Dove Season
Sep 1 - Nov 9



Duck Season
Sep 23 - Nov 5



Pheasant Season
Oct 21 - Jan 31

OUTDOOR ADVENTURES

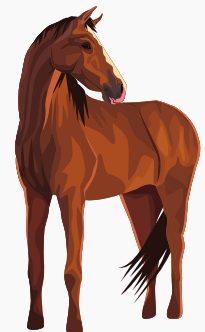
