The Chula Vista Quilt Guild will be bringing their opportunity quilt and tickets to our April meeting.




Quilt Show Boutique Kits Available

Let Art Inspire You – A Quilt Challenge for 2023

For our 2023 Quilt Challenge you are asked to choose a work of art, famous or not so famous, and let something in that artwork inspire you in making your challenge quilt. It can be the colors in the art, the shapes or textures. It can be the theme of the piece or it be an element in the art. Please do not make a replica of the artwork. It is meant to be your starting point, the inspiration for your own work of art!

Required guidelines:

- 1. No larger than 180" around the perimeter of the quilt. That is 45" square or any combination of measurements that total 180" or less.
- 2. The quilt must be quilted.

3. Your entry into the show must be accompanied by a photo of the artwork that inspired your quilt.

An example from another guild's challenge is included below. The artwork is "Starry Night" by Vincent Van Gogh and the inspired quilt is by Cath of Wombat Quilts in Australia. The deadline for the challenge will be the same as that for our quilt show which will be announced at a later date. It is usually in September.
