Kaleidoscope Friends

A big thank-you for philanthropy quilts goes to: Melanie Ellsworth, Diane Hamann, Trudy Ooms, Kathy Smith & Judy Woyke!

This month 16 beautiful quilts were delivered to the Chula Vista Veteran's Home, and 18 to Ronald McDonald House. Whew! That's a lot of quilts.

The Ronald McDonald House is really a wonderful place serving critically ill children and their families. It started in 1980 with 8 rooms; in 2006 a much larger house was constructed, with 47 guest suites for overnight accommodations, as well as facilities for day use. Last year 1,747 family members called RMH home for a while. You might wonder how long a family will stay at RMH ? - the average length of stay is 29 nights. During this time patients and families are provided with meals, activities and supplies as well as school. San Diego Unified School District provides school for visiting siblings.

So....where do our donated quilts fit into this picture? There is a welcome cart that volunteers wheel around which includes personal items, toys and quilts. Children get to choose from the cart which quilt they want as their own. Being in the hospital & treatment rooms is very cold for sick children, so the quilts provide warmth as well as comfort. The quilts we donate all have a label sewn-on, identifying them as from Kaleidsocope Quilt Guild, (and often there is the name of the person who made it as well). The families of those children who choose one of our quilts know that their new quilt has been "stitched with love by Kaleidoscope Quilt Guild" -that there are people who care about them. This is a wonderful gift!


