



# Summer Jump Jockey Profits

*Profitable angles for the Summer*

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## Introduction

First of all, congratulations and thank you for downloading Summer Jump Jockey Profits, a collection of profitable jockey angles for the summer months. The jockeys in this guide have all earned their place by consistently making profits when followed in a shrewd, logical manner.

In selecting the jockeys highlighted I have tried to get a mix of household names, underrated types who have been riding for a while and newcomers who I feel have real potential. Most of the jockeys in this guide would have returned a profit even if you had followed them blindly from June to September over the last 4 years. However, we've dug a bit deeper into those records to identify circumstances where these jockeys really excel and the profits are multiplied.

Please note, however, that due to the statistical nature of this information, losing runs CAN AND DO occur so pay close attention to the staking and bank size advice in the user guide that follows this introduction. There are several ways of backing these selections profitably so take a bit of time to think about the style of betting that suits you and your attitude to risk.

## User Guide

In putting this guide together I have tried to make things as easy and straightforward as possible. However, there are one or two terms that newcomers to racing may not understand so here is a glossary of terms and their meanings.

### Glossary

Overall – All rides that this jockey has had in the specified time period.

Handicap/Hcap/Hcp – A handicap is a race in which horses carry weight according to their ability, such that each has a theoretically equal chance of winning.

Chase – A chase is a race run over fences. The runners jump over a variety of obstacles that can include plain fences, water jumps or open ditches.

Hurdle – A hurdle is a race where the obstacles are called hurdles. The hurdles are smaller than fences and are typically made of a series of panels made of brush and are flexible.

Bumper – A bumper is a flat race run under the rules of jump racing.

SR – Strike Rate

### **Staking**

I recommend that you use a betting bank of at least 100 points. For example, if you have £100 set aside as your starting bank, you would divide this by 100 to determine how much you would place on each selection – in this example it would be  $£100 \div 100 = £1$  per selection

The way you use these statistics and the selections they identify is entirely a matter of personal choice. They have made a long-term profit backing each and every selection to level stakes.

However, I personally use them as an adjunct to my own form/market reading and stake (or avoid them) accordingly. Please remember that some of these angles have a lowish strike rate, despite being very profitable and I would advise thinking very carefully about how aggressively you stake these.

## **Where to Place Your Bets**

Again, this is down to personal preference but I would be tempted to back the shorter priced selections (7/1 and below) with an early price best odds guaranteed bookmaker. With the larger priced selections, it might be better to back at Betfair SP.

It is also always a good idea to have a range of bookmakers accounts to ensure that you are achieving the best price available on all selections.

However, all profit figures quoted in this manual are calculated at Betfair Starting Price after 2% commission has been removed.

## 1. PJ Brennan

Paddy has been one of the leading jockeys in the UK for a long time now and there are very few jockeys who ride a stronger finish – he strikes me as the kind of man who would pick the horse up and carry him over the line if he felt it necessary.

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### Overall performance UK National Hunt June to September 2019-2022 inclusive.

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI BSP
349	79	22.64%	+127.85	36.63%

A particularly outstanding performance showing a substantial profit backing all his mounts at Betfair SP across 349 bets – a testament to how great a jockey he is.

However, if we look at just his hurdle races, the profits improve considerably and cut down the number of bets we need to place!

### Hurdle Races

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI BSP
206	47	22.82%	+145.68	70.72%

A very decent profit returned at Betfair SP with profits in all years bar 2021.

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### Paddy Brennan Recommendation:

Back all Paddy's rides in hurdle races from June to September. Focus on rides for Fergal O'Brien to improve Win Strike rate to 27.78%

## 2. Gavin Sheehan

Gavin has been riding in the UK since 2012 and has an overall win strike rate of 17.5%. Let's see how he gets on in the summer.

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### Overall performance UK National Hunt June to September 2019-2022 inclusive.

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BFSP	ROI BSP
298	65	21.81%	+77.2	25.91%

A sparkling overall performance but there is some danger lurking in those numbers. 1 of the 4 years produced a fairly substantial loss and the profit figures are being slightly skewed by a couple of chunky priced winners at BSP.

I prefer to sacrifice a little bit of profit to improve strike rate and consistency.

To that end in the table below I've concentrated solely on non-handicap races in the period, which produces the following figures:

### Non-Handicap Races

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BFSP	ROI BSP
129	35	27.13%	+60.58	46.96%

More than good enough for inclusion!

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### Gavin Sheehan Recommendation:

Back Gavin when he rides in non-handicap races from June to September.



### 3. RP McLernon

Richie McLernon has been around for a long time now and has had a good few months out this year with a broken leg. However, he seems fully recovered from that now after riding a treble for Ben Haslam just a couple of weeks ago (mid-May).

Experienced as he is, he is still massively overlooked in the betting market when you consider his summer performance figures below:

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#### Overall performance UK National Hunt June to September 2019-2022 inclusive.

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI@BSP
245	34	13.88%	+164.76	67.25%

A huge profit has been achieved just backing his mounts blindly with a very low strike rate. These overall figures however hide a loss in 2021 and I'd like to see a slightly higher strike rate to include him here.

However, it's a much brighter picture if we drill down in several areas – who he's riding for, where he's riding and the type of race. The table below shows his performance at specific tracks for particular trainers:

#### Hurdles and Chases at Cartmel, Hexham and Sedgefield for either Ben Haslam, Neil Mulholland or Jonjo O'Neill

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI@BSP
63	15	23.81%	+140.91	223.66%

As you can see, although profit has dropped slightly, our number of bets is massively reduced, our strike rate is improved dramatically and we add substantial profit to the bottom line!

No need to dig any further – we have our McLernon angle!

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#### RP McLernon Recommendation:

Back Richie when he is riding in Chases or Hurdles at Cartmel, Sedgefield or Hexham for Ben Haslam, Neil Mulholland or Jonjo O'Neill from June to September inclusive.

## 4. Harry Cobden

One of the very best jockeys riding today, evidenced by his spot at the Nicholls yard.

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### Overall performance UK National Hunt June to September 2019-2022 inclusive.

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI@BSP
210	53	25.24%	+25.69	12.24%

Very decent numbers overall with a whopping strike rate. However, it would be nice to get the profit up without damaging the strike rate. There are also two losing years hidden in the overall numbers.

Drilling down to find areas in which Harry performs even better, the table below shows his performance just in Handicap chases in the period:

### Handicap Chases Only

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI@BSP
92	28	30.43%	+41.2	44.79%

That will do for me!

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### Harry Cobden Recommendation:

Back Harry in all Handicap Chases from June to September.

## 5. Aidan Coleman

Another jockey who has been around for a long time and had a lot of success having ridden 1300 career winners at a 19% strike rate.

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### Overall performance UK National Hunt June to September 2019-2022 inclusive.

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI@BSP
185	42	22.7%	+60.72	32.82%

Excellent figures even without any filtering,

However, If we dig a little further into the data, we can see improve the overall profit and ROI by focussing just on Aidan's performance in Handicaps:

### Handicaps only

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI@BSP
114	26	22.81%	+76.01	66.67%

Less bets, more profit seems the way to go to me!

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### Aidan Coleman Recommendation:

Back all of Aidan's Handicap rides from June to September.

## 6. Brian Hughes

From a winner standpoint, Brian is currently the best jockey in the country and winner of 3 of the last 4 jump jockey championships.

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### Overall performance UK National Hunt June to September 2019-2022 inclusive.

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI@BSP
809	184	22.74%%	+122.95	15.2%

Even with his obvious success, we could have turned a substantial profit over the last 4 years just blindly backing his rides from June to September!

However, there are some circumstances under which his rides are even more severely underestimated.

We don't have to drill down too far to come up with an excellent angle that improves all figures. If we look at just his hurdle races during the period, we end up with these figures:

#### All Hurdle rides

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI@BSP
493	118	23.94%	+175.26	35.55%

A very decent win strike rate and an overall profit of 175.26 points at BSP means these are rides we would do well to take notice of.

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### Brian Hughes Recommendation:

Back Brian's Hurdles rides from June to September.

## 7. Sean Bowen

Currently leading the Jump Jockeys championship (as of 04-06-23), Sean is a force to be reckoned with. However, he's one of the few jockeys in this table that the markets seem not to underestimate:

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### Overall performance UK National Hunt June to September 2019-2022 inclusive.

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI@BSP
503	101	20.08%	-43.25	-8.6%

While an overall loss at BFSP is not ideal, with some drilling down into that data, we can reveal an exceptionally profitable angle. By focussing on his handicap chase rides and only considering runners forecast at 6/1 or below to increase the strike rate, Sean produces the following numbers:

### All rides in Handicap Chases forecast at 6/1 or below

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI@BSP
133	40	30.08%	+34.25	25.75%

That's much better and that massively improved win strike rate makes this a very easy angle to follow.

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### Sean Bowen Recommendation:

Back all Sean's Handicap Chase rides forecast at 6/1 or below from June to September.

## 8. Derek Fox

Grand National winning jockey Derek has a quite astounding overall profit level showing that his rides are substantially under bet in the markets.

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### Overall performance UK National Hunt June to September 2019-2022 inclusive.

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI@BSP
173	20	11.56%	+118.69	68.61%

A great starting point but it would be nice if we could improve that strike rate which could try your patience after a while!

If we look at Derek's performance in hurdles and chases (so excluding bumpers) and from there focus just on his rides at Bangor, Cartmel, Hexham or Perth, performance improves across the board as can be seen in the table below:

### All Chase or Hurdle rides at Bangor, Cartmel, Hexham or Perth

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI@BSP
149	20	13.42%	+142.69	95.77%

Much better and, while that strike rate still isn't ideal, the profits are so substantial that Derek is more than worthy of his place particularly as he shows a profit every year apart from 2019 when he made only a very small loss.

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### Derek Fox Recommendation:

Back all Derek's Chase or Hurdle rides at Bangor, Cartmel, Hexham or Perth.

## 9. Brendan Powell

It seems OK to drop the Jr from Brendan's name now he has been riding for more than a dozen years and established himself as a force in his own right.

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### Overall performance UK National Hunt June to September 2019-2022 inclusive.

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI@BSP
184	32	17.39%	+76.48	41.57%

A very good performance with a decent strike rate and plenty of profit even just backing blindly with a very decent strike rate and plenty of profit at Betfair SP. It would be even nicer though if we could improve both the profit and the strike rate!

And we can do that by focussing only on Brendan's rides in handicap chases which produce the figures in the table below:

### All rides in Handicap Chases

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI@BSP
83	23	27.71%	+83.94	101.14%

We get less than half the bets, almost all of the winners and even a small increase in profit – perfect!

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### Brendan Powell Recommendation:

Back all of Brendan's handicap chase rides from June to September.

## 10. Nico De Boinville

Descended from French nobility, Nico has been the main man at Seven Barrows for a few years now so has all the ammunition needed to win the top races – and he has done exactly that!

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**Overall performance UK National Hunt June to September 2019-2022 inclusive.**

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI@BSP
175	45	25.71%	+33.73	19.28%

I find it quite surprising that Nico is underbet in the market to the extent that he can regularly ride the best horses in the country and still produce a profit backed blindly at Betfair SP! That can still be improved though.

If we just consider his rides for Nicky Henderson we reduce the number of runners by more than 40 but only lose 4 of the winners as can be seen below:

**All rides for Nicky Henderson**

Runners	Winners	Win SR	P/L @BSP	ROI@BSP
134	61	30.6%	+54.42	40.61%

A great angle with just one filter!

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**Nico De Boinville Recommendation:**

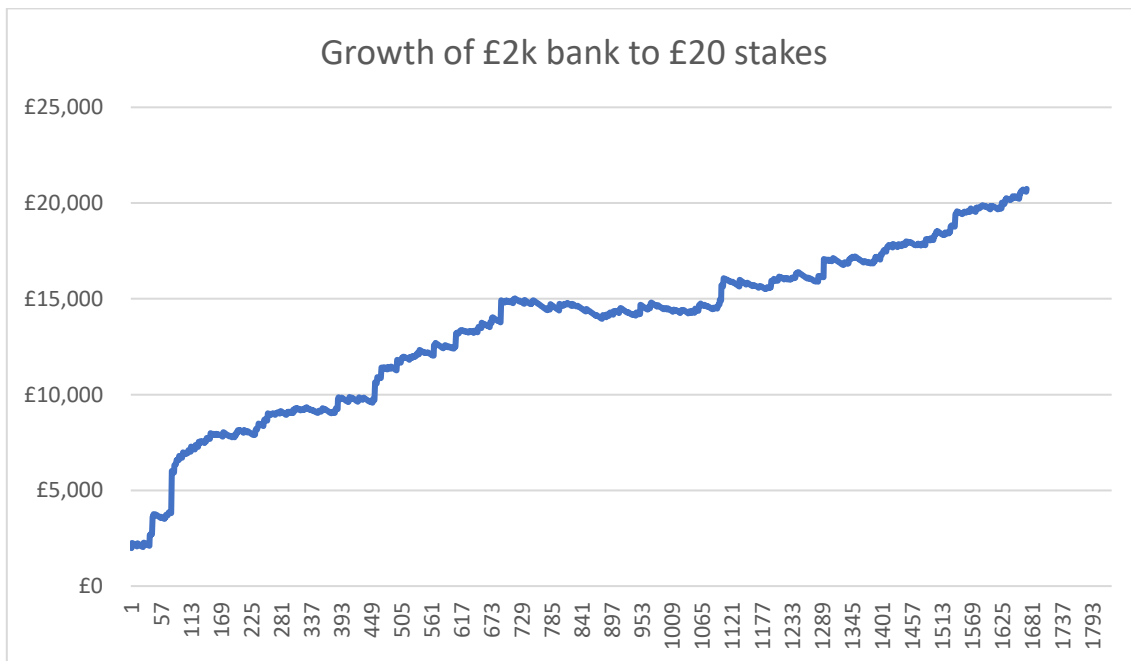
Back all Nico's rides for Nicky Henderson from June to September.



## Summary

Jockey	Recommendation from June to September inclusive
Paddy Brennan	All rides in Hurdle races.
Gavin Sheehan	All rides in Non-Handicap races.
RP McLernon	All rides in Chases or Hurdles at Cartmel, Sedgefield or Hexham for Ben Haslam, Neil Mulholland or Jonjo O'Neill.
Harry Cobden	All rides in Handicap Chases.
Aidan Coleman	All rides in Handicaps.
Brian Hughes	All rides in Hurdle races.
Sean Bowen	All Handicap Chase rides forecast at 6/1 or below.
Derek Fox	All Chase or Hurdle rides at Bangor, Cartmel, Hexham or Perth.
Brendan Powell	All rides in Handicap Chases.
Nico de Boinville	All rides for Nicky Henderson.
