Hi friends! Your Pastor here!

Our Lenten Journey together is coming to a close and so in its place comes **Holy Week.** Lent has prepared us for this, our week of High Holy Days. So, *did you know that*:

"Holy Week (sometimes called Passion Week) is the week before Easter. On Palm Sunday, Christ made his triumphal entry into Jerusalem. On Monday and Tuesday he taught in the Temple. On Wednesday, he rested at Bethany. Thursday, he returned to Jerusalem, ate the Last Supper with his disciples, and was betrayed by Judas. On Friday, he was crucified, and on Saturday, his body lay in the tomb. "*

The **Paschal Triduum:** "a three-day period that begins at sundown Holy Thursday and may end either at the Easter Vigil or at sundown Easter Sunday."* Thus, it is a season within a season. The Triduum is meant to be one worship service spread over 3 days, this is why you don't have all the same parts of an ordinary Sunday Worship Service included in the order of service for the 3 Holy days held between Holy Week's bookend Sundays of Palm/ Passion Sunday and Easter.

Palm Sunday (or Palmarum): Liturgical color: scarlet (representing love and zeal, fire and blood) or purple (representing penitence and mourning). "The sixth Sunday in Lent and the first day of Holy Week. It commemorates Christ's Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem (Matt. 21:1-11; Mark 11:1-11; Luke 19:28-40; John 12:12-19). May also be called Passion Sunday."*

Maundy Thursday (or Holy Thursday): Liturgical color: scarlet, purple, or white (because of the institution of Holy Communion at the Last Supper). "The Thursday of Holy Week when Christ washed the feet of his disciples instituted the Lord's Supper, and gave a new commandment of love. The name is derived from the Gospel reading from John 13:34: Mandatum novum do vobis, "A new commandment I give you: Love one another."'* Jesus' actions reveal that discipleship means crossing the boundary from selfishness to servanthood. While the plot against him begins to unfold, Jesus has a meal with his disciples and afterwards washes their feet. At the end of this worship service, we strip the altar remembering that Jesus was stripped before he was beaten and crucified. We are also reminded that Christ was stripped of his dignity on the cross and that our servanthood involves humility and self-denial. Our Maundy Thursday worship will be at Faith Lutheran at 5pm on April 6th.

Good Friday: Liturgical color: The only day of the year that has no liturgical color because the altar is completely stripped and bare. In some traditions, this lack of color is represented by the use of black cloth to represent mourning and death (also used on Ash Wednesday). "The Friday in the

week before Easter. Holy Week. The day on which the crucifixion is commemorated." In some traditions, a "Service of the Three Hours" is held on this day. This is "a service held on Good Friday from 12:00 noon until 3:00 pm, commemorating the crucifixion. A common meditation at this service is the Seven Last Words of Christ from the cross." Today, our Lord's servanthood reaches its ultimate limit. On the cross Jesus became the lamb who was slain for sinners. The tone of Good Friday is one of prayer and reflection. It is a solemn celebration of our Lord's victory on the cross. Our Good Friday worship will be at Sun City United Methodist Church at 5pm on April 7th.

Vigil of Easter (or Holy Saturday): Liturgical color: Gold (representing the Holiest holiday of Easter) and/or white (representing purity and joy). "The day before Easter Sunday, when Christ's body lay in the tomb. The Easter Vigil [is] considered the "mother of all vigils," it begins after nightfall on Holy Saturday and ends before dawn on Easter. This vigil includes extensive readings from Scripture, psalms, prayers, and the lighting of the Paschal candle."* becomes an expression of our spiritual boundary crossing and points to some facet of our passage from death to life with Christ. We do not currently offer an Easter Vigil, but instead choose to celebrate Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday morning at 9:30am.


Tenebrae: (Latin, "darkness.") "During services on the last three days of Holy Week, the candles and lights of the church are gradually extinguished until the church is in total darkness, reminiscent of the darkness that covered the earth at the crucifixion. Psalm 51 is often sung at this time."*

Easter, Celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord: Liturgical color: Gold and/or white. I could say more about Easter... but you will just have to join us to find out for yourself! See you at 9:30am on Sunday April 9th!

Palm Sunday and Holy Week begin the month of April. We have planned to share Maundy Thursday and Good Friday Worship with our Methodist neighbors by each congregation hosting one of the two joint services. See details below.

Easter follows - the Resurrection of our Lord — and then seven weeks of continued Easter Worship and Joy, known as the Easter "season". We will be following/learning about the fourteen "Stations of the Resurrection" (two per Sunday) during these seven weeks. Each "station" will celebrate a time when Jesus appeared to various disciples after He rose on Easter. Come worship the Risen Christ and bring a friend for this new adventure!

FINANCIAL REPORT Ending February 28, 2023

- a. We are starting off the year on a high, with member giving exceeding budget by 10%. As a result, our YTD loss of \$1,010 is less than expected. Let's keep this trend going!
- b. Please keep in mind that this year's budget expects a loss of over \$11,000, even with \$20,000 from Endowment. Giving more than expected will help reduce that \$11,000 to a more manageable amount by year-end.
- c. In addition to financial challenges this year, we are in need of your time and talent in several areas. Please give prayerful thought to ways you can get involved to help our church grow our community of Faith this year.
- d. If you bank with Provident Bank here in Sun City, thank you! The Bank periodically sends us a Community Partnership Contribution, which is an amount calculated based on the balances of Faith members having accounts with them. We just received \$485.89. For those of you looking for a bank....



a. Offering Envelopes

- i) **For the month**, over budget at 110.2% (\$11,333 vs \$10,284).
- ii) **Year-to-date,** over budget at 109.2% (\$22,396 vs \$20,519).

b. Total Income

- i) For the month, over budget at 111.8% (\$19,305 vs \$17,262).
- ii) Year-to-date, over budget at 109.1% (\$32,123 vs \$29,439).

c. Expenses

- i) For the month, over budget at 105.5% (\$17,203 vs \$16,301).
- ii) **Year-to-date,** on budget at 100.3% (\$33,133 vs \$33,034).
- d. **Net Operating Income** (Total Income minus Expenses)
 - i) For the month, a surplus of \$2,103 vs the expected surplus of \$961.
 - ii) Year-to-date, a loss of \$1,010 vs the expected loss of \$3,595.

Endowment Board Scholarships

On an annual basis, the Faith Endowment Fund Board accepts scholarship applications. For the upcoming 2023-2024 school year, the Board has revised the online application to offer two types of scholarships, each with a value of at least \$500. The restricted scholarship is offered to students pursuing the fields of education and/or ministry. The second type of scholarship, the unrestricted scholarship, is available to students majoring in fields other than education and/or ministry. The unrestricted scholarship is limited to current or former members of Faith Lutheran Church and students who have another direct connection to our congregation.
