O God, you are my God, I seek you, my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where there is no water.

So I have looked upon you in the sanctuary, beholding your power and glory. Because your steadfast love is better than life, my lips will praise you. So I will bless you as long as I live; I will lift up my hands and call on your name. My soul is satisfied as with a rich feast, and my mouth praises you with joyful lips

The Hebrew word "hesed" is translated into English as "lovingkindness." Like so many words, it means that and so much more.

Part of the problem with translating anything into English from any other language is that we have such a huge vocabulary. Having the largest number ow words means that terms from other languages can carry multiple meanings and English translations can be varied. So it is with the term "hesed," which carries much more nuance than you might think.

jewish.shop/37781/hesed-and-chesed-in-hebrew/ explains hesed:

"In the Torah, the Hebrew word for loving kindness is hesed, and the term can be translated as "kindness toward one's neighbor." It is a covenantal gesture expressing faithfulness to God, and this covenant is described in Dt 7:12. The plural of hesed is mercy, and this can be used to refer to the hesed of the patriarchs and the hesed of David.



The hesed of God is rooted in his unfailing love for His creation, and the prophets teach that hesed should be the hallmark of God's people. Micah 6:8 and Zec 7:9 teach that Israel should show hesed love to God, but the nation of Israel failed to do so, resulting in a controversy and call to repentance from the Lord. The word hesed appears over 250 times in the Old Testament, including

more than half of those instances in the book of Psalms. It occurs first in Genesis 19:19 and last in Zechariah 7:9.

Hesed is not a feeling, but rather an action. It involves intervening and rescuing others. In the bible, Abraham's servant miraculously found a wife for Isaac, praising God for his faithfulness. Throughout the Scriptures, hesed is a constant theme and is an important part of the God's character. If we follow the commandments, God's hesed will lead us to the happiness we desire.



Hesed can be applied to human love. It is often used in the context of a covenant, and is associated with betrothal. It also suggests God's love for us, and we are meant to return the favor. In the Bible, Hesed is often used in the context of a covenant. It demonstrates the faithfulness of God toward us and those around us."

The importance of hesed and its related term, chesed, meaning grace and/or mercy, is central to our understanding and experience of God in our lives and our world. Following the Psalmist, we recognize God through acts of steadfast love—hesed--and respond with praise and with offering our own acts of hesed and chesed. And there is comfort, there is joy, there is where we are called to live.

May it be where we abide.

#### STAYING HEALTHY DURING THE SUMMER MONTHS

The main cause of a heat-related illness is your body's inability to cool itself. Sweat is your body's natural tool for cooling you down. If you over-exercise or work strenuously in hot weather or a heated room, your body may have difficulty producing enough sweat to keep you cool.

Other causes of heat exhaustion include: dehydration wearing heavier, tight clothing consuming alcohol

If you are experiencing heat exhaustion for an extended period of time, it can lead to heat stroke. Heat stroke can come on quickly if it is very hot or you are overexerting yourself. That's why it's important to begin treatment at the first signs of heat exhaustion.

# **Symptoms**

- Faint or Dizzy
- Headache
- Profuse Sweating
- Irritability
- Weak, Rapid Pulse
- Shallow Breathing
- Pale, Cool, Clammy Skin
- Nausea or Vomiting
- Muscle Cramps

# **Treatment**

- Have victim lie down in a cool shaded area or air conditioned area.
- 2) Drink water if victim is conscious.
- 3) Use caution when victim stands up, apply cold compresses.

- Absence of Sweating
- Pulsating Headache
- Hot, Red, Dry Skin
- High Body Temp: Above 103
- Nausea or Vomiting
- Strong, Rapid Pulse
- Confusion
- Convulsions
- May Lose Conciousness

# **Investing in Epiphany Lutheran Church**

#### If You Are Over 72

As many of you know, if you have an IRA investment account and you are over 72 you are required to take a minimum distribution from that account each year. What you might not be aware of is that you can make contributions to any charitable organization from this distribution and those contributions are tax exempt. It is excellent way to make a contribution to Epiphany. You should check with your investment advisor and find out how you can take advantage of this benefit.

### At Any Age

If you have an investment portfolio with significant gains, ask your financial advisor about setting up a charitable donor-advised fund. You can transfer stock, mutual funds, etc. directly to it without paying capital gains and that transfer counts as a charitable contribution for your itemized deductions. Many investment companies sponsor donor-advised charitable funds (e.g., Fidelity, Schwab, Vanguard); some banks (such as Bank of America) offer them as well. You can then manage this donor-advised fund to donate to charities (including Epiphany) whenever you want.
