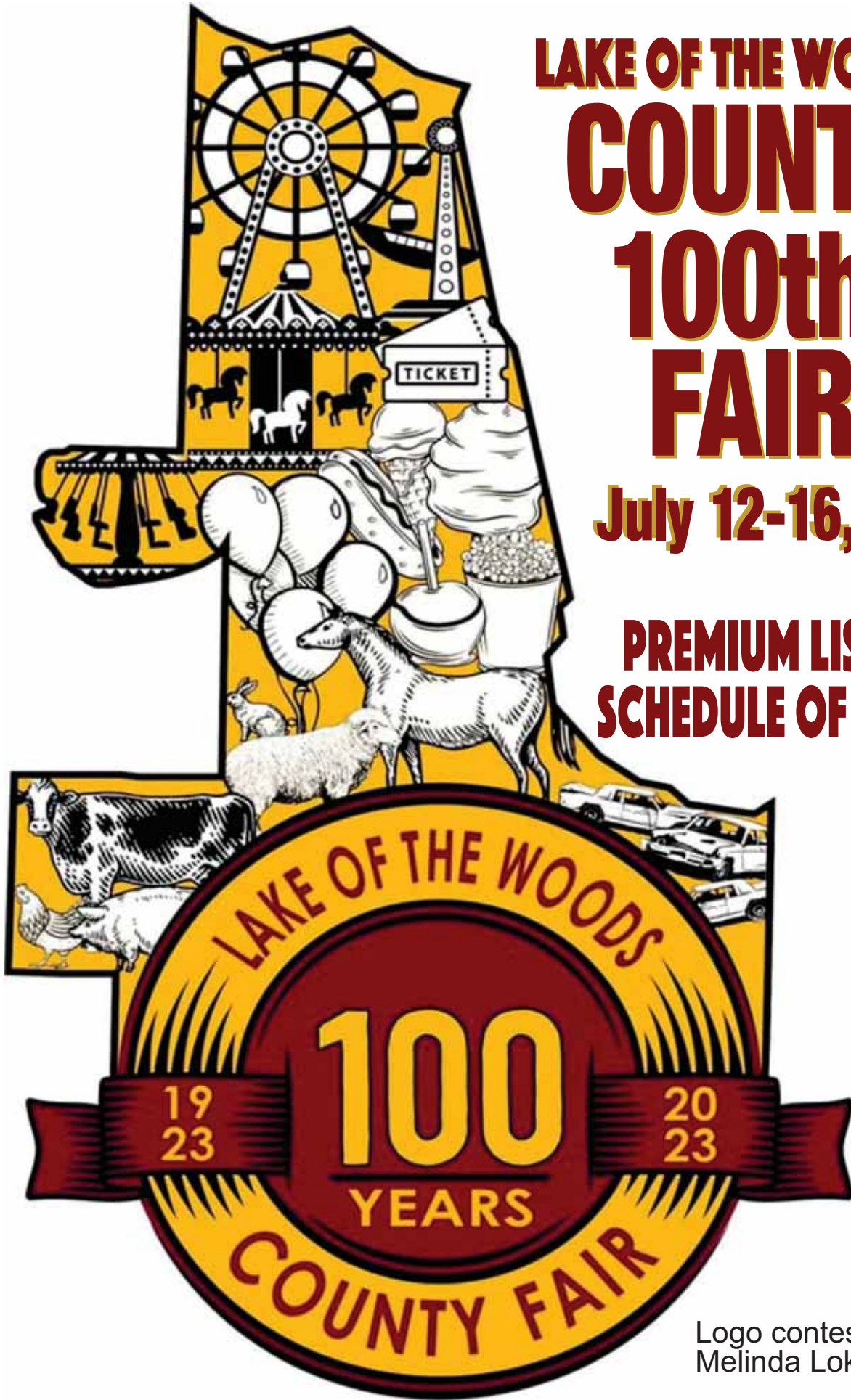

General Rules

1. The fair board will not be responsible for typographical errors in this exhibitor's handbook, but should any occur, same shall be interpreted by the Board of Directors.
2. The Board of Directors reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of incident to the fair.
3. Persons having claims against the Association must present them to the Secretary within fifteen days after the last day of the fair, in writing.
4. No person will be permitted to distribute advertising material on the grounds except from their places of business or exhibit. The tacking or posting of any advertising bills, cards, etc., other than the space occupied by exhibitors is strictly prohibited. The distribution of handbills, flyers, heralds, etc. will not under any circumstances be permitted. Anyone violating this rule will be liable to a fine or expulsion from the grounds as the fair board represented by at least three members may elect.

INDUSTRIAL AND COMMERCIAL EXHIBITS

1. All persons desiring space for industrial exhibits, concessions or privileges shall contact Rick Rone for information.
2. All space rentals must be paid in advance of setting up display.
3. All industrial and commercial exhibits shall be set up by 10 a.m. on Wednesday and remain on display until 10 p.m. on Saturday.

OPEN CLASS EXHIBITS

1. An exhibitor may enter only one entry in any lot.
2. Each entry must be entered in the name of the bona fide owner(s).
3. All open class exhibits found in Divisions A-Z must be grown, raised, constructed and/or created by the exhibitor during the past year prior to the fair, unless otherwise noted.
4. Each article in competition must correspond to the number and description in the exhibitor's handbook. No changes or alterations will be permitted after the books are placed in the hands of the judges.
5. All entries must be officially tagged and bear both name of the exhibitor and identification of exhibit. The entry tag shall be securely attached to the entry itself or on the stall, pen, or receptacle in which it is shown.
6. Stalls, pens, and cages for horses, cattle, swine, goats, sheep, poultry and rabbits will be allocated in this order: 4 H, Lake of the Woods County exhibitors, out-of-county exhibitors, when space is available.
7. All open class entries, including livestock, shall be made between 12:00 noon and 7:00 p.m. on "Entry Day" and all exhibits shall be in place by 7 p.m. of same day.
8. Unless otherwise stated, ages of animals will be as of Entry Day.
9. Exhibitors of livestock must keep themselves informed as to when their stock will be judged.

Stock must be in the show ring promptly upon being called and any exhibitor failing to comply with this order will be ruled out of the competition.

10. All exhibits including livestock must remain on exhibit until 10:00 a.m. on Sunday.
11. The Association will take every precaution for the preservation of articles and stock on exhibition but cannot be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur in the delivery, exhibition or removal of the exhibits.

AWARDS & PREMIUMS

1. The awards of entries shall be designated ribbons. First award— blue; second— red; third— white.
2. Any interference by the exhibitors to influence or dictate the decision of the judges shall be sufficient cause for excluding the entry from competition and shall be reported to the secretary through the superintendent of the division.
3. Premiums will not be considered on articles or animals of inferior merit regardless of the number in competition for premium.
4. No animal or animals shall compete for more than one open premium except livestock competing in groups. This rule shall not debar sweepstakes of special premium competition for which entry is required.
5. A 4-H animal may be used to make a group in open class if owned by the same family.
6. Open class cow/calf pairs will be judged in the pen.
7. Premium checks for all open class exhibits, including livestock, will be released at noon on the last day of the fair. Any speciality award earned will be mailed within one week following the close of the fair.
8. All exhibits must be picked up by noon on Sunday.

ANIMAL HEALTH & SAFETY REGULATIONS

1. All state animal health rules will be followed. Cattle, horses, goats, sheep, swine, poultry and rabbits not originating in Minnesota must meet Minnesota Importation requirements in addition to the requirements for exhibition of livestock and poultry in Minnesota. Health certificates must list the Minnesota Exhibition as consignee and will be accepted if examination and tests are conducted within 90 days prior to the exhibition, except swine pseudorabies tests, which must be made within 30 days.
2. All livestock will be inspected by the Official Veterinarian on the opening date of the fair and daily during the fair. The Official Veterinarian will order the immediate removal to a quarantine facility or remove from the exhibition premises of any livestock with symptoms of infectious or communicable disease. This includes livestock with warts or ringworm.
3. All dogs over 6 months, exhibited at the fair, must be accompanied by a certificate of rabies vaccination issued by a veterinarian.
4. All horses must be negative to an official test for

Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) within 12 months prior to the opening date of the exhibition. A test is not required for suckling foals accompanying a negative dam.

5. All exhibitors must keep their stall, pens, and cages clean and in good condition and open for inspection from 9:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. Awards may be withheld if an exhibitor does not provide proper care for an animal exhibit, i.e feed, water and bedding, with said materials being the sole responsibility of the exhibitor.
6. All exhibitors of bulls one year and over must lead such animals with suitable bull lead attached to a ring.
7. Exhibitors of poultry and rabbits are encouraged to securely fasten the cages and be present at judging time to open the cage.
8. Any animal displaying behavior that may be deemed as unsafe to spectators and/or exhibitor shall be asked to remove the animal in question by order of the Animal Rights Spokesperson representing the Lake of the Woods County Fair Association.
9. Contact the Official Fair Veterinarian, regarding questions on animal health matters.

MARKET ANIMAL AUCTION GUIDELINES

1. Exhibitors who receive a rosette in the Market Class of the Cattle, Goat, Swine, Sheep, and Poultry divisions will be eligible to auction their animals at the open class Livestock Auction.
2. At the Livestock Auction, all animals will have a reserve of the current Market Value.
3. The buyer has the responsibility of making arrangements for transporting and butchering of the animal.
4. If the winner of the auctioned animal opts to keep the rosette and the photo, rather than the animal, they are responsible for arrangement with the exhibitor.

EXHIBIT/DISPLAY POLICY

The Lake of the Woods County Fair Association wishes to promote a wholesome and educational event for the entire family. All exhibits and displays (4-H, Open, Commercial) are subject to review by the Board of Directors of the Lake of the Woods County Fair Association. Any items, materials, or animals which are deemed inappropriate and/or unsafe for display must be removed by exhibitor upon request by fair officials.

The following list of items are included in the above ban: weapons (including but not limited to, death stars, butterfly knives), sexually explicit pornographic material, vulgar/profane materials. Exhibits and displays are meant to be enjoyed by all fair visitors. Please help us make the Lake of the Woods County Fair a pleasant experience for all ages.

NOTICE: Any person or group that conducts a protest action must limit its activity to the location designated by the Fair Board. The designated location is North of the VFW Building not to surpass the east and west edges of the building. No entrances or exits can be abstracted or limited in any way.

Rosette awarded to top bull, female, calf and cow-calf pair. All beef breeds to be judged against each other and not as separate breeds. Three trophies to Grand Champion Bull, Grand Champion Cow, Grand Champion Cow Calf pair. Rosettes to reserve champion bull, reserve champion cow, reserve cow calf pair.

- 2 Bull, 6 mo. & under 1 year

Class 3 Feeder & Market Cattle (Any breed or mixed breeds)

Rosette awarded to top animal in class. These feeders will be judged in the show ring, if all animals in a lot are halter broken; otherwise they will be judged in the pen. Weights based on weigh-in at fair.

- 2 Heifer (heavyweight feeders – over 950 lbs.)

- 3 Dairy Steer (heavyweight feeders – over 950 lbs.)

DIVISION B - HORSES

Superintendent: Susie Larson, 218-634-2201 218-202-0809

Rules:

1. All entrants must follow "General Rules".
2. Call in advance for stall reservation.
3. A single horse or pony may be entered in a lot or event only once.
4. For each horse entered, the exhibitor must provide proof of negative Coggins test performed within 12 months prior to opening date of the fair.
5. All stallions must be shown by experienced horse person age 18 or over.
6. The following point system will be used to determine High Point awards: 1st - 6 points; 2nd - 5 points; 3rd - 4 points; 4th - 3 points; 5th - 2 points; 6th - 1 point.
7. Rules will be provided to all exhibitors, if further questions will follow AQHA Rule. Judge will award and tally points. Judge's decision is final.
8. No foals in arena with dams at time of show.
9. No leading of contestants during show, except during lead line class.

Note: All horse trailers should be parked along the fence at the west end of the horse barns. Owners are to walk their horses to and from the horse arena or ride them in designated areas only.

Special Awards:

A trophy will be awarded to the family or stable with the neatest display.

Premiums: 1st - \$15.00 2nd - \$12.00
3rd - \$10.00

Judged events: Classes 2 through 9. A High Point trophy and a Reserve High Point Rosette will be awarded in each age division based on the number of points collected by each exhibitor/horse combination. You will receive either Western Pleasure or English Pleasure points, whichever is higher - Western Horsemanship or English Equitation points, whichever is higher.

Timed Events: Class 11 through 16. A High Point Trophy and a Reserve High Point Rosette will be awarded in each age division based on the number of points collected by each exhibitor/horse combination.

A trophy will be awarded to the top halter horse

Class 1 - Lot 1-8 - Reserve halter horse will receive a Rosette.

ALL quilts and quilted items are to be entered and displayed in the Ag Hort Building.

Suggestion: It is very helpful if exhibitors provide name and address labels to attach to the entry tags. This eliminates a lot of writing, reduces errors, and expedites entry.

Rules:

1. All entrants must follow "General Rules".
2. Youth class exhibitors must be under age 18. Youth may also enter in the adult classes.
3. Please read and follow the size, technique, and quilting method requirements for each lot.
4. Large quilts must have a minimum perimeter of 250 inches or greater.
5. Small quilts perimeters are not to exceed 249 inches.
6. All quilts must have a hanging sleeve. Instructions for making the sleeve are listed here:

How to make a hanging sleeve

1. Measure the width of the quilt minus two inches. Cut a 6-6.5" wide strip of fabric to fit the measurements. It may need to be pieced.
2. Fold under short edge 1/4" to the wrong side. Fold under again. Stitch to hem the folds.
3. Fold the fabric strip in half lengthwise with right sides together. Stitch with 1/4" seam. Press seam open and center the seam in the middle of the sleeve.
4. Center the sleeve on the quilt backing about 1" below the binding, seam facing toward the backing. Slipstitch the sleeve along the top long side and the portions of the short, folded edges that touch the back.
5. Allow extra ease on the side of the sleeve away from the quilt back. Before stitching down the long bottom edge, fold up about 1/2" then slipstitch in place.
6. Sleeves may temporarily be pinned to the quilt with safety pins.
7. Quilts longer than 96" must have the excess length pinned up along the bottom, so the quilt does not touch the floor.

Judging Criteria Overall Appearance, Visual Impact, Color and Design, Construction Workmanship, Quilt Design and Workmanship, Settings, Sashings, Borders, Bindings and other Finishing Techniques.

Special Awards: A rosette will be awarded to the top quilted entrance in Lots 1-13, and lots 14-17.

A People's Choice Award will be awarded to one quilted item that receives the most public votes and a \$10 premium prize.

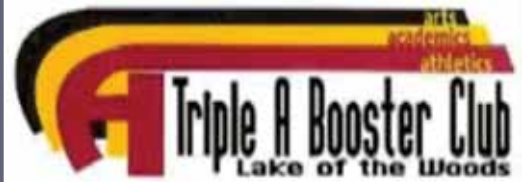

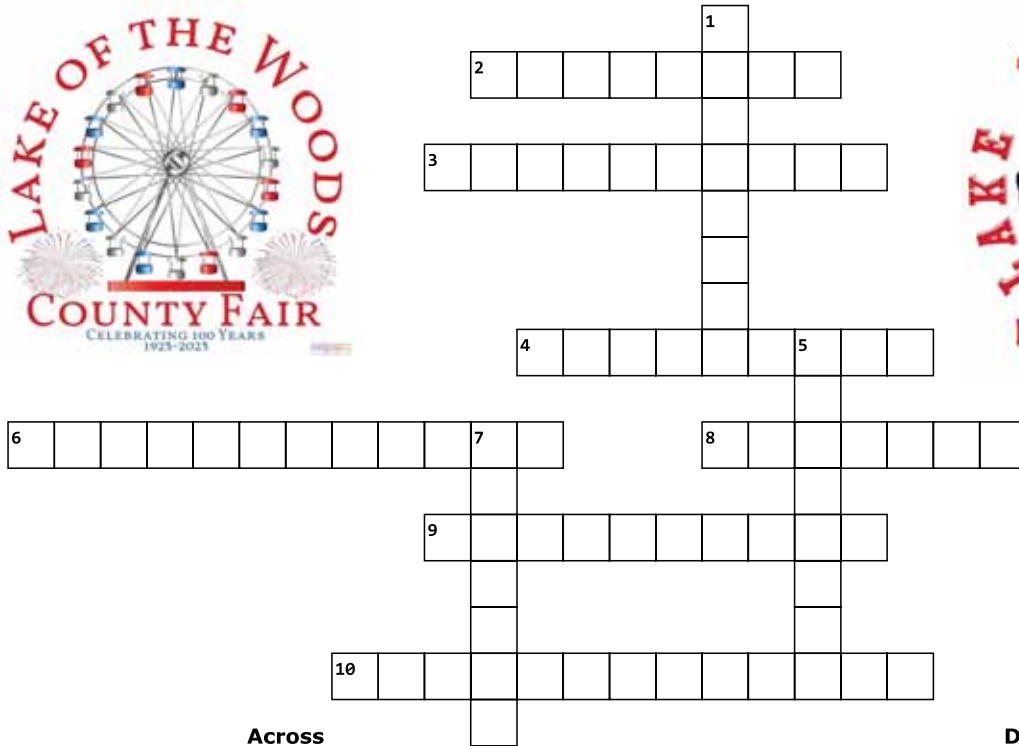

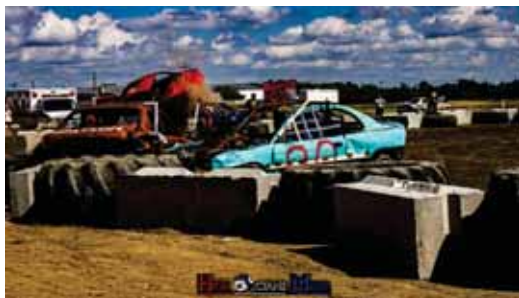
