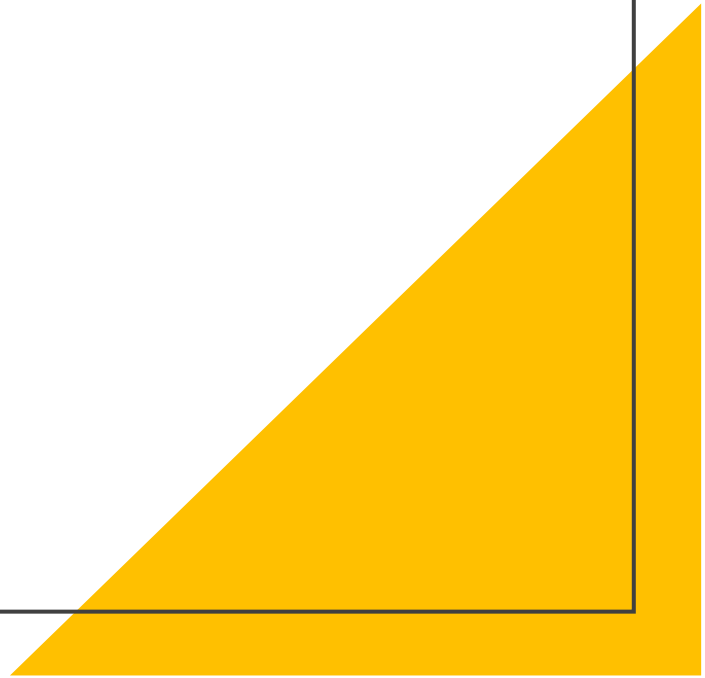


# Koa Street Extension

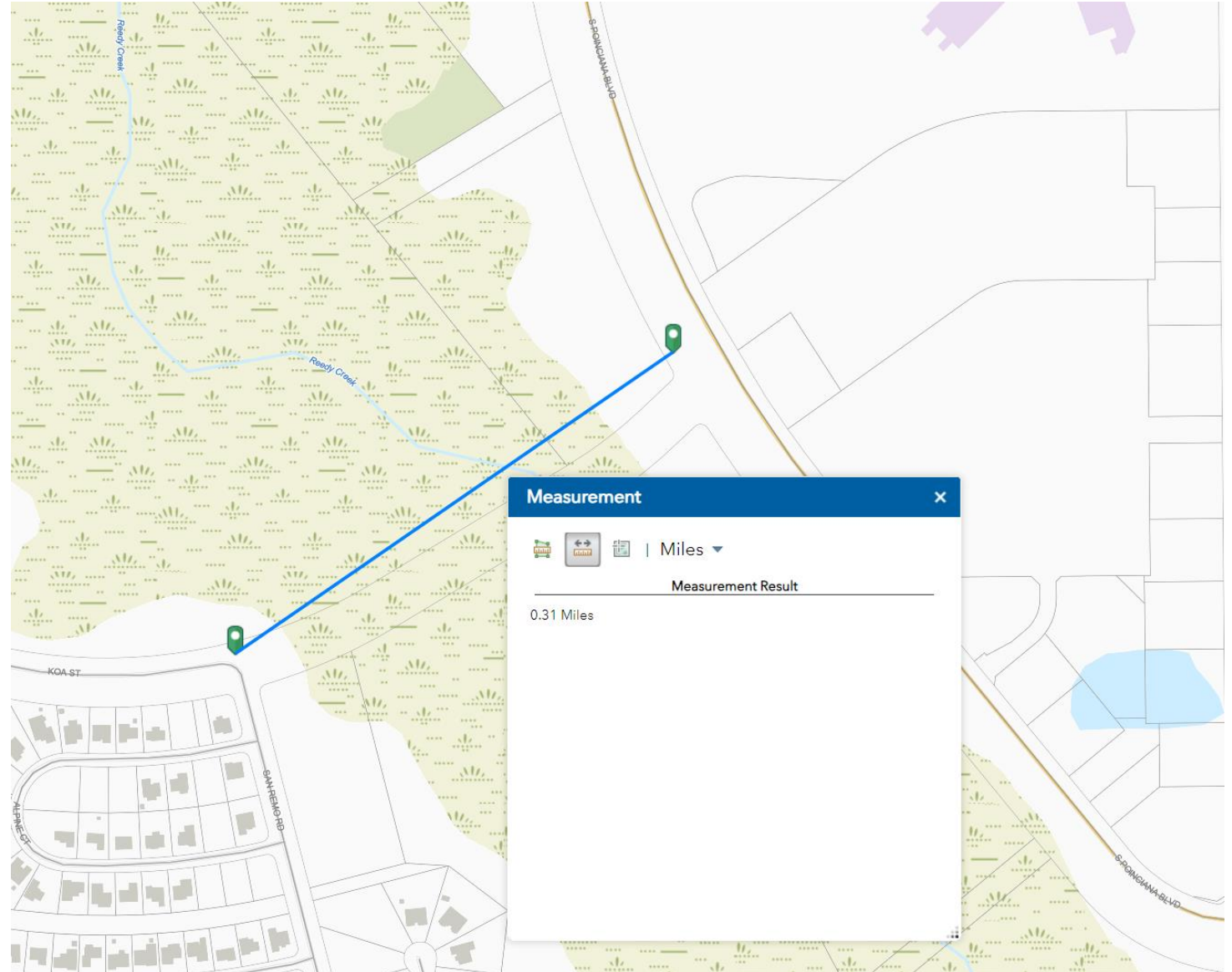
Why is this not in the current plans?

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# What does it solve

- Reduces traffic load on Cypress
  - Neighborhood traffic can go directly to the new 4 lane South Poinciana Blvd
  - Reduce load on Doverplum and Marigold Ave intersections with Cypress Parkway
- Reduces traffic bottleneck at the Poinciana/Cypress/Pleasant Hill Road intersection
- Allows for alternate routes
  - For planned construct on JYP PHR intersection and CFX expansions
  - For reduced flow due to traffic accidents
- Maximize lane usage on Poinciana Blvd

# Drawbacks

- Road extension would be over swamp and a stream
  - Elevating the one third mile section should reduce the impact
- Intersection is close to the bottleneck intersection on PHR
  - Could run road north parallel to South Poinciana Blvd
  - An overpass could be a solution
