Dear faithful friends and fellow children of God: Prepare the Way of the Lord!

Happy Advent and Merry Christmas! Yes, it's that time of the year again! I think you'll agree with me that time has seemed very strange over the last year and a half. And perhaps to match that strangeness, while I was preparing to write this piece approaching Advent and Christmas, it's not a Christmas Carol or an Advent hymn that came to mind but rather a song from the band Switchfoot. For those of you who have been in my office, you'll see that I have two big posters of Switchfoot memorabilia. They are a local band from San Diego and one of my favorites growing up. The song is called "The Shadow Proves the Sunshine." With that title perhaps you'll see why I chose this song to highlight. Read some of the lyrics below:

Oh Lord, don't be far away Storm clouds gathering beside me Please Lord, don't look the other way I am crooked souls trying to stay up straight Dry eyes in the pouring rain where The shadow proves the sunshine The shadow proves the sunshine Two scared little runaways

As you can see, it is a song about darkness and uncertain futures, but just as much about hopeful ways forward. I think this particular excerpt encapsulates some of our recent experiences, the first verse describing people living in the midst of storm clouds asking God to be close by and not to look away. The second verse is very Lutheran, with the author acknowledging our own confused crookedness, and yet discovering that light is miraculously present. What's more, is that that stormy darkness which seemed overwhelming cannot, in fact, win and only serves to confirm the light.

So Pr. John, what does this all have to do with us? Well, as we know and as I said before, we find ourselves in Advent, the darkest time of the year and a season about waiting and preparing for the coming light of the world on Christmas! And this year, we also continue on in the pandemic with another variant looming its dark and stormy head at us. Sometimes, it may feel like the storm clouds and darkness are overwhelming, the only things we can concentrate on. But that's exactly when God speaks to us, when we hear the words of "Hold fast to the break of daylight where the shadow

proves the sunshine" and "prepare the way of the Lord." Whether we are in the desert wilderness or stormy shores, God is with us. In winter, the days are short and the nights are long, but we have nothing to fear because Christ came in the middle of the night, born into the world of chaos and confusion, out of sight in Bethlehem where it might seem hard to find him. And yet it is Christ who finds us, who hears our cries of "Oh Lord, don't be far away" answering us by drawing near to us. As it says in John 1:5 "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." God is not just aware of us in darkness, doesn't just casually stroll through and wave at us, no God sent Jesus to dwell with us in it all. Jesus was born into our darkness, grabbed us by our crooked shoulders, and straightened us up with light and love. We have made it this far by faith and by the grace of God's guiding light, we will get through the storms and darkness the exact same way. May we remember that this Advent and Christmas season, gaining heart and courage from God, preparing the way of the Lord, and holding on to the break of Christmas daylight. Merry Christmas!

So, until we see each other again: "May the Lord bless you and keep you; may the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; may the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace." (Numbers 6:24-26).

The word "Advent" is derived from the Latin word *adventus*, meaning "Coming" with Christian Theology-the coming or second coming of Christ. Advent is the first season of the Christian church year, leading up to Christmas and including the four preceding Sundays. Advent is the period of preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ at Christmas and also of the preparation of the Second Coming of Christ.

The advent wreath first appeared in Germany in 1839. A Lutheran Minister, Johann Hinrich Wichern, who was working at a missionary for children. He created a wreath out of the wheel of a cart. Eventually the Advent Wreath was created out of evergreens, symbolizing everlasting life. The circle reminds us of God's unending love and the eternal life He makes possible. The candles on the Advent Wreath symbolize, Hope, Love, Joy and Peace.

We have a few fun things planed in the month of December. December 4th will be our Women of the ELCA Christmas Party-all women will be welcome. Christmas Caroling on December 12th at 2:00pm-meeting at the Church. We will be visiting seven of our church member's homes, and everyone is welcome to this fun activity. A wonderful Candle lighting Christmas Eve service at 5:00 pm for everyone to attend, bring your families and neighbors.

Hope, love, joy, and peace be with all of you and your families this Christmas Season. Enjoy the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ.

FINANCIAL REPORT Ending October 31, 2021

a. Offering Envelopes

- i) For the month, we are on budget at 100.2% (\$12,190 vs \$12,161).
- ii) **Year-to-date,** we are on budget at 100.2% (\$107,916 vs \$107,713).

b. Total Income

- i) For the month, slightly over budget at 103.5% (\$15,216 vs \$14,708).
- ii) **Year-to-date,** above budget at 112.3% (\$151,764 vs \$135,118).

c. Expenses

- i) For the month, under budget at 90.4% (\$14,883 vs \$16,456).
- ii) Year-to-date, under budget at 96.2% (\$148,708 vs \$154,543).
- d. Net Operating Income (Total Income minus Expenses)
 - i) For the month, better than expected at \$333 vs. the expected loss of \$1,748.
 - ii) **Year-to-date,** much better than expected with a profit of \$3,057, vs. the expected loss of \$19,425.

e. **Checking balance**

- i) **Balance at Month-end** is \$19,074.
- ii) Previous Month-end balance was \$18,741.

f. Comments

- i) Member giving for both the month and YTD are right on budget! Let's keep it up and finish the year strong!
- ii) Visitor giving (Plate Offerings) is running above expectations.
