Our Annual General Meeting will be held on Tuesday, June 24th . Our traditional potluck dinner will begin at


6PM with the meeting held afterward. We will be voting on Executive and Committee positions and charitable contributions.

Treasurer's Report for the 67th Annual Community Flower & Garden Show

A very successful show again this year. Bottom line: net profits of \sim \$2950 !! (to be confirmed once all expenses received).

The largest source of the profits came from the **Silent Auction** which had lots of interest and bidding activity due to the awesome items (110) donated. End result? Over \$3700 raised, even after expenses!

Some other interesting stats:

- 355 (paid) visitors on Saturday (exhibitors, volunteers, and children not charged = ~40/50 more attendees)
- 29 exhibitors participated in judged event on Friday
 - -249 exhibits entered (50 cents/entry = \$120 received *no charge for entries by children)
 - -134 prizes awarded (1st, 2nd, 3rd place = \$285 in prize money paid out)
- 71 contributors from the community at large, as well as from many members of the Mill Bay Garden Club
- 11 vendors outdoors (including MBGC Master Gardeners)

Gardening Tips

Tips June into summer 2014

- Make sure your plants receive enough water as the weather warms up
- First crop of strawberries are ripe-YUM!
- All annuals and heat loving vegetables can be planted out now
- Cut the scapes off your garlic, so the plant's energy goes into forming a large bulb (steam or stir fry the tasty scapes)
- Mulch garden beds to conserve moisture
- Fertilize your potted plants regularly with a water soluble fertilizer (perhaps 20-20-20 on the annuals and fish fertilizer on the veggies)
- Construct trellises/plant supports for cukes, pole beans and tomatoes
- Don't forget to wear sunscreen while gardening!
- Deadhead ornamentals for a neater look to your garden – lots of material to build your compost pile
- On composting make sure you water your pile to keep the creatures happy - moisture and air are important components of the composting process.





Murray Mix Fertilizer Recipe Supplied by Elaine Scott

Some members have recently asked me for the Murray Mix Fertilizer Recipe. This recipe was developed by Alan and Liz Murray of Cobble Hill. They originally developed it for their rhodos but now broadcast it throughout their property. I broadcast it in my garden in the spring. Some nurseries sell it made up. The ingredients are quite expensive but well worth the cost.

- -4 parts alfalfa meal
- -4 parts canola meal
- -4 parts blood meal
- -2 parts dolomite lime
- -1 part rockphosphate
- -1 part bone meal
- -1 part kelp meal
- -1 part greensand.
