Gardening Tips

By Barb Kohlman, Master Gardener Tips for Jan/Feb 2015

• GARDEN STAKES:

When pruning your *Buddleia davidii* (butterfly bush) save the nice straight branches for stakes. This pruning should be done down to about 12" every spring for healthy, productive new growth.

TRAINING WAYWARD BRANCHES:

When a branch on a tree wants to grow straight up instead of weeping, tie a weight (e.g. a litre bottle filled with water) onto the offending branch (suggest two/thirds out from the trunk) with a bungee cord, leave for a few months till the branch is growing as desired.

◆ TOMATO CAGE "MARKS THE SPOT":

When sowing seeds directly into the garden use a tomato cage or a wire mesh basket upside down to mark the spot until seeds mature, thereby avoiding the planting on top accident. I use the mesh hanging baskets to keep rabbits from chewing on my new young plants too.

◆ GLOVE TRICK:

When your right hand glove wears out, turn it inside out and pair with a new right hand glove to extend their life.

LINE CONTAINERS:

To keep potting soil from falling through drain holes, line your pots with coffee filters. Excess water is free to escape as well.

HELLEBORES = now is the time!

- 1. Prune off old, damaged and diseased leaves whenever possible.
- 2. Before bloom, remove foliage that will obscure flowers on stemless plants.
- 3. After bloom,
- remove spent flowers on stemless plants
- remove flowered stems at the base for plants that flower on stems



Thousands of plants in bloom brings people from all over Vancouver Island and the lower mainland to Salt Spring and last year, individuals from as far as Seattle and Bellingham came to the nursery. It is amazing to see the infectious excitement generated in people when they are around so many blooming plants in the middle of winter.

We have Hellebores represented from growers in Great Britain, Germany, Belgium, Japain, Taiwan, Canada and the USA. The next largest group of plants featured are Japanese hepaticas, but there are many others, for example, winter aconites, species snowdrops and Adonis to name a few.

Good tree health is critical to good production in your orchard, whether it consists of 5 trees or 500 trees.

Join ISA Certified Arborist and Urban Forester Todd Gesshe for this daylong workshop on basic tree biology, fruit tree health, philosophy of pruning, and hands-on pruning procedures at a local farm.

This is a great opportunity to learn fruit tree basics in time to prune your trees and ensure they are healthy for the coming season. You will also have an opportunity to ask questions of the instructor related to your own trees. This workshop is offered once a year only!

Seating is limited to 25 participants, so please register early. Cost is \$35 for CGC members and \$40 for the general public. You can register in-person at the Garden Pantry Thrift Store located at 360 Duncan Street .
