Gardening Tips

- ◆ Tips October November 2014
- Have you planted your bulbs yet? Now is the perfect time.
- There is still time to plant container grown trees and shrubs, or even move some established specimens. Try not to compact the soil.
- Roses deadheaded, old leaves destroyed to prevent the spread of disease.
- Spread an application of lime around roses and lilacs and scratch into the soil.
- Fill your containers with evergreen shrubs or winter pansies. I
 have planted layers of bulbs in a pot and topped with small
 pansies. You can even buy bags of bulbs with the guesswork
 done for you.
- Garlic should be planted now.
- All tools should be cleaned, wooden handles oiled, and stored for the winter----maybe!!!!!!!! we could still be gardening in December!
- Mulch your beds with leaves to stop winter rain compaction or erosion.
- ◆ Take some cuttings of your favourite pelargoniums and winter them over as young plants in a cool place.







Day 1: Sun 17 May 2015 Arrival - London - Cotswolds

Today we arrive into London Heathrow airport. Here we will be met and taken to our hotel in the Oxfordshire Cotswolds market town of Burford which will be our base for the next 4 nights. On our way we will break the journey with a stroll around the beautiful gardens at Waterperry . Balance of day free to explore the village.

Day 2: Mon 18 May 2015 Cotswolds









Today we enjoy a tour of the Cotswolds beginning in 'Stow on the Wold' before reaching Hidcote Manor for a private tour of this wonderful Arts and Crafts Movement garden. We will lunch here independently before returning to Burford, with stops in Chipping, Campden and Broadway.

Day 3: Tue 19 May 2015 Cotswolds

Today we visit Blenheim Palace, home to the 11th Duke and Duchess of Marlborough, and birthplace of Sir Winston Churchill. Blenheim palace is a true masterpiece of 18th century Baroque Architecture. We will discover the beauty of this World Heritage Site that sits amongst over 2000 acres of parkland and formal gardens. This will be followed by free time in nearby Woodstock. Before returning to the hotel we will enjoy some retail therapy at the famous home and garden store at the Burford Garden Centre.

Day 4: Wed 20 May 2015 Cotswolds

It's market day in Tetbury which will be our first stop today. This is a town famous for its antique shops and a delight to visit. After lunch we'll head for the gorgeous gardens at the Abbey House. Where the Cotswold meets the West Country, this truly spectacular 5 acre garden sits beside the 12th Century Abbey Church in the centre of Medieval Malmesbury and straddling the River Avon. This garden is world famous and a must see. Before heading back to our hotel we will enjoy an owner led tour of Herbs for Healing near Cirencester.

Day 5: Thu 21 May 2015 London

(B) Leaving Burford we head for the university city of Oxford and a walking tour of the Colleges that are normally off limits for the general public. We will enjoy some free time for independent sightseeing and shopping and leave in the later afternoon to arrive at our hotel by 6pm. Here we will have a free evening for shows or sightseeing.

Day 6: Fri 22 May 2015 London - Chelsea Flower show

Today we attend the world famous Chelsea Flower Show! Here we have a private one way transfer to the show so that we can stay as long as we like. The balance of the day will be at leisure.

Day 7: Sat 23 May 2015 Departure

Today we have private group transfers to London Heathrow airport for our return flights home. Extension nights are available upon request.
