Psalm 84: 1-2, 10-12



How lovely is your dwelling place, O LORD of hosts. My soul longs, indeed it faints for the courts of the LORD; my heart and my flesh sing for joy to the living God.

For a day in your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere. I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than live in the tents of wickedness. For the LORD God is a sun and shield; he bestows favor and honor. No good thing does the LORD withhold from those who walk uprightly. O LORD of hosts, happy is everyone who trusts in you.

Dear faithful friends and fellow children of God: Join us inside!

After much consideration, deliberation and prayer, the leadership of our congregation (including the Church Council, the Worship and Music Committee, and myself as pastor) have determined that we will be resuming in-person worship services on Sunday May 9th with that Sunday's place in the lectionary. In keeping with ELCA and government guidelines, and with the biblical commandment to "Love Thy Neighbor" our church leaders have provided the following guidelines and instructions which attendees will be required to follow when attending in-person worship:

- Face coverings will be required at all times. We will have extra covers if you forget yours.
- **Temperatures** will be taken at the door. Those with a fever will have to return home with their whole group.
- **Physical distancing** of 6 ft. or more will be practiced. For entrance to the church property, adherence to these policies will be required.
- Limit touching surfaces to help keep things sanitized.
- If you feel ill or have had potential exposure to COVID-19, <u>do NOT attend worship</u>. Also, if you are part of a high-risk population or feel uncomfortable attending in-person, we encourage you to refrain from attending and continue to access worship online or by drive in.
- The main narthex doors will be the only entrance and exit point.
- Ushers will seat worshipers from the front to the back of the sanctuary, every other row. (See the end of the document for a diagram.)
- Ushers will direct you when to exit, as well.
- **Do not gather inside** or by the doors before or after the service.
- These will not be part of our service: group responsive reading and singing, peace passing, greeting line, Sunday School and Nursery care, fellowship time.
- Offering will be dropped into baskets at the entrance.
- **Communion** will be "bring your own bread and drink," as we have been doing for parking lot services. There will be no distribution so please bring your own.
- There will be no bulletins at church. The service will be projected as before. If you need a physical bulletin, they will be available <u>online prior to worship</u>. You may download and print it to bring along with you if you have difficulty seeing the screens.
- **Restrooms limited to one person at a time** Enter via the mailbox lobby and corridor; Exit via the hallway and door next to the kitchen. We ask that the bathroom only be used in urgent need due to the difficulty in keeping them sanitized between uses during the service.

- Drinking fountains will be turned off. If you need water, you may bring your own bottle.
- **IMPORTANT**: Finally, please refer to the following instructions on what dates your household are to attend worship.

To comply with state guidelines for church service attendance (only 25% of maximum capacity can be in attendance at one time) the congregation will be divided into 2 groups. Divided alphabetically by last name, Group 1 will be A-K last names and Group 2 will be L-Z. We will have these groups trade off every other Sunday for in-person attendance. Our first date of resumed in-person services will be May 9th, which will be Group 2's turn to attend. The following Sunday, the 16th, will be Group 1's turn, with Group 2 going again on the 23rd. Note that if you need to be in the group other than your own (because you ride with someone from that group to church etc.), please let the church office know and we will do our best to accommodate this. Services will be recorded and posted online for those who cannot attend. If it is your off week, you can also attend worship in the parking lot which will continue to be broadcast live over the radio and if we do not fill to capacity, there will be a lottery to let those in the parking lot in until capacity is reached.

Checklist before going to church:

- ✓ Did you check if it is your group's Sunday to attend in-person service? If you are a guest or visitor, we invite you to come when you can!
- ✓ Do you have a face covering, bread for communion, personal hand sanitizer, your personal copies of the service if you want or need them?

For more information, please inquire in the office. We appreciate your patience and cooperation as we continue to discover this new way of being church together and we ask God to help and guide us. We are set up to seat parties or individuals at the ends in one row and in the center in the next row all the way to the last row. The pews are labeled and also balanced from side to side as shown below – "X" marks where congregants sit:



STIMULUS CHECKS UPDATE

Last month, we suggested some of you might want to consider donating a portion of your Stimulus Checks to our Long Term Property Fund. For some, these checks are an important addition to limited finances. However, for those whose income has not been materially affected by the Pandemic, these checks are like a bonus, just waiting for something to spend it on.

If these checks are a bonus for you, you might consider donating 10%, 25%, 50% (or more!) of that amount to build up our Property reserves. Just add "Property Reserves" to your check's memo line.

As you may remember, your Council has begun making a list of important Property expenses likely over the next 12-24 months. The list includes some exterior painting to help preserve our aging wood structures, some possible furnace repairs/replacement, likely roof resurfacing/replacement for the flat roof areas, and parking lot repair/resurfacing/stripe painting. There are probably more items to add to the list.

Thanks to those who have already contributed! We appreciate your consideration!



Normal chores were completed. Tex Culp assisted me by changing 65 watt fluorescent bulb at end of the covered walkway, South side of church and changing 3 4' fluorescent bulbs in the office. I have an appointment with Lakeside Electric to repair 2 can lights in sanctuary, which is a 2 person job as the ceiling is 20' at that point. \$250 is the estimate.

Solis Landscaping finished Phase 1 of weed spraying at a cost of \$480. Will do Phase 2 in 4-5 weeks.

I am expecting the annual fire extinguisher inspection by Elite Fire Protection Services.

Paint bids are coming in slowly (only 1 confirmed). I specified we were looking at our 2021-2-22 budget, so maybe they're holding off.

Will have something to report on roof heaters soon.

I got an estimate to cut a hole and install a mail slot in front door; \$85 labor & hardware.

I have completed the inventory of the 2 sheds and electrical room. WHEW!

FINANCIAL REPORT Ending March 31, 2021

a. Offering Envelopes

- i) For the month, we are below budget at 84.0% (\$11,222 vs \$14,185).
- ii) Year-to-date, we are on budget at 99.9% (\$34,005 vs \$34,035).

b. Total Income

- i) For the month, below budget at 87.3% (\$14,431 vs \$16,524).
- ii) Year-to-date, above budget at 112.4% (\$47,456 vs \$42,263).
- c. <u>Expenses</u>
 - i) For the month, under budget at 87.0% (\$13,921 vs \$15,996).
 - ii) Year-to-date, under budget at 92.5% (\$43,710 vs \$47,258).
- d. <u>Net Operating Income</u> (Total Income minus Expenses)
 - i) For the month, essentially on budget with a small profit of \$510, vs. the expected profit of \$528.
 - ii) **Year-to-date,** much better than expected with a profit of \$3,797, vs. the expected loss of \$4,994.
- e. Checking balance
 - i) Balance at Month-end is \$19,655.
 - ii) Previous Month-end balance was \$19,135.

What this means:

- Although January and February Offerings were above budget, we dipped this month. However, we are on budget YTD.
- Although Income was below budget, Expenses were also below budget, resulting in a modest profit for the month. For the year, Net Operating Income (Income minus Expenses) is well above budget, due to below budget Expenses and the Special Offerings in January from a deceased member.

How we are doing:

January and February Offerings were above expectations. Hopefully, the March dip is not the start of a trend! **Thanks for your faithfulness.**


