IV. THE SEEDS...

Level Up the Fun: Gamify Family History

- 1. **Storytelling Game Night:** Organize a game night where family members take turns sharing stories from the past. You can use prompts or cards with different storytelling themes to spark conversations and encourage storytelling skills among teenagers.
- 2. *Family History Bingo:* Create a fun family history bingo game with squares representing various family members, events, or locations. As you explore family history together, mark off the squares on the bingo card.
- 3. **Family History Trivia Night:** Organize a family history trivia night with questions based on the family's history. Divide into teams and compete to see who knows the most about the family's past.

Family Yarns: Connecting Through Stories

- 1. **Storytelling Sessions*:** Schedule regular storytelling sessions where grandparents share their life experiences, childhood memories, and stories about their own parents and grandparents. Grandchildren can ask questions and actively engage in the conversation. Conduct interviews with other family members, such as aunts, uncles, and cousins, to gather more stories and insights about the family's history.
- 2. *Collaborative Storytelling Projects*:* Initiate collaborative storytelling projects where teens contribute to creating an interconnected narrative about their family history. Each participant adds a chapter or segment, building upon the previous contributions and expanding the overall story.
- 3. *Historical Artifact Storytelling**: Encourage teens to choose a significant historical



- artifact from their family's collection and create a story around it. They can delve into the artifact's origin, the people associated with it, and the historical context, bringing it to life through vivid storytelling. Think of it as an online memory box.
- 4. **Record Interviews:** Encourage grandchildren to interview their grandparents using video or audio recordings. These interviews can capture valuable family history and personal anecdotes.

Near & Far: Exploring Ancestral Locations

- 1. **Ancestor Photo Scavenger Hunt*:** Create a scavenger hunt around your home or local area featuring old family photos. Provide clues that lead teenagers to discover the photos and then have them share stories or anecdotes related to the pictures. Unfamiliar places or items in a photo? Give Google Lens a try!
- 2. *Virtual Family History Tours:* Take advantage of technology to take teens on immersive journeys to explore ancestral towns, historical landmarks, or cultural sites related to their family history. Use sites like Google Earth or historical databases to explore the places where your ancestors lived, and encourage teenagers to research and share interesting facts about those locations. They can virtually navigate the locations and discover the stories behind them.
- 3. <u>Map Exploration:</u> Find a map where teens can plot and explore their family's geographical origins. They can trace migration routes, mark ancestral hometowns, and learn about the historical and cultural significance of these places.
- 4. *Family History Road Trip:* Plan a road trip to visit different places that are significant to the family's history, such as ancestral homes, towns, former family businesses, or historical and family landmarks. This can provide a deeper connection to the family's history and heritage.

Roots & Routines: Traditions Through the Generations

- 1. *Family Cookbook Compilation*:* Invite teenagers to collect and compile family recipes from different generations. Encourage them to interview relatives, document the recipes, and include stories or memories associated with each dish. They can provide step-by-step instructions, personal anecdotes, and photos of the dishes, allowing others to explore and try out these treasured recipes. Include the stories behind each recipe and any special memories associated with them.
- 2. **Preserve Family Letters*:** If there are old letters exchanged between family members, preserve and read them together. These letters offer insights into the lives and relationships of past family members. Don't forget postcards!
- 3. **Documenting Traditions*:** Work together to document family traditions and customs. Include the stories behind these traditions to pass them on to future generations.



4. *Heritage Crafts*:* What traditional crafts or skills have been passed down in the family, such as knitting and woodworking? Capture these crafts and skills with photos, stories, and memories or maybe even directions ancestors have left behind.

The Ancestral Journey: A Family History Roadmap

- 1. *A Day in the Life*:* Transport teens to different time periods by browsing newspapers from their ancestors' lives. They become immersed in history and get first-hand accounts of things that happened, photos, advertisements, and much more as they gain historical and social context.
- 2. <u>Historical Family Timeline:</u> Create a timeline of significant events in the family's history, incorporating both historical events and personal milestones.

Collaborative Kinship: A Team Approach (Storied Groups)

- 1. *Collaborative Family History Projects*:* Enable teens to collaborate with other family members to collectively build a comprehensive family tree. They can contribute stories, photos, and documents and engage in discussions or online forums to share insights and knowledge.
- 2. **Organize Family Reunions*:** Plan and participate in family reunions or gatherings. These events provide opportunities for extended family members to share stories and connect.
- 3. *Compile a Family History Book*:* With the input and stories from both grandparents and grandchildren, work on writing a family history book that can be passed down to future generations.
- 4. *Digital Heritage Exhibitions*:* Create virtual heritage exhibitions where teens can curate and showcase artifacts, photographs, and stories from their family history.

Camera Chronicles: Family History Through the Lens

- 1. **Digital Memory Preservation*:** Help teens upload and organize digital copies of family photos, videos, and audio recordings. You can add tags, descriptions, and annotations to preserve and document the memories digitally.
- **2.** *AI (Artificial Intelligence) Photo Opp*:* Do you have a story but no photo to go with it? Have teens create an AI photo to help tell your story. My favorite is Midjourney!

Roots Quest: Teaching Teens to Uncover Ancestral Secrets

1. <u>Learn Together:</u> Find online learning opportunities where grandparents and teens can learn genealogy research techniques and storytelling methods or even attend live interviews with renowned historians or genealogists together.
