Focus on Safety: Our Sheriff's Deputies

For part two of the Focus on Safety Series, I recently spoke with Bryan Lewellen, one of the community's four dedicated Sheriff's Deputies.

Deputy Lewellen, a 22-year veteran of HCSO, is on patrol during the overnight hours and weekend afternoons. Growing up, Deputy Lewellen says he never considered a career in law enforcement, but when his brother-in-law went into the field, a saw it as a wonderful opportunity to create a secure future.



Deputy Lewellen says that the most rewarding part of his job is getting to help people through difficult, and often emotionally charged, situations. "I enjoy helping people through their times of need," he says.

When asked to identify the most frustrating part of his job, Deputy Lewellen stated that he is saddened by the lack of parental influence in the lives of many of the juvenile offenders he encounters.

How can we stay safe and avoid being a crime victim? Deputy Lewellen has some good tips:

- If you walk or jog, don't go alone. Take a buddy with you, and always carry your cell phone.
- Don't post or broadcast your vacation plans on social media sites. If this information falls into the wrong hands, it is an open invitation to criminals.
- Talk to your internet provider about ways to secure your wireless Internet signal from hackers.
- Take advantage of HCSO's Vacation Watch Program, a free service offered to OO/WP residents. No matter whether you are taking a quick weekend roadtrip or a three-week tour of Europe, one phone call to HCSO puts all of our patrolling Deputies on notice that you are away. They make special efforts to not only drive by your home, but check doors and windows, monitor who comes and goes (including the pool guy and the pet-sitter), and will contact either you or a designated individual if something happens in your absence.
- Make your possessions tough to steal lock car doors, take valuables out of your vehicle, set your home alarm system. If you make your possessions hard to get, criminals will often move on to easier pickings.




"Footnotes"

In November we'll meet a week early on the 19th because Thanksgiving in the fourth week when we usually meet. Susan Muirhead will be both hostess and discussion leader for *Rindu* by Eric Muirhead, Susan's late husband.

"Rindu" means "lovesick" in Malay, and Malaysia is the setting for this novel about a young man in the offshore oil service business on the island of Labuan. It's a hard life for Iban welders, engineers, and expatriates, yet passionate and dynamic amidst the beauty of the island and the waters about them.

Eric Muirhead graduated from Yale, moved to Houston, left medical school, drove a cab, and wrote a first novel, Cab Tales, about that experience. After graduating from Rice with a master's in English

literature, he and his wife went to East Malaysia for eight years. They built a schooner which they sailed to Hawaii. Later while



teaching at a private school in California, he wrote *Rindu* about his experiences in the offshore oil business. Returning to Houston, he then wrote a third novel, *Eden's Abyss*, about a private school teacher.

Our September book, *Lean In* by Sheryl Sandberg, provoked much discussion which could have easily lasted all afternoon. We all were in concurrence that we highly recommend this book to other women, women in the workplace, and particularly teen women who have their lives ahead of them. Ms. Sandberg, the CEO of Facebook, gives practical advice on combining professional achievement with personal fulfillment.

Sandberg says women unintentionally hold themselves back in their careers when they need to "sit at the table, seek challenges, take risks, and pursue their goals with gusto." She looks at why women's progress in achieving leadership roles has stalled, explains the root causes, and offers compelling, common sense solutions that can empower women to achieve their potential. The importance of mentors and men being equal partners "in the mundane" at home are some advice points she discusses. Do read this book!
