NEW FRONTDESK UTILITY BILLING ACH TRANSFERS END DECEMBER 2022

The City of Reinbeck now offers you the convenience of accessing your utility account and paying your monthly utility bill online! You can enroll in autopay, get electronic bills, and manage your account 24/7 online. You will receive bills electronically and can enroll in autopay so you won't have to remember to pay your bills each month. Sign up today by going to: reinbeck.frontdeskworks.com. There will be a bank processing fee to pay on line.

REMINDER all utility customers using ACH payment must switch to FrontDesk by the end of December 2022. After December 2022 all ACH customers that do not want to sign-up for FrontDesk will need to start mailing or dropping off their payments at City Hall.

FITNESS CENTER RENEWAL

All Pin numbers for the Reinbeck Fitness Center will expire at the end of the year. You will need to fill out a new Fitness Center Application and submit the annual fee with your application to receive a new Pin number for 2023. Applications are available at City Hall or on the city's website <https://reinbeck.org>. Memberships run from January 1st through December 31st. The 2023 annual membership fee is \$95 for a single membership and \$125 for a family membership. A Fitness Center Membership is also another great Christmas Gift!

NEW BATHHOUSE PROJECT

The bathhouse project is getting close to meeting its goals. The architect's probable cost came in just under \$500,000. The city has been awarded \$75,000 from Black Hawk County Gaming Commission and \$20,000 from R. J. McElroy Trust. There are \$27,000 in grant requests that are still pending. The city also has secured funds from Richard Grimm \$100,000, Gleo McCommons' Trust \$81,000 and \$112,658 from donations and the city's General Fund. If the remaining grants are awarded this will leave a balance of \$84,342 that is still needed to meet the \$500,000 goal. CITY ORDINANCES TO REMEMBER

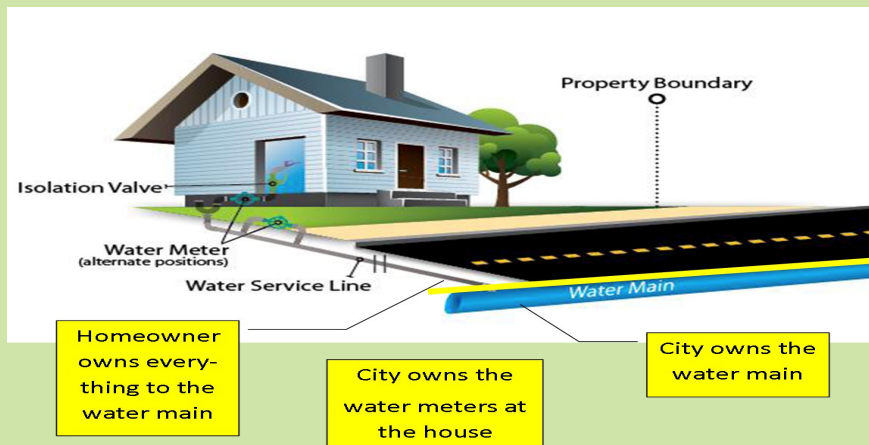
So that the streets can be plowed, no person shall park, abandon or leave unattended any vehicle on any public street, alley or City-owned off-street parking area between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. during the months of November, December, January, February and March. It is the responsibility of the abutting property owners to remove snow, ice, and accumulations promptly from sidewalks. It is unlawful for any person to throw, push, or place any ice or snow from private property, sidewalks, or driveways onto the street. You will be charged if the city must go back and clean up in front of your property due to pushing snow in the street after plows have cleared the street. You can view the entire City of Reinbeck Ordinances at City Hall. Thank you for your cooperation in allowing the city streets and alleys to get cleared in a timely manner and for keeping the sidewalks clear. Also, be courteous to your neighbors and do not blow your snow onto their property.

LEAD SERVICE LINE INVENTORY

Under the EPA's Lead and Copper Rule requirements, our community is gathering information to create a comprehensive inventory of potential lead and copper water service lines across our water system. To make this effort successful and provide safe, clean water to our residents, we encourage all to assist with these efforts.

Homeowners are asked to examine their home's incoming water service line and determine the material. If able to confidently report the material as copper, plastic, or lead, this information will help with the inventory reporting requirements. Typically, the water service line will enter a home through the basement before connecting to the water meter as the displays below show.

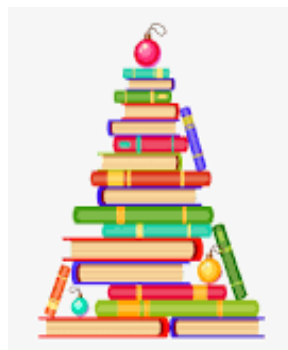


LIVE CHRISTMAS TREES MAY BE DISPOSED OF AT THE CITY BRUSH SITE.
