
#### **Open Gardens:**

#### **Gardening Tips**

for June 2016

Finish planting out bedding plants..... or start if that is the case!!!!!!

Water and feed containers and hanging baskets on a regular basis, and dead-head to maintain good flowering through the season.

Sow perennials and biennials (columbines, delphiniums, oriental poppies, lupines, foxgloves and campanulas) for next season.

Check roses for blackspot (though there may be less with our dry weather) and pick off and destroy diseased leaves.

Mulch around your plants to help retain moisture – compost is best but fine bark mulch can be used as long as you sprinkle an organic, high nitrogen fertilizer under it. I use Borden's organic mix from Borden's Mercantile in Victoria.

Fertilize bulbs that have finished flowering, especially alliums - they are heavy feeders.

Prune spring flowering deciduous shrubs - lilacs, weigela, mock orange when they finish flowering and fertilize - Borden's again!!

#### MILL BAY GARDEN CLUB - OPEN GARDENS

### Elaine Scott and Ian Rogers Saturday, June 4<sup>th</sup> from 1 pm until 5 pm

Elaine and Ian began this garden about fifteen years ago. At that time the property was covered with broom and blackberries and was a very hot sunny spot. The front garden is ornamental and covers about 2/3 acre. It includes a pond which is fenced but the rest of the garden is open to the deer. The garden is watered via soaker hoses and each area gets about  $1 \frac{1}{2}$  hours of watering a week. Bark mulch has been used extensively to reduce the loss of water via evaporation and also to suppress the weeds. Although this was originally a hot dry sunny slope the trees have grown up over the intervening years and provide some shade areas.

The vegetable garden is in the back area and is fenced to keep out the deer. It includes about eighteen raised beds and provides vegetables most of the year.

A small greenhouse is used for propagation and holding tender plants over the winter.


Living outside:

Over the past 4 years, with big excavators and many hours, we transformed a wild and rugged property into a plant oasis, with entertainment and outdoor living driving us. More than 6000 plants were planted in about 8000 sqft of plant bed. Over 1200 sqft of pond was built, divided into a swimming pond that rivals many chlorine pools and a plant/filter pond.



Multiple seating areas were created, including 2 outdoor cooking areas, both with a BBQ, and one with an authentic Napolitano wood burning fire place, good for weekly pizza parties. 2 gazebos with Green Roofs (Sedum) were built, as well as a fully outfitted outdoor bathroom, overlooking the planted pond and waterfall.

The Mill Bay Garden Club received a warm invitation from Jennifer Urquhart of the Point Roberts Garden Club to attend their 14th bi-annual garden tour. See details below:

#### The 14<sup>th</sup> Point Roberts Garden Tour

Sunday, June 26, 2016 10:00am and 4:00pm

This tour, which is self-guided, includes afternoon tea and live music from 1pm to 4pm at the Point Roberts Community Center on Gulf Road. The tour, which is biennial, is usually in July, but in response to the early Spring, it has been moved up to late June and promises to be spectacular.



This year, there will be nine unique gardens to visit. From a garden designed to compliment a 1920's cottage barged to the Point from New Westminster, to a true English garden by the seaside, to a low maintenance slope-side gem, the gardens are a testament to their owners' vision and care. Gardens returning to the tour include favorites from past years—an artist's palette of pinks, blue and lavender; an Asian-inspired peaceful oasis hidden behind a privacy fence; and what has been termed one of the great emerging Northwest Coastal perennial gardens. Some of the gardens are close to the sea, which make their unique approach to design facing sun, wind and salt, worth the visit alone.

Ticket prices are C\$20 or US\$15 per person and are available at the Blue Heron Gallery and Nielson's Home Building Center in Point Roberts, Harris Nursery (Ladner, BC) or Sunnyside Nursery, (Tsawwassen, B.C). Visitors are reminded that a passport or enhanced drivers license is required to cross the border.

Tickets will also be available the day of the tour up until 2pm at 79 Tyee Drive, on the right, shortly after crossing the border into Point Roberts, and at the Blue Heron Gallery, 1360 Gulf Road and Nielson's Building Center, 391 Tyee Drive. No tickets will be sold after 3pm in order to give visitors enough time to tour the gardens.

Each ticket includes a map of Point Roberts clearly marked with the locations of the tour gardens, the afternoon tea, and restaurants for those who wish to have lunch.

#### **Directions:**

Point Roberts, WA, is a peninsula located due South of Tsawwassen, B.C. From Highway 99, turn West onto Highway 17, and then left onto 56<sup>th</sup> Street and follow the road until it ends at the border. From the Island Ferries, take Highway 17 East, turn right on 56<sup>th</sup> Street and continue to the border.
