Quilting to Celebrate, Comfort, Create, & Contribute

I began quilting 37 years ago when my twins were turning a year old. I'd had little sleep and less adult conversation in a long time, so in January 1984 I responded to an ad offering quilting classes at a fabric store. The teacher, Helen Thompkins, was well into her 80s. She made quilts entirely by hand – she didn't even own a sewing machine! As a result, I learned piecing and quilting the oldfashioned way. Although I moved on to mostly

machine piecing and quilting, I'm very glad I learned to do it first by hand.

The 1980s and 90s were my busy years, raising 5 children, returning to school, starting a new career, and trying to juggle it all as my Navy husband was often deployed. I continued to quilt when I could but it wasn't as much as I would have liked. While attending San Diego State, I planned my classes as best I could around my Tuesday morning quilt group – *Stitch and Bitch*. I credit that group with helping to keep me sane!

We moved from San Diego to Port Orchard, Washington in 1999. My work kept me extremely busy, and quilting took a back seat for a long time. In 2014 I retired and have since been free to pursue my quilting habit with reckless abandon. And what opportunities it has opened up for me! Over the last few years, I've been fortunate to have my quilts accepted into 3 major juried quilt shows and an international travelling exhibit. Since retiring, two of my quilts have received *Best of Show* awards at local shows, I was selected as Featured Artist for my regional quilt show, and I have sold several quilts to raise over \$4000 for our local Mental Health Center.

Right now, I'm in the process of moving to Kalispell, Montana, to start the next life adventure. My presentation will take you through my quilt journey and show you how to get *your* quilts considered for a national show, or used to contribute to a cause dear to your heart.
