MVHS APRIL MEETING

On April 11 at the Dayton Metro Library-Vandalia Branch, Doug Beilstein presented "**Are TETS our Next Frontier**." The talk was a fascinating discussion of what tetraploid hostas are, how they are engineered, and what advantages and disadvantages they have over traditional diploid hostas. Tetraploids have four chromosomes, whereas traditional hostas have two. Some of the advantages of Tets are greater substance, larger flowers and sharper colors. The disadvantages are a tendency towards brittleness and lack of variety in leaf shape. Doug has been hybridizing tets and is excited about the possibilities for future hosta varieties. As a bonus, he talked about frost damage of hostas and the importance of removing the mushy tissue to avoid rot.


2017 American Hosta Society National Convention in Indianapolis
