# WLOA Meeting Draft Minutes November 15, 2022

I. Call to Order (Steve Miller)

The meeting was called to order at 7:04. There were 10 Directors present and a Quorum needs a minimum of 11 people.

II. Secretary's Minutes Review and Approval (John Casey)

The September Minutes were discussed but not voted on due to the lack of a Quorum. There were no exceptions to the September minutes.

III. Treasurer's Report (Ken Harrison) Since the meeting did not have a quorum, the report was made as information sharing.

- IV. Standing Committee Reports
  - A. Communications Report-Website (Michael Hauswirth)
    - Facebook page is working and the website is active as well.
      People are using the website and participating in activities. No issues to report. All minutes for 2022 have been uploaded.

  - B. Lake Board Report Dave Kramer reported that there is no news on Lake Board.
  - C. Lake Quality Reports (Mike Hauswirth)
    - a. Harvesting & Claudia Park Report The Harvester is properly winterized and stored. Looking for people with appropriate skills to hire for 2023. Mike described some regular maintenance that is needed on the harvester. There may need to have some work on the truck, especially on the locking mechanism of the bed out of alignment. The estimate from Bostick will not happen until the spring of 2023. The engine has been inspected and is in good shape. Mike described some tools needed and plans to send a request to the Riparians for tool donations that would help.
    - b. Storm Drain Project Update We will leave it in the budget for 2023.

- D. Water Quality Report (Dave Hansz)
  - a. Dave provided a report of activities and overall the Water Quality is very good. The E Coli problem in the summer was temporary (a few days) and due to rain runoff. The Phragmites are reported as under control, significantly better than 2013. Dave's Full report is attached.

## 2022 Watkins Lake Environmental Report

#### Water Quality - E.Coli Testing (Oakland County Health Division)

I took samples at each of five sites on four different days between early June and the middle of August. The limit for total body contact is more than 300 E.Coil MPN/100ml of water. On July 6, the day after heavy rains, the area where Covert and Watkins Lake Rd meet the count was 470. The site was retested a few days later and the count was down to 29. That location has also had high readings in 2019 and 2016 after heavy rains. The drainage at that location should be studied. Even with the one high reading, the average for all five sites for 2022 was 52, about the same as last year's average of 49. The average count for testing done since 2001 (22 years) is 28. The full report is on our web site.

The lake's water quality remains very good. A total of \$252 was spent for testing this year.

#### Water Clarity - Secchi Disk Measurement

For 2022 the average depth for the Secchi disk reading was 8' 5". This is the same average as last year. The individual readings were from 7'9" to 9'3". The lowest yearly level was 2018 at 7'4" and the highest reading was in 2009 at 13' 3". The long term average from 2009 to present is 10'0".

The lake clarity was about the same as last year, but less than the long term average.

#### **Invasive Species Update - Phragmites**

Phragmites is an invasive type of reed found in many lakes and roadside ditches throughout Michigan. This aggressive plant once establish can grow very densely and up to 15' tall. Once it is established it is very hard and costly to control.

Each summer since 2011, I surveyed our shoreline and found Phragmites growing in or by our lake. I treated those locations each fall with herbicide.

In 2013, I found as many as ten locations. This year, I found only one site. At that site (3801 Lakewood) the phragmites are mixed within a stand of native cattails and very hard to get at. The canal by Eason remains clear. Last year, the homeowner (Ronnie Yaldoo) cut down all the plants and covered the area with a weed control material which was very effective.

The Phragmites are currently under control, we need to remain on the lookout for this plant.

Nothing was spent for weed killer this year.
