Choosing the right genealogy computer program is an important decision for any genealogist. The sophisticated research tools, powerful search capabilities, and professional-quality trees, reports, and books makes the award-winning Legacy Family Tree the program of choice for users of all levels and abilities. It is simple enough for a beginner yet robust enough to meet the demands of a professional researcher.

Legacy Family Tree is genealogy software for Windows that assists family historians in tracking, organizing, printing, and sharing their family history. The standard edition is distributed as freeware, with no restrictions, only requiring registration on the company's web site to download the software. When purchasing the Deluxe Version you will be giving a code to unlock the 108 features not found in the Standard (free) Edition.

This class will demonstrate a variety of features in Legacy Family Tree software and Legacy Family Tree Webinars. Because of time not all the features will be shown. To help with your future needs as you explore Legacy Family Tree there is a local Users Group that meets monthly on Zoom on the second Saturday each month at 9:00 CT. Some of the Views and features that will be demonstrated during the class are:


The Pedigree View

This is a road map through your ancestors and their relationships. View four or five generations, click on the individual's name to edit their information, move back through the generations or forward though their descendants. There are hidden buttons to do more.



The Family View

This view displays a family, a couple and their parents and children. It is one of the main navigational screens in Legacy. You can move from generation to generation in either direction, add a new person or link to an existing person. The icons have the ability to do so much more.




Marriage Information Screen

This area is a place to record the date, place, add sources and link pictures of the event. Some couples were together (either married or not) but didn't have children. You can note that and add events having to do with this union, add notes, add the address where it took place, even add a reminder of their anniversary having calculated how long it has been.


Chronology View


This view shows the current individual and all the events associated with that person. These include the person's birth, christening, death and burial information, his or her individual events, marriages and marriage events, the birth of children, parents, and the individual and marriage notes. Grandparents and grandchildren can also optional be included.



Editing an Individual's Information, Adding & Sharing Events, Attaching a Source, Images and the Icons

This screen is the workhorse for individuals in the program. Including the above you can link individuals to FamilySearch and Finda-Grave, set birthday reminders, calculate a date, add tags, hashtags, stories, research, medical and general notes. With a few click the SourceWriter and the Source Clipboard makes it possible to attach a source to everyone in the source quickly. Shared Events allows you enter the event once and share with everyone.







All these events are arranged on the view in sorted order so you can see what affected this person throughout his or her life.

Index View

The Index will display all the individuals in your family file. It can be sorted by given name order, surname order, or RIN number order. The list can also show any alternate names which will be shown with a ~ so you can tell the difference. You can customize the information to be displayed.





To-Do List

The To Do List makes it easy to track your research and other tasks that need to be done. You can create general and individual To Do lists. Mention the repository, library or where on-line to gather the information. You can print out a list of tasks to be done while searching a website of on location. Record the results along the way as you research and note when the task is completed. This can be your research plan and research log, all contained in Legacy Family Tree.

Research Guidance

This tool helps you locate records that may contain information about your ancestors. It does this in four steps.


- 1. Reviews the ancestor's timeline
- 2. Suggests preliminary survey sources to help you learn if the research is already in progress by others.

<u>W</u>ebsite

- 3. Select your goal, and Legacy provides a list of prioritized suggestions to help you accomplish your goal
- 4. Legacy then organizes the sources into a To-Do List

Split Screen


Legacy allows you to have up to six family/pedigree views of a family file showing at the same time. These can either be tiled on the screen (all showing on the screen at once), or overlapped, letting you click the one you want to see fully displayed. You can also have up to two different family files open at the same time. This lets you compare and navigate through them separately.



Publishing Center


You can create professional-looking books by assembling the various reports and charts available in Legacy into one single document. This can include ancestor and descendant book reports, pedigree charts, family group records, picture scrapbooks and much more. You can also add a table of contents, other introductory sections and an overall index and list of source citations.

When you create a book, you select from the various items available and effectively add chapters to your new book arranged in the order of your choice.




Picture Center

The Picture Center in Legacy is a very easy way to link many pictures to many individuals from one place. You will often come upon pictures in groups that you want to link to the people in your family file. For example, you might have a box or picture album of many pictures that you then scan into your computer. The pictures are associated with several different individuals. The Picture Center lets you link in these pictures to anyone in your file from one convenient place within the program.



All reports can be printed, saved to Rich Text Files or PDFs for easy electronic sharing.
