### **Report on 2022 Community Healthcare Needs Survey**

The biggest difference this year with the way our Needs survey was crafted was the design meant to encourage respondents to share their individual comments and ideas. This was accomplished by adding "Other" as an additional choice on most of the questions. And # 25 is a new question: Tell us in your own words, 'what things -that you don't have now- would help you on your own personal journey to better health?' While the ability to add personalized comments did increase feedback, it has also been a challenge to summarize the results.

This report is a highlight summary and is not meant to replace your own review of Addendum B – the full data as given by the respondents (individual names are redacted).

Addendum A is included only as a reference page – it is a full list of the survey questions and answer choices. Addendum C contains a brief multi-year comparison of only a few key points between our Needs surveys in 2018, 2020, and 2022.

#### 2022 survey timeline & background

- July 2022: Joan Field, CHW, began the process designing/creating the 27-question survey (both the online Survey Monkey and the USPS-mailed paper survey) the same questions appear in each
- October 2022: ACHC held our 2022 Patient Advisory Council meeting to hear general comments, plus to gain the PAC's insight & input on various methods to seek the highest level of survey response
- November 2022: Survey cover-letter and survey itself finalized and printed; envelopes ordered/received. Surveys mailed to all in-county postal addresses in primary catchment area (800+); online survey was opened; extra survey copies were also available in our Clinics
- December 2022 Total surveys returned: 90 (4 submitted online by Survey Monkey; 86 paper surveys received by return mail or hand delivery)

#### A few additional 2022 survey analysis parameters:

- All paper-survey responses (including hand-written comments) were carefully hand-entered into the online Survey Monkey database and combined with online responses this allows for easier analysis
- Nine respondents signed their survey and provided contact information –outreach was provided
- Although the stated deadline was Dec. 9, 2022, I collected and included all survey responses that arrived (there were a few that came in early 2023)
- All the individual comments by respondents can be seen within Addendum B (names are redacted)


#### Answer Overview - what can we learn?

Is their PCP (primary care provider) with Asher CHC or not, and what were their reasons for obtaining care outside of Wheeler County?

In 2018, 83% indicated they use ACHC for their primary medical care. In 2020, that slipped to 66%. This survey indicates 44.44%. We should note that many respondents gave very good reasons for obtaining care elsewhere, such as specialty services or complex care needs. This illustrates that there's a growing need with our constituents to travel outside the area for specialty care and higher-level medical services.

What do respondents see as barriers to healthcare, such as discrimination (*gender, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, income, education level*), or limiting factors (*age, disability, remote location*)? ~ "Residing in a remote rural location" can certainly be a barrier, and it was the top reason given (18%). It is interesting to also note, 73% of the respondents didn't feel that identifying *any* barrier was applicable to their situation.

**Current Concerns:** What do respondents see as the biggest local healthcare gaps and concerns? We ask this question two ways – and start with a 'big net'. We give a list of common concerns and allow for *multiple* affirmative answers. Next, we asked them to drill it down to a *single* concern. (Table A)



It lends credibility to the answers when we see how the lines parallel each other.


"Lack of housing options" and "Lack of access to higher medical care" are far and away the highest concerns.

An interesting observation: When asked, 'Do you have a secure place to live?', 100% of the people who responded to that question (85/90) said YES.


What's needed – ideas for the future: When asked to give their single best idea for improving access to healthcare locally, respondents gave the top ranking to two clear leaders:

"More Primary Care Providers" (60%), and


"More in-home services" (50%). (Table B)



And what countywide healthcare events and educational resources do respondents feel are most needed? Hearing and eyesight screenings are a clear standout. (Table C)





#### **Isolation and Ioneliness:**

A very important consideration in our remote region is whether our constituents feel cut off or isolated. Do they wish they had more opportunities for social activities?

No: 78% Yes: 22%

**Pain medication / Opioid Misuse:** Opioids include prescription opioids (natural and semi-synthetic opioids and methadone), heroin, and synthetic opioids other than methadone (primarily fentanyl). In the United States, opioid-involved overdose deaths rose from 21,089 (2010) to 68,630 (2020). And another dramatic rise to 80,411 in 2021<sup>1</sup>. Oregon saw 745 unintentional opioid overdose deaths in 2021<sup>2</sup>. This is how the respondents to our 2022 survey answered Q-14: "Do you, or does someone you know, struggle with prescription pain medication or opioid medication use?"


In 2018: 94% answered no. In 2020: 99% answered no. And in 2022: 94% answered no.

"Drug abuse" and "opioid abuse" are not the same thing, but there is an interesting contradiction in the survey: Those who answered 'no' to Q-14 above (94%), of those same respondents 45% said they felt drug abuse was a serious concern locally.

**Self-assessment, Mental Health:** 70% of respondents (looking at both Q-15 and Q-16) didn't feel that they were bothered by feeling down, depressed or hopeless. Of those that did, 22% said it was 'only occasionally'. Troubling to note that approximately 11% were feeling down, depressed or hopeless as often as "every day; more than half the time; or several days".

**Physical, Mental, Emotional problems limitations?** Most respondents (72%) don't feel they are limited by physical, emotional or mental problems (Q-16).

**Chronic Conditions:** Table F (relating to Q-5) looks at the diagnosed chronic conditions reported by the respondents. These four chronic conditions float to the top. Do these conditions align with our priorities for patient education and resources?

I came to Asher at the beginning of Nov 2002 with EXTREME pain and came out hurting worse! The NP did NOT care about the pain I was in, and in fact made it worse - I had to go to the ER in Madras. The NP treated me like an old junkie looking for pain meds. She spent the whole appt lecturing me on pain meds and opioids. She insisted that I sign a "pain contract" (which I will NOT honor). The whole time she was lecturing I was in intolerable pain. What is a medical clinic for if not to, at the very least, relieve pain?

Q 6: you have to go outside!

Q 16: sometimes.

Q 20: I use Wheeler Co transport.

I feel ACHC needs to work with our ambulance and on call. It is bad when someone (needs) to be transported when they could see a provider and not be transported - ambulance is volunteer and ACHC employees are paid.





#### Addendum C

# Quick Comparisons between 2018- 2020- 2022 surveys – Key points:

We had a larger number of surveys returned four years ago. In 2018, we sent the survey in an eyecatching envelope that included a pre-addressed return envelope. In 2020 the survey went out as a single-fold mailer, with a fold-option providing a smaller measure of return mail privacy. In 2022, the survey was again sent out in a boldly colored envelope and pre-addressed return envelope.





In 2018, 83% of the respondents said their Primary Care Provider was at ACHC.

In 2020, 66% said yes, their PCP is located at Asher.

In 2022, the percent dropped again to 44.44%

• Comparison of "Single highest concerns for healthcare in our communities today":

2018 biggest single concern: Drug abuse

2020 biggest single concern: Economic/Financial insecurity

2022 biggest concern: Lack of access to higher medical care (29%)

a close 2<sup>nd</sup>: Lack of Housing options (26%)

Interestingly, when asked about housing, 100% of the respondents who answered that question (85/90), said they have a secure place to live.
