Thank you for not being that neighbor!

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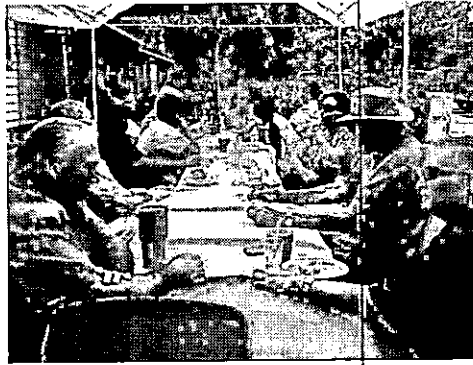

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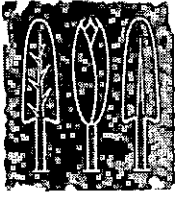
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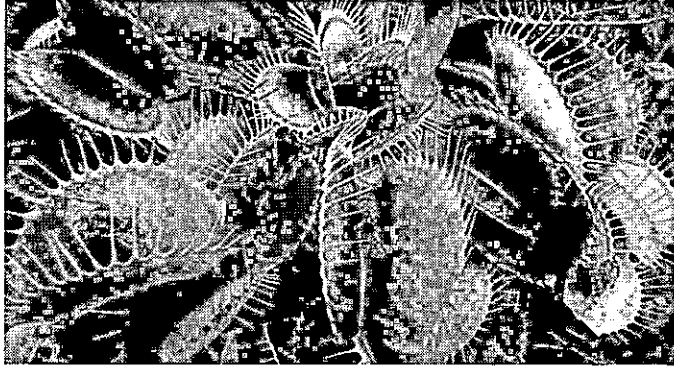


Mercer Botanic Gardens

Held at the church for three weeks in July, Camp Hope is more than VBS and more than a summer day camp. It's a place where Bible stories come alive, faith becomes real, and mentoring relationships are formed – all through the leadership of passionate teens and young adults.

"Camp Hope is unique because it is led entirely by high school and college students, many of whom grew up attending Camp Hope themselves," said the Rev.
