Our consumerist culture does not make it any easier, with the cunning and prevalence of advertising, there is a constant flow of marketing ever in your face. Don't even get me started with A.I.! All of these factors have built to a year where individual people are looking around and wondering, where in the world can I find the real thing? So much so that now we have an entire society of people desperately searching for authenticity anywhere they can find it.

There is good news and bad news, Parent. I'll give you the bad news first... This isn't going to get any better. The culture is only going to get more and more augmented and fake the farther we take technology down the road. It is only going to get harder at finding authenticity. The good news? Well the good news is that we have an anchor in the Truth found in God's Word. I know I know, that sounds very Christian of me to say, but I think it is very helpful to remember. We serve a God who has spoken to us through a book that has stood the test of time. Societies and cultures have come and gone, nations and empires have risen and fallen, yet what always stands in the end is the Word of God.

We as Christians have a hope that far exceeds anything the culture can throw at us, and we serve a God who is more real and authentic than the fabrications of society. As a Christian parent, it is your job to teach these things to your children. The purpose of this letter is to show you what I am seeing in real time from our culture that is going to directly impact your preteen very soon. It is important that your future teenager knows this hope that we have in the Lord and that they have a firm foundational knowledge of God's Word. There is no better way to check the authenticity of something than to hold it next to the Bible and see if it checks out. Anything not in line with God's Word is simply a fake and distorted version of His true desire for the world.

There are a handful of Bible verses that were drilled into my mind since I was very young. One of which is this month's memory verse. I want to encourage you to make this month's memory verse a constant in your home.
