Focus on Safety: Our Sheriff's Deputies

Scott Shaffer was born in Dubuque, Iowa and raised in places as varied as Caracas, Venezuela and Aruba. He and his family have lived in the Klein area since the early 70s; Shaffer graduated from Klein High School in 1978.

"When I was younger, there were three things I swore I would never do," laughs soft-spoken Deputy Shaffer, "get married, join the military, and go into law enforcement." After spending four years in the U.S. Navy, Shaffer says that becoming a deputy was a natural transition.

As a 24-year veteran, he knows he made the right career decision. The part he enjoys most about his job is meeting and helping people on a daily basis. "You become a Sheriff's Deputy for the same reason you become a teacher...not to get rich, but because you love what you do."

Deputy Shaffer has been on the Olde Oaks contract since 2009. He says that our community is unusual in that residents don't hesitate to flag him down to ask what's going on in the neighborhood or tell him about something that they've seen going on. "When crime occurs in this neighborhood, I take it personally. I feel just like this is my own community, and I, as well as the other deputies on this contract, take it that seriously."

Shaffer likens his patrol car to a rolling office. "I drive through and I can only see so much. I can't see what's happening in your backyard. I rely on residents to tell me if they have concerns or if something is going on. Pick up the phone and let us know what's going on."

Shaffer urges us to keep our eyes and ears open. He says that the perpetrators of the last couple of burglary rashes were

caught because residents were paying attention and called in what they'd seen and heard. It pays to be a good neighbor and be aware of your surroundings at all times.

Although we may not like to hear it, Shaffer maintains that 90% of the burglaries in this community could have been prevented by locking doors, removing valuables from plain sight in vehicles, and setting alarms.

One of Shaffer's most memorable calls occurred when he was a rookie. He responded to the scene of a burglary in progress. Seven armed deputies descended upon the back yard of a home whose owners were on vacation. Instead of burglars, they found the couple who was house-sitting enjoying the sultry summer evening in the home's pool...naked!

Shaffer enjoys spending his free time with his sons, ages 9 and 11.

Board of Directors Nominations and Applications

The Olde Oaks Community Improvement Association consists of the Olde Oaks and Waterford Park subdivisions, and its affairs are run by a Board of Directors.

The Board consists of five directors who are elected by the Association membership at the Annual Members' Meeting in February. Of the five directors, three are elected in even numbered years and two are elected in odd numbered years, thus, three directors will be elected at the Annual Members' Meeting to be held on February 12, 2014.

Any members interested in running for one of the two open Board positions are encouraged to complete the Application Form and submit it to the Nominating Committee for consideration. The Nominating Committee will then nominate two individuals from among the applicants. Applicants not selected by the Nominating Committee can still volunteer to run for the Board "from the floor" at the Annual Members' Meeting.

To be a director, an applicant must be a member of the Association, which means they must own a home in Olde Oaks or Waterford Park. Thus, tenants living in Olde Oaks or Waterford Park are not eligible to run for the Board. As a result of recent changes in Texas law, no one who has been convicted of a felony or crime of moral turpitude can become a Board member.

Applicants must also be willing to commit to approximately 10-15 hours per month to fulfill the responsibilities of a director which include, but are not limited to, attendance at the monthly Board meetings, which are held on the second Wednesday of the month from 6:45-9 p.m. (approximately); participation on Association committees; and responding to emails and/or participation on conference calls as required to conduct Association business.

Applications for the Board can be submitted by mailing them to OOCIA Nominating Committee, c/o ACMI, 12603 Louetta Road, Suite 101, Cypress, TX 77429 or by emailing them to info@ACMImgmt.com with the subject line "OOCIA Nominating Committee."

All applications must be received by ACMI by 4 p.m. on Friday, December 27. This deadline will not be extended and any applications received after this deadline will not be considered by the Nominating Committee. Late applicants may volunteer to run for the Board from the floor of the Annual Members' Meeting in February.


B ook Club




Klein Association of Retired Employees–KARE
