Prayer Requests

In John 11, Jesus got a notice that Lazarus in Bethany, the brother of Mary and Martha, was dead. So he went to their house. On his arrival, Jesus found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. "Lord," Martha said to Jesus, "if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But I know that even now God will give you whatever you ask." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again." Martha answered, "I know he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day." Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. Do you believe this?" (John 11:25-26) I am just awe-struck by this conversation between Jesus and Martha. Martha had zero understanding of what Jesus meant. She meant her brother's resurrection in the future, but Jesus meant 'raising Lazarus now'. I can picture Martha being astounded that Jesus resurrected her brother right there. He was no longer in the tomb. Does this surprise you?

"Do you believe this?"— this question of Jesus captivates me. Ask yourself, "Do I believe NOW that Jesus is the resurrection and the life? Do I believe NOW that I will live eternally even after I die?" I wonder what we would do differently if we really believed this. Philips Brooks said, "Let every man and woman count himself immortal. Let him catch the revelation of Jesus in his resurrection. Let him say not merely, "Christ is risen," but, "I shall rise." In this belief, we can turn our life around NOW. In this belief, we can find new life NOW when everything feels lifeless. In this belief, we see light shining in what feels like a dark tomb NOW. Because Christ lives in us and with us through the Holy Spirit, we are compelled to live the future in the present. In this belief we make a difference NOW.

HOW MUCH FOR A MIRACLE?

A little girl went to her bedroom and pulled a glass jelly jar from its hiding place in the closet. She poured the change out on the floor and counted it carefully. Three times, even. The total had to be exactly perfect. The Messenger No chance here for mistakes. Carefully placing the coins back in the jar and twisting on the cap, she slipped out the back door and made her way 6 blocks to Rexall's Drug Store with the big red Indian Chief sign above the door. She waited patiently for the pharmacist to give her some attention, but he was too busy at this moment. Tess twisted her feet to make a scuffing noise. Nothing. She cleared her throat with the most



disgusting sound she could muster. No good. Finally she took a quarter from her jar and banged it on the glass counter. That did it!

'And what do you want?' the pharmacist asked in an annoyed tone of voice. I'm talking to my brother from Chicago whom I haven't seen in ages,' he said without waiting for a reply to his question. 'Well, I want to talk to you about my brother,' Tess answered back in the same annoyed tone. 'He's really, really sick....and I want to buy a miracle.' 'I beg your pardon?' said the pharmacist. 'His name is Andrew and he has something bad growing inside his head and my Daddy says only a miracle can save him now. So how much does a miracle cost?' 'We don't sell miracles here, little girl. I'm sorry but I can't help you,' the pharmacist said, softening a little.

'Listen, I have the money to pay for it. If it isn't enough, I will get the rest. Just tell me how much it costs.' The pharmacist's brother was a well-dressed man. He stooped down and asked the little girl, 'What kind of a miracle does your brother need?' Expect that his hand will be upon you at every turn and receive the wonderful blessings that he has in store for you.


Epiphany Financial Update

Investing in Epiphany Lutheran Church

If You Are Over 72

As many of you know, if you have an IRA investment account and you are over 72 you are required to take a minimum distribution from that account each year. What you might not be aware of is that you can make contributions to any charitable organization from this distribution and those contributions are tax exempt. It is excellent way to make a contribution to Epiphany. You should check with your investment advisor and find out how you can take advantage of this benefit.

At Any Age

If you have an investment portfolio with significant gains, ask your financial advisor about setting up a charitable donor-advised fund. You can transfer stock, mutual funds, etc. directly to it without paying capital gains and that transfer counts as a charitable contribution for your itemized deductions. Many investment companies sponsor donor-advised charitable funds (e.g., Fidelity, Schwab, Vanguard); some banks (such as Bank of America) offer them as well. You can then manage this donor-advised fund to donate to charities (including Epiphany) whenever you want.
