and Rules listed on NGC Website, "Awards – Member Award of Honor". A book of evidence should be submitted not to exceed 3 pages. Obtain application form from state or regional awards chairman. Entries are submitted to state awards chairman by state's deadline date. State awards chairman forwards one entry to regional awards chairman by February 1.
