Treasurers Report

Greg Frontier reviewed the financials for the association with the following highlights

- Unspent funds for 2021 is \$18,000 being held by the Waterford Treasurer
- The association's current assets are \$60,000 so we are in good financial shape
- Reviewed the rolling 3 year budget and highlighted miscellaneous deviations from plan
- The office expenses were discussed related to the cost for Public Notices of assessments
- 2021 Spending overall was below the budget (\$16,000 Favorable to budget)
- Most savings was due to reduced need for weed harvesting

Mike Hauswirth reported on communications – mostly on Web Communications with the following Highlights

- Received one volunteer for the posted Secretary Position So the "System" Worked
- Need a job description for the Claudia Park Director position
- WHOA Member directory is being finalized to spring of 2022

Weed Harvesting and Claudia Park Report

Mike Hauswirth reported on behalf of Pat Deibel the following:

- Wants to replace 3 trees in 2022 cost around \$300
- Gate Maintenance is completed. All operating features work as designed
- Harvesting Equipment is properly stored for the winter
- Discussed ideas on security cameras no decisions made
- Discussed individualized Key Codes with a current quote of \$5,300 (Installation) plus \$70/ month
 - o Provides better knowledge on who is entering and exiting the park
 - o Concept is each resident will have an individual code
 - Access plan and options need further study and evaluation
 - WHOA is using the current provider as main idea source since they own the access assets
 - o The current provider has a self interest to upsell to WHOA this is being managed
- There is an option which would be less expensive for the cloud hosting but we'd need an Internet connection. The value of having an internet connection at the park may be a better option as we could have live stream video cameras, Wi-Fi on-site and decrease our cloud based gate control cost. Assuming Xfinity or AT&T is \$40/50 a month and gate cloud data is around \$20 it may be more useful and cost efficient to get internet.
- The other thing International controls is quoting us for, is the relocation of the keyed access panels. Apparently, they are not positioned "to code" and would have to be moved in order to implement this new system. I asked them why this is necessary since we are privately owned, and it basically sounds like they won't work on our gate, for this up grade without it being compliant. Seems odd to me since they installed this originally but I guess the building codes changed.
- The all in cost to do this is basically around \$5300 plus committing which ever way to a \$70-\$80 monthly bill.

- Discussed adding a Pay Pal account to handle items like July 4 Flares No decisions was made
- Need a job description for the Claudia Park Director position
