

Dear faithful friends and fellow children of God: "Speak, for your servant is listening."

In the King James version * The word speak is mentioned 513 times * The word speaketh is mentioned 74 times * The word speaking is mentioned 62 times * The word speakest is mentioned 17 times * The word spake is mentioned 587 times.

While the spoken word is not the only mode of communication in the Bible, it is obviously an important one, and is a part of the overall emphasis on interpersonal dialogue and communication encouraged in the Bible as a necessary part of the practice of our faith. So when young Samuel says **"Speak, for your servant is listening,"** he is showing faith and wisdom beyond his years. Even at a young age, he realizes that he needs to hear God's word guiding him in his life and also that God is calling him to serve and to listen to God's people.

Samuel would become one of the great prophets, venerated in all the Abrahamic faiths, and would play a pivotal role in the transition from the period of the biblical judges to the institution of a kingdom under Saul and then David. There is plenty of complexity and nuance within that transition period, but again, right at beginning were the words of the servant leader Samuel: <u>"Speak, for your servant is listening."</u>

Here at Faith Lutheran Church, we continue to experience our own transition, different and separate from the one which Samuel took part in, but still one of the most impactful in our congregation's history. As we continue to transition from the pandemic to endemic in the world, our church is also continuing to transition how we practice our faith. Thus, it makes sense that we would draw on our ancestors in faith, like Samuel, to best navigate a transition this important to each individual member of our congregation and to the community of faith itself. And so the servant leaders of this congregation would like to say to each person they are called by God to serve: **"Speak, for your servant is listening."** Your servant leaders (the church council and myself) have coordinated with the Mutual Ministry team, who created and will conduct a congregational survey. The survey will be mailed to you and we ask that you prayerfully complete it at an in-person session with the Mutual Ministry Team or at home and return it to the church no later than **September 18th.** In either case, with any concerns and all the joys and dreams you have for Faith, we want to hear you so **"Speak, for your servant is listening."**

So, until we see each other again: "May the Lord bless you and keep you; may the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; may the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace." (Numbers 6:24-26).



FINANCIAL REPORT Ending July 31, 2022

a. Offering Envelopes

- i) For the month, under budget at 89.7% (\$9,459 vs \$10,540).
- ii) Year-to-date, on budget at 98.4% (\$75,273 vs \$76,498).

b. Total Income

- i) For the month, over budget at 122.2% (\$16,680 vs \$13,649).
- ii) Year-to-date, slightly over budget at 103.2% (\$102,911 vs \$99,700).
- c. Expenses
 - i) For the month, slightly under budget at 97.8% (\$15,871 vs \$16,237).
 - ii) Year-to-date, slightly over budget at 101.1% (\$112,525 vs \$111,243).
- d. Net Operating Income (Total Income minus Expenses)
 - i) For the month, a surplus of \$809 vs the expected loss of \$2,588.
 - ii) Year-to-date, a loss of \$9,613 vs the expected loss of \$11,543.
- e. Checking balance
 - i) Balance at Month-end is \$15,325.
 - ii) Previous Month-end balance was \$14,535.
- f. Comments
 - i) For the month, Member Offerings continues to lag budget. YTD looks good, but is due to "prepaid offerings" received last month. Overall YTD income looks good, due to the movement of undesignated Memorial Funds into the general account.

It's September, and yet it still feels like summer! Why not beat the heat with your sisters in Christ by coming to Circle Bible Study this month - where the church will be cool and welcoming, and the study refreshing and uplifting!

Jesus and Nature: Teachers of Faith is the theme of the Fall 2022 study in *Gather* magazine. The author, the Rev. Sara Olson-Smith, has this to say about it: Jesus often turned to the natural world in teaching, opening our eyes to see creation not just as something to be cared for, but as our teacher and kindred. It is no mistake that Jesus, who lovingly spoke of soil and plants, was thought to be a gardener that first Easter morning. This three-session Bible study will shift our perspectives and allow nature to be our teacher, through the words of Jesus and other parts of Scripture.
