### Big Canoe Council Meeting, April 2, 2023

The Big Canoe Lutheran Church council met for its regular monthly meeting on April 2, 2023, at the Highland Lutheran Church following regular church services. Those in attendance were Pat O'Regan, Treasurer Laurie Emery, Vern Whitaker, Pastor Gies, Brian Bigler, Kathryn Thompson, shelly Bigler and Rita Thomas.

President Brian Bigler opened the meeting and Pastor Gies led us prayer.

The Secretary's report was read. Pat motioned, and Shelly seconded, that the report be accepted with one correction. Motion passed.

The Treasurer reported a balance of \$1,284.32.

The Lenten offering designation was discussed, but we do not have a definite amount yet, so it was decided that the designation would wait until next month's meeting.

Matt Amundson's bid has been accepted for mowing the cemetery. Discussion was held on how much the church should reimburse the cemetery for it's share of the mowing. We spoke with Carey Nordheim about the costs last year, the mowing bid and the cemetery revenue stream. After much back and forth for clarification Rita motioned, Pat seconded, that the church would reimburse the cemetery committee 50% of the mowing costs for last year and this year. This will amount to about \$10,000. Motion passed.

The church lawn repair was discussed. Steve Emery is in charge of this. Work will begin when conditions are appropriate after Easter.

The tuckpointing was discussed. Pat mentioned that Tor Oxnavard, husband of Anna Amundson, of Minneapolis, MN, would be able to help with assessing what we need done and there will be input from members of the congregation. Funding will be available from the Elsie Osmonson Fund and other donations. Hopefully major fundraisers will not be necessary, but this job will be expensive.

During the meeting of the Financial Oversight Committee an error was found in the Annual Meeting minutes. The minutes state that the Dalaker Fund should be "placed in the church operating account" when it should have read "placed in the Improvement Fund" as was decided at the Annual Meeting. The error will be corrected at the next Annual Meeting.

Synod Assembly will be June 9&10, 2023 at Luther College. Rita Thomas and Heather Vilardo are our delegates. Registration is from May 1-15.

After the inspection of the Big Canoe Church, it was recommended that we install two CO2 monitors. One in the boiler room and one in the church basement proper. Pat has purchased two and they are installed. Thank you to Pat for this.

A motion of adjournment was made by Pat and seconded by Shelly. Motion passed. Our next meeting will be May 7 after church services. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.



Plant milkweeds! Monarch butterfly numbers have decreased greatly throughout their range, primarily because of the loss of milkweeds, the required food of Monarch larvae. We can all help reverse this trend by planting milkweeds. Unfortunately, many milkweed plantings fail. One technique that has worked is to gather milkweed seeds in the fall and place them in plastic bags in your refrigerator during the winter. In early spring plant the seeds in small containers. Make sure the soil is loosely packed, and cover the seeds with no more than 1/4 inch of soil. Once the seeds have sprouted and grown a few inches, transplant them in clumps in areas of bare soil. Young milkweeds do not do well in competition with other plants. (David Voigts, Zion (Jubilee), LaPorte City)
