As the **Pre-Cursillo Chair**, some of my responsibilities include updating, distributing, collecting, and reviewing Candidate and Sponsor forms. Ensuring they are properly completed, documented and forwarded to the applicable parties, I am also responsible for promoting Cursillo at the numerous parishes within the **Diocese of Rockford**.

So after much prayer and consideration it appears although my focus as "Pre-Cursillo" chair, my primary focus should be on matters leading up to the Cursillo weekend- makes sense- right? Well not necessarily. Who is a Cursillista?
