Focus on Safety: Our Sheriff's Deputies

Olde Oaks/Waterford Park has four full-time Sheriff's deputies who patrol our community day and night. Not only does their presence deter crime, but in an emergency, they are close by and ready to respond. In this four-part series, we will introduce our deputies and share some ideas on staying safe at home and on the go.


Deputy Jeff M. Parson is on patrol during the afternoon and evenings. Deputy Parson is a 16-year veteran of HCSO. After graduating high school, Parson began pursuing a business degree at University of Houston. He took a course in criminal justice, and realized that law enforcement was his true calling. After completing training at the Police Academy and a stint as a citizen jailer for HCSO, Deputy Parson worked as a "district car," answering calls anywhere and everywhere. For the past several years, he has been a contract deputy for our community.

Deputy Parson says that the best part about his job is the human interaction. "I like talking with people and helping them see their way through difficult situations. I try to stay optimistic, and I think this attitude helps others stay optimistic as well," he says.

One of the most memorable calls he has been on was to a home where the homeowners were convinced there was a burglar lurking in their chimney. Parson says that he crouched down on the hearth and carefully peered up into the chimney with a flashlight. Instead of a potential criminal, he came face to face with a giant 40-pound raccoon!

How can we stay safe and avoid being a crime victim? "Don't drive the same route every day," says Deputy Parson. "Criminals watch for patterns, so vary your routine. Leave a few minutes earlier or later. Enter and exit the neighborhood using different routes. If you suspect someone following you, don't go home. Pull into a cul-de-sac — the other vehicle has no reason to follow you into a dead-end street. Go to a public place and call for help."

Deputy Parson is a native Houstonian. He enjoys spending his free time with his wife and two young sons.



Keeping Pests at Bay

We live in the back of Olde Oaks and, from time to time, we have had an issue with wild animals invading our backyard. This summer we have had a large number of raccoons around. Raccoons can be dangerous, especially to other animals, and they can carry fleas, parasites, and even the rabies virus.



Even though we have a completely fenced-in backyard, raccoons still get in, as they are climbers. Remember to make your yard an undesirable place for these pesky animals. Never leave garbage, pet food or any other food source outside.

If you have a fence, check often to see if animals are digging under and into your yard (skunks are notorious for doing this). Plug up any crawl space where an animal could make a nest.

Big, loud dogs in the backyard are a deterrent, as well as clanging metal objects. A raccoon can kill a small dog, and since they are nocturnal, always check before letting your dogs out after dark.

We can't keep wild animals out of our yards 100% of the time, but taking these steps will help.
