Meetings are being held at the Oak Creek Village Clubhouse, 3906 Gladeridge Drive (behind the Oak Creek subdivision tennis courts).


National Night Out

Mandatory Water Restrictions

Our MUDs have imposed mandatory water restrictions. Some of the details include what days and times you can water. As of our October printer submission date (mid-September) we don't know if they will still be in effect in October.

For complete information, check your MUD's website, but here's an excerpt: Irrigation of residential landscaped areas

with hose-end sprinklers or automatic irrigation systems shall be limited to Sundays and Thursdays for customers with a street address ending in an even number, and Saturdays and Wednesdays for water customers with a street address ending in an odd number, and irrigation of landscaped areas is further limited to the hours of 12 a.m. midnight until 10 a.m. and between 7 p.m. and 5 a.m. on designated watering days.




Effective September 1, 2023 the delivery charges from CenterPoint Energy increased by \$0.015833/kWh. Delivery charges historically change twice per year, typically increasing in September and decreasing in March. 


