Dear faithful friends and fellow children of God:

As we are welcomed into July and pass the longest day of the year, we also proceed with our journey away from the pandemic restrictions. But just as the country's founders did not immediately actualize their freedom from tyranny on July 4th, 1776, we will also have to continue our patience and cooperation together to actualize freedom from the pandemic. As the pandemic recedes, more and more restrictions have been lessened or removed and many people have asked questions about when we will reflect those same actions at Faith. I welcome any such questions when they come from a place of wanting to help the congregation grow safely. However, I also want to remind us that we have taken things a bit slower and more precautious during the whole pandemic, and thankfully the results have been the safety of our congregation. We are all so thankful for the excitement about reopening the church. We will most likely continue to be behind other churches or organizations in our area because we would not want to let impatience undo our long, hard work of continuing to promote safety for all of our members. Let us keep the commandment of love thy neighbor set firmly in our hearts. We must consider the safety of those who are most vulnerable in our community, those who cannot be vaccinated due to health concerns or because they are too young to receive it.

All of that said, be rest assured that as soon as the church leadership has decided that the time has come to safely remove a restriction or resume an activity or ministry, we will joyfully announce it. We are all in this together, that is the point, God calls us to be one body of Christ, joined by our praise of God and common care for each other. So while we continue to practice patience, we can keep busy in our faith lives, using our hands to do God's work of, to paraphrase Matthew's gospel, 'feeding the hungry, inviting the stranger, clothing those who need them, and visiting those who cannot join us in the sanctuary.' Rejoice in the ministries we have already reclaimed from the grasp of the pandemic and be invigorated by those holy activities we continue to wake from their hibernation. We're two months into inside worship again so we have begun to stretch those churchy muscles again, but it's also understandable that we are still a little rusty or might not be as confident. But I have faith that we will continue to warm up, that our church-muscle-memory will return with practice, that we will see our Faith community thriving again in all the ways we cherished before the pandemic.

So let me cheer you on and encourage us with some faith exercises. Full disclosure, I did not come up with this list, I found it in a book I found at the church called the B-I-B-L-E. I've heard the author is pretty effective at getting people involved in faith. The list is:

- **Show up**: come and be with your faith community as frequently as you can.
- **Invite**: tell someone about your community, let them know how you like to start off your week at church.
- **Welcome**: do what we do best, making others feel at home just as someone did for you when you first came to Faith.
- **Help**: help others and yourself by participating, engaging, and worshipping. Help grow the church by bolstering ministries like *Fellowship* and *Outreach*. Help grieve the time and loved ones we've lost through the *Remembering and Honoring* group. Help celebrate the time and loved ones we still have together through *4+1* or *Cheer* or any other ministry which calls us together as the people of God.
- And in all of it, **Share** the good news that our loving God is with us always!

So, until we see each other again: "May the Lord bless you and keep you; may the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; may the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace." (Numbers 6:24-26).



FINANCIAL REPORT Ending May 31, 2021

a. Offering Envelopes

- i) For the month, we continue below budget at 91.7% (\$11,533 vs \$12,575).
- ii) Year-to-date, we are under budget at 96.6% (\$55,357 vs \$57,324).

b. Total Income

- i) For the month, below budget at 93.5% (\$14,339 vs \$15,344).
- ii) **Year-to-date,** above budget at 115.9% (\$85,103 vs \$73,452).

c. Expenses

- i) For the month, over budget at 106.9% (\$16,158 vs \$15,122).
- ii) Year-to-date, under budget at 95.4% (\$73,647 vs \$77,241).
- d. **Net Operating Income** (Total Income minus Expenses)
 - i) For the month, we had a loss of \$1,819 vs. the expected profit of \$223.
 - ii) **Year-to-date,** much better than expected with a profit of \$11,456, vs. the expected loss of \$3,789.

e. **Checking balance**

- i) Balance at Month-end is \$27,389.
- ii) Previous Month-end balance was \$29,174.

f. Comments

- i) May Member giving was below budget, continuing the trend which started in March. The below budget giving has now pulled down our YTD member giving to under 97% of budget. Hopefully, this trend will reverse now that we are back to full in-person Worship services.
- ii) May expenses were high due to catchup billing from our bookkeeper and the cost of weed abatement on our back lot.
- iii) YTD Total Income and Net Operating expenses are way above budget due to \$15,000 in Special Offerings from deceased members.



Sharing God's Grace, Generosity and Love

In 2 Corinthians 9:7, Paul says "Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (NIV)

Your Finance Committee has the unenviable task of paying attention to our income and expenses. This includes counting the Offerings, making bank deposits, preparing member giving statements, paying bills, making budgets (and trying to stick to them), and providing our outside bookkeeper with the information needed to produce our Financial Reports. We also review our insurance coverages, manage and negotiate various contracts, and deal with various technology issues. The Gifts of ADMINISTRATION, GIVING and FAITH are the cornerstones of success.

According to Mary Fairchild (a Christian writer, editor, and full-time minister), "The main idea of 2 Corinthians 9:7 is that our giving ought to be voluntary and spring from a cheerful attitude. It should come from the heart. Paul is speaking about financial giving, but voluntary and cheerful giving goes beyond the scope of monetary giving. Serving our brothers and sisters is another form of giving."

The Spiritual Gift of ADMINISTRATION is key to the Committee's ability to organize and manage the details involved. Our members' Spiritual Gift of GIVING provides the ability to do ministry here in Menifee and beyond. Our collective Spiritual Gift of FAITH makes it all possible.
