

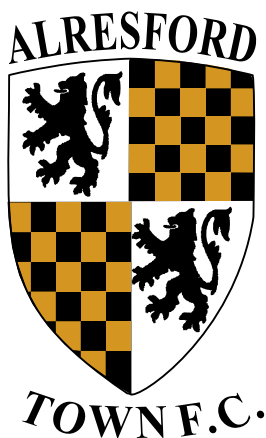

MANAGERS MESSAGE

Good afternoon everyone

We should be in for another great game of football this afternoon as we welcome Andover Town to Arlebury Park.

ANDOVER TOWN

In November 2012, a couple of months after Andover Football Club went into administration, staff at Sparsholt and Andover Colleges were considering how to further enhance facilities for the Football Academy programme at both Colleges.

After approaching Test Valley Borough Council an ambitious plan was developed to take over The Portway stadium in Andover and redevelop it as a site for teaching the Academy programme whilst, in addition, establishing an adult senior football side that would provide a vehicle for the more talented academy players to make the transition from youth to Senior football. Much was achieved however, despite support from the Wessex League, the Football Association initially denied the College the opportunity to enter a Senior side into the league and, through doing so, access some of the grant support necessary to bring the project to fruition. In May 2013 during a lengthy meeting at Wembley Stadium staff from the College and officials from the Wessex League had one final opportunity to convince F.A. staff that Andover Town Football Club should become a reality. Ultimately successful, manager Neil Benson then set about building a team capable of holding its own within Division One, whilst Assistant Principal Stuart Barlow and Curriculum Manager, Lawrence Blair, set about getting the stadium ready for the new team to play in.

Season 2013/4 - At the end of their first season Andover Town finished second in Wessex League Division One and were successfully promoted to the Wessex Premier Division for the 2014-2015 season. They also finished as Runners-Up in the Andover Open Cup, losing on penalties to Otterbourne FC (having drawn 3-3 after extra-time) and went on to become the Winners of the Salisbury Hospitals Cup, defeating Bemerton Heath Harlequins in the Final 3-2. Andover Town ended the season on 73 points, winning 23 of the 30 games, drawing 4 losing just 3 games. In the 30 games played Andover Scored 108 goals, with Michael Dixon being Andover Town's top goalscorer with 34 goals in 29 games. Town also ended the season with least goals against only conceding 28 goals, with goalkeeper Michael Weatherall keeping 13 clean sheets. Lewis Benson (captain) ended the season picking up both fans player and players player for the 2013-2014 season, another special mention should go to Lloyd Foot who scored 18 goals (league) from centre back, and the ex saints star subsequently moved on to play for Sutton United and then to Eastbourne Borough.

Season 2014/5 - The Town's next season saw the team finish in a creditable 10th place in their first season in the Wessex Premier Division.

Season, 2015/6 - Then the following season, the club finished in 4th place in the Wessex Premier League, just missing out on promotion. Finishing as second highest scorers in the league with 97 goals. The club also provided two England school boys internationals - Charlie Gunson & Adam Grange.

Season 2016/7 We progress to the 1st Qualifying round of the Emirates F.A. Cup beating Royal Wootton Bassett Town at home (5-2) & Spelthorne Sports away (3-2) along the way before losing out to Farnborough in the next round. Having finished in fourth place in the previous season we were exempt to the first round proper of the Buildbase F.A.Vase where we visited Fairford Town winning 2-1, so progressing into round two - our furthest in this competition. We, however, lost 2-1 away to Croydon in the second round. With a win at Fawley in October we equalled a club record of 4 consecutive away wins in the league & beating Fairford Town in the F.A.Vase we equalled a club record of 5 consecutive away wins in all competitions. However, the season ended with a disappointing 13th place finish in the league.

Season 2017/8 The new season opened with a 6-1 home league win against Bemerton Heath Harlequins. The club then progressed on an unbeaten run in the league of 16 games, finally losing 3-0 at Alresford Town on 8th November. Whilst their cup encounters didn't fare as well - after two wins in the F.A.Cup, including beating Southern League, Wimborne Town after a replay, before losing at home to Cadbury Heath from Bristol. Then a quick exit from the F.A.Vase losing to Horndean after extra time. Half way through the season after 21 games, the club were riding high at the top of the table. By the end of the season with two matches left, the club clinched promotion to the Southern League West division, for the first time in their short history.

The season also saw us achieve the most goals scored (116) since our formation in 2013 and the most points in a season (99) plus of course the highest ever finish as runners up (second place) in the Sydenhams Wessex Premier league.

The club won the final of the Russell Cotes Cup beating AFC Stoneham 1-0

The club won "Club of the Month" twice during the season - August & October 2017

Another success for the 2017 / 18 season, for the second year in succession, our Portway groundsman Chris White has been nominated for the National FA Groundsman of the Year awards, representing the entire Wessex League (i.e best Wessex League groundsman) and, of course Andover Town Football Club. The FA carried out their assessment at Portway. Indeed, Chris won the coveted award "Although no longer at The Portway, last season's Andover Town F.C. groundsman Chris White has won outright the coveted FA National Groundsman of the Year competition for the 2017/18 season. Competing against approximately 650 other clubs right across the country at Step 5 and 6 of the Football pyramid, the judging panel consisted of Professional groundsman from the likes of Wembley Stadium, Manchester City and Southampton."

Sadly, although finishing in second place and the chance of promotion to the Southern League, the directors decided to reject promotion. This caused the F.A. to demote the club to level 6 in the football pyramid, back to the Sydenhams Wessex First Division..

Season 2018/9 Pre-season, Ron Bertie was chosen as manager, taking over from Glenn Burnett who retired, plus Jason Holmes taking over as assistant manager. So, the new management recruited many players from the Sparsholt Academy giving young players a chance to show their potential, this after the total departure of all the previous players from the last season. Unfortunately the season started with the heaviest defeat of the club, losing 10-1 at the Portway to AFC Stoneham. This was followed by an exit from the F.A.Cup losing 5-2 to U.S.Portsmouth, Despite these setbacks, the side showed promise. However, the club lost their first 12 competitive matches before finally getting a win on 29th September 2018, at home to Fawley AFC, winning 2-1. As the season progressed 'Town' found themselves in the bottom three of the league however, they finished second from bottom.

The son of manager Ron Bertie, namely Josh Bertie, is an international player for the British Virgin Islands. "In July 2018 they played three International Friendly matches, so three Caps for Josh, with two victories and a draw - beating Saint Maarten three two and Saint Barthelemy four three whilst the draw was the outcome of a goalless ninety minutes against Saint Martin."

Season 2019/20 'Town' stayed in the Wessex League Division one, hoping for a better season. Mixed fortunes at the start of the season in the league. Three cup exits early on - Hampshire senior cup losing to Folland Sports on penalties, then the League cup losing 6-0 to Bemerton Heath Harlequins followed by defeat in the F.A. Vase losing 4-1 at home to Westbury United. However, 'Town's' season did improve and the team ended the year in eighth place in the league. The signs of improvement were good after the previous season and the team & management looked forward to further success in 2020.

Sadly the season came to an end when the 'Coronavirus' struck the country and consequently the F.A. decided that all matches become null & void. So, all records would be deleted and won't count for any records. The club ended in 11th position an improvement on the previous season. The club now had to look forward to start building again for the next season.

Season 2020/21 Despite the 'Coronavirus' continuing - the pre-season friendlies showed signs of encouragement for the forthcoming season. Sad news was that Town weren't entered for either the F.A. Cup or the F.A. Vase, so the concentration would be on improving on last season's league position. As the season started the results overall were looking good Town reached 7th spot in the league when the second lockdown for the Coronavirus called a halt to all matches - the last match was played on 15th December 2020. Unfortunately due to the continuing problems with the 'Coronavirus' the season suffered as the previous season and was declared null & void. So with much optimism the club looked forward to next season.

Season 2021/22 Although the Corona virus was still in existence the season began. The season began with renewed optimism. Early mixed fortunes in league & cup competitions but Town put in a long unbeaten run in the league of 15 matches took them to second in the league. (One downside meeting local rivals Andover New Street four times drawing twice in the league the losing 4-1 in the F.A. Vase and then losing 5-1 in the North Hants Senior Cup). Striker Josh Bertie became the team's top scorer beating previous best held by Michael Dixon of 54 goals. As the season ended, Town finished just outside the play-offs, losing out to Laverstock & Ford who gained promotion winning the play-off. However, it was the highest finish, sixth, under manager Ron Bertie.

Season 2022/23 The pre-season saw the departure of captain Brendan Holmes to Salisbury and leading scorer Josh Bertie to Winchester City. The pre-season matches resulted in a draw, two wins and a defeat. This left the management team with much to ponder on. However, Brendan Holmes did return to the club in time for the new season and reached 200 appearances for the club. The season saw Town go seven games in the league unbeaten then a run of mixed fortunes. Town's cup runs ended fairly quickly however, they did reach the semi-final of the Wessex League Cup - beating three Wessex premier sides on the way before losing on penalties to Premier side Baffins Milton Rovers. Once again Town missed out on promotion and the play-offs. Striker Josh Bertie did return to the club towards the end of the season. There was a sad time losing a real club stalwart who passed away namely "Mr Andover" Alan Mussell. The season ended with a 7th place finish in the league.

Season 2023/24 Once again captain Brendon Holmes departed to seek ventures new, Ben Emans probably out for most of the new season through injury and young Ryan Griffiths also seeking new pastures. The league season didn't get off to the best start losing 8-0 away to Millbrook, after previously holding Premier side Christchurch to a draw in the Hampshire Senior Cup but losing on penalties. Although a couple of decent results early on, sadly the club had a run of bad results in the league. Also the departure of the much travelled Zach Hine to Alresford Town early on. The year end saw Town in the bottom two in the league. However, there were positive signs as the return of top scorer Josh Bertie scored a hat-trick in a 3-0 win over relegation rivals AFC Aldermaston but Town slumped to local rivals Whitchurch United with Bertie scoring one of the goals.

ALRESFORD TOWN CLUB HISTORY

Football in Alresford has been found back to the late nineteenth century, but the formation year of the present ALRESFORD TOWN FC side is shown as 1989. Starting in the now defunct North Hants League, Town moved immediately into the Hampshire League before withdrawing in 1996. They returned, again from the North Hants League, in 2000 and then came the 2004 move; they've remained members of the Wessex League since and have been a top tier side since 2007.

The original Alresford Town was established in 1898 and were members of the Winchester & District League. The modern club was established in 1989 and joined the North Hants League. After finishing as runners-up in their first season, they moved up to Division Two of the Hampshire League. The club were Division Two runners-up in 1990/91, securing a second successive promotion to Division One. However, after finishing second-from-bottom of Division One in 1994/95, they were relegated back to Division Two. At the end of the following season the club left to re-join the North Hants League.

Alresford were North Hants League champions in 1999/00 and returned to Division Two of the Hampshire League. After finishing second in Division Two in 2001/02 they were promoted to Division One. In 2004 the Hampshire League merged into the Wessex League, with the club becoming members of the new Division Two. The division was renamed Division One in 2006 and Alresford were runners-up in 2006/07, earning promotion to the Premier Division. After five seasons in the lower-mid table, the club were Premier Division runners-up in 2012/13, a season that saw them win the Hampshire Senior Cup (beating AFC Bournemouth in the final), the League Cup and the North Hants Senior Cup. They were Premier Division runners-up again the following season, also retaining the League Cup and the North Hants Senior Cup, as well as winning the Aldershot Senior Cup.

In 2018/19 Alresford won the Southampton Senior Cup, beating AFC Stoneham 3–0 in the final. The 2019/20 season was abandoned due to the coronavirus pandemic with Alresford top of the Premier Division.

In 2021/22 Alresford won the North Hants Senior Cup beating Basingstoke Town 1-0.
