Marcia Bernard Cuccaro and Patti Bernard had the unique experience of living at the Nevada State Prison in Carson City during their formative years. Their father served as Prison Warden from 1951-1959, when there was only one prison in the state. They have some interesting tales to tell about growing up on the grounds of the institution and their interactions with some of the inmates.

Marcia is a former social worker, vocational rehab counselor, workers' compensation claims manager and chief of resource development at the Nevada Division of Aging Services. Patti is a former school administrator with a B.S. in Education and a Masters in Curriculum and Instruction. Both

PHILANTHROPY: IT'S SPRING AND SCHOLARSHIP TIME!

This time of year, as we begin to wind down our luncheon series, the Twentieth Century Club's Philanthropy Committee is busy preparing its recommendations to the board regarding awarding three nursing scholarships to help in training our next generation of health care professionals.

Annually, the TCC gives scholarships to second-year nursing students attending Truckee Meadows
Community College
(TMCC). These funds usually come from the TCC's Legacy Fund which is managed by the Community Foundation of Northern
Nevada which provides expert stewardship allowing TCC to achieve its philanthropic objectives.

Money for the scholarships is also raised through our 50/50

luncheon raffles and other fundraisers like the Spring Basket Extravaganza each May, events such as this past summer's "Booze & Botanicals," and other club activities—for example: the 2022 TCC Cookbook.

Since 1898, the TCC has been addressing Nevada's need for nurses through its scholarship program. Today, the total cost for the tuition and fees nursing program at TMCC is \$13,759—with second-year nursing students paying \$5,822. The TCC's Philanthropy Committee works hard to ensure that our scholarships keep pace with the students' actual costs.

The work of raising funds by the TCC is <u>imperative</u> as Nevada is facing a critical nursing shortage.

"Before COVID-19 swept through

Nevada, wreaking havoc on hospitals and the health care system, the state was facing a critical shortage of nurses. Since the pandemic took hold, health care professionals have said the shortage has reached dire levels. One analysis from UNR's Nevada Health Workforce Research Center found Nevada would need more than 4,000 new registered nurses just to meet the national RN-to-population average."—Nevada Independent
