## "God does not need our good works, but our neighbor does" ~Martin Luther~

Dear faithful friends and fellow children of God:

Reformation. It's that time of the year, the time when we as Lutherans and Protestants remember the Protestant Reformation started by Martin Luther on October 31st, 1517. It's been 505 years since Luther kicked everything off with 95 theses. Mixed in with everything Luther was trying to accomplish was to emphasize justification by faith and God's righteousness as opposed to justification by works. Luther's Revelation of justification by faith eliminated and denied the possibility to be dependent on our own good works for our salvation. He realized it just didn't work. Luther realized that nothing we did, even the best of our actions for the best of causes would earn us salvation, but that through God's grace we would already have salvation given to us as a free gift through Christ's actions and through faith in God. This was the most amazing and miraculous of good news, and left some saying now that we need to do nothing (for salvation), what will we do? Luther encouraged people to this new standpoint of serving others, not for a reward, but in response to our God justifying us in faith. In other words, get involved, do our vocations, not out of expectation that we get something out of it, but because it is the right thing to do and it is what we do to show our love for God and God's children.

We get to show this love for neighbor in every part of our lives, and right now, as we get into the busy fall, Advent, and Christmas season, your neighbors in our church community will need your help especially. As we continue to grow out away from the pandemic, things have changed, but the need for folks to step up and get involved has not. We have the opportunity to build anew, to reform, to regrow our community of Faith Lutheran. We all have so much that we've been dreaming of, things we want to have happen at the church, to see certain things we all want to be done, and with so many wonderful things for us to do, I have a confession to make. I can't do it all. That's right, your pastor is confessing to you that I only have two hands, and I will use those hands and my voice and everything I have in my vocation and calling to be a servant leader to get everything done that I can. But my two hands could use some friends for the work, many hands make light work and all that. They're already some folks who do a lot at the church, so there are already a few hands getting things done, but I'm calling everyone who's involved in the church to do a little bit more, so that we all can see the progression of our reformation of Faith Lutheran Church happen all the quicker.

Your church needs you, your neighbor in the pew needs you, your sibling in Christ Jesus needs you, just as you need them. I know folks are busy, there are plenty of things drawing our attention these days, and some things like family absolutely should be. But if nothing else, I ask you to spend some time, find some time to pray. Pray for the leaders and workers in this church who are involved and already doing so much for the good of our community. And also pray to God to reveal to you where

you can get involved in God's church, how you can find a new way of serving your neighbor with your good work, pray that God helps remove any barrier from you carrying out your calling and vocation to serve in this way. I believe that this type of prayer is important, is powerful, and will change our congregation and all of our lives, communal and individual. And I want to let you know that I am not asking something from you that I am not already doing. I pray for you, each one of you, giving thanks for all that you already do, and holding you in prayer with God so that, God willing, we may see how our shared dreams of our church reformation realized.

So, until we see each other again: "May the Lord bless you and keep you; may the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; may the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace." (Numbers 6:24-26).

## FINANCIAL REPORT Ending September 30, 2022

#### a. Offering Envelopes

- i) For the month, over budget at 110.6% (\$10,520 vs \$9,515).
- ii) Year-to-date, on budget at 99.5% (\$95,859 vs \$96,322).

#### b. Total Income

- i) For the month, over budget at 113.4% (\$13,798 vs \$12,170).
- ii) **Year-to-date,** over budget at 107.6% (\$134,709 vs \$125,197).

#### c. Expenses

- i) For the month, over budget at 109.9% (\$17,893 vs \$16,284).
- ii) Year-to-date, slightly over budget at 102.3% (\$147,115 vs \$143,772).
- d. Net Operating Income (Total Income minus Expenses)
  - i) For the month, close to expected with a loss of \$4,094 vs the expected loss of \$4,114.
  - ii) **Year-to-date,** much better than expected, with a loss of \$12,406 vs the expected loss of \$18,575.

#### e. **Checking balance**

- i) Balance at Month-end is \$12,605.
- ii) Previous Month-end balance was \$16,569.

#### f. Comments

- i) Member Offerings are on budget for the year so far. However, because the budget projected a loss of over \$13,000 for the year, being on budget with member giving is still concerning overall.
- ii) Memorials designated for our general fund have helped significantly to close the gap between total income and expenses. However, it is still likely we will end the year in the red.
- iii) Next year's budget will be more challenging because we will no longer have the \$10,000 from the Campus Ministry fund to augment our income stream.


