State Deputy's Message

Brother Knights,

When you watch or read the news, do vou feel anxious or a little afraid? I do. Be it storm devastation in North Carolina, abortions on demand, Supreme Court Nominee drama, upcoming elections, homelessness, education issues, mass shootings, violence, hatred, or any other number of crises or actions that threaten life and property. In many of these examples we know in our heart that the hand of the "Evil One" is clearly at work. Aren't you glad that you joined an organization that is engaged in a daily battle with the devil: to protect life at all stages; respond to emergencies and help those effected bv disaster; and work in our communities to bring about change to improve our neighbors' living conditions? I am, and I'm certain that you are as well.

Knights from around the country went to the aid of their neighbors in North Carolina to help them recover from the devastation of Hurricane Florence. Knights actively work to put an end to abortion both by physically praying, and by using the power of the ballot box. Knights help feed and clothe the homeless and the impoverished. Knights help those with intellectual and physical disabilities. Knights are in the pew, in the parish, and in the Church, aiding the pastor and fellow parishioners. Knights are dedicated to supporting our religious, priests, bishops, and our Supreme Pontiff.

To continue in our ministry to be the strong right arm of the church, we need to continuously inform ourselves on all issues Catholic and most importantly continue to grow our ranks.

Speaking of membership growth, so far this year, our state has done well at bringing in new members, but it needs to do better in order to meet our goal of 1,000 new members by June 30, 2019. As of September 29, 2018, 195 new members have received the Admissions Degree. Over the next nine months we will recruit 805 more; just 89 new members each month. This goal is very attainable, we just need to focus and recruit one new member at a time.

I know we can do this. In this first quarter alone, five of our brothers have been identified and recognized by the Supreme Council as being in the Top 25 list of Recruiters, Grand Knights and District Deputies. Look at their accomplishments and know that you can join them. They are:

District Deputy Ustaszewski district is at 81% of its recruitment goal and he has personally recruited 16 new members. Albert successfully led the development of a new council in Somerton, which will be called Immaculate Heart of Mary Council. Grand Knight, Javier Negrete's Council #1806 has added 189% of his council's fraternal year goal for new members. District Deputy Reynolds' District has recruited 50% of their goal. District Deputy Sullivan's district has recruited 43% of its goal for the year. Grand Knight Kluthe's council in Florence has recruited 175% of their membership goal. He was personally responsible for signing up 10 new members on his own. These few Knights have accomplished great things. These men are Knights who will help lead us to recruitment success this year. I ask each Knight in the State to make it you goal to get your name added to the Supreme Council's Top 25 rolls.

In last month's message I described an incentive, saying that the top 10 recruiters would be sent to Minneapolis to attend the Supreme Convention next August. To clarify, I was describing the Supreme Top 25 incentive program. It will send the top 10 Recruiters Order-wide and their spouses to the Convention Minneapolis, Supreme in Minnesota and will sit at the Supreme Knight's reserved tables during the State Dinner. The top recruiter Order-wide will receive the Top Recruiter Plague during the Awards Session. I apologize for any misunderstanding. Please check out the

This past month an exemplification of the Foundation and Knighthood Degrees was held at Fray Garces Council #3855 in Glendale. It was an honor to bestow Knighthood upon 32 men that day. It was also a great honor to recognize Past State Deputy Larry Costanzo as the Class Honoree for the degree.

Lawrence "Larry" Costanzo is originally from New York State. In his youth, he earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Biology and received a Master of Arts Degree in Public Administration. In 1962. he was commissioned a second lieutenant in the United States Air Force. During his long and distinguished military career, he was stationed in various places in the United States and abroad. He retired June 1, 1988, after more than 26 years of active duty. In retirement, he worked as a consultant and as a Materials Manager for Arizona State University West.

Larry is active in his parish, serving as President of the Parish Council, Chairman of the Finance Committee, Eucharistic Minister, and Minister of the Word. He has served as a board member and Vice President of the Arizona Fraternal Congress, and as a board member and President of Arizona Radio Family Rosary. He is currently State Chairman for the Arizona Rosary Celebration.

He joined the Knights of Columbus in 1959 and has belonged to several different councils over the years. After moving to Arizona, he joined Council 7114 in Glendale. Over the years, he has served in council, assembly, state, regional, and supreme offices including: Grand Knight, Faithful Navigator, Vice-Supreme Master of the John H. Reddin Province, District Deputy, State Deputy, Supreme Warden, Supreme Master of the Fourth Degree. He has been a member of all four degree teams and is a Conferring Officer for the Third Degree. In October 2010 he was invested in the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulcher of Jerusalem.

Larry Costanzo exemplifies every precept of the Knights of Columbus: patriotism; service to the church; a husband and father to his family; and is a fraternal example to his brother Knights of Columbus. For these and many other reasons he was named as class honoree for this group of newly installed Knights.

On the September 11, I had the honor to represent the Arizona State Council at a 9-11 memorial mass and event in Nogales. It was well attended by local Knights and members of several branches of the military, and many local civic leaders. On 9-11 we know that many of the victims had little choice, but personal sacrifices of those first responders who had a choice, yet still went into the crippled buildings hoping to save just one life, and the many who ultimately lost their own in the process they are the heroes of our time. To them, we should say thank you and God Bless you.

I mentioned before that Knights can influence public policy at the ballot box. This November there will be an election. How you vote is up to you. However, as Catholics we have an obligation to uphold the sanctity of life, the sacrament of marriage, and true family values. On October 13, 2018 from 8 a.m. to Noon at the Phoenix Diocesan Pastoral Center. the Phoenix. lay Diocese of several organizations, and the Knights of Columbus will sponsor Catholics in the Public Square. This event is designed to help us understand our civic and Catholic obligations and how best to promote them so that those we elect to office will mirror our values and represent our constituency in public office. Remember, the Knights of Columbus does not support any particular political position or party affiliation. As Knights, however, we can and must publicly support the "Five Non-negotiables." They are: abortion, euthanasia, fetal stem cell research, human cloning, and the redefinition of marriage. As you study the candidates for office and the issues, see which measure up to our standard, then vote your conscience. As Knights of Columbus, we will always support our priests and our Bishops. We will always uphold the sanctity of life. We will always support the Sacrament of Marriage between one man and one woman. We will always lead and guide our families in accordance with Church doctrine.



Knights of Columbus Marian Prayer Program

Our Lady of Help of Persecuted Christians

Every couple of years, the Knights of Columbus introduces a new Marian Prayer Program. The new Marian image then makes a pilgrimage through each state or jurisdiction, with councils hosting a prayer service at their parish or other venues. The 2018-2019 Marian Prayer Program presents the 18th Marian image sponsored by the Knights of Columbus, this time of Our Lady Help of Persecuted Christians. Since its inception in 1979, the Knights of Columbus' Marian Prayer Program has held more than 166,900 local council and parish prayer services with some 20 million participants. This year, the prayer service is intended to raise awareness of the plight of Christians persecuted for their faith and to stand in prayerful solidarity with them.

Tom Kalisz, State Deputy for the Knights of Columbus in Arizona will provide one of images he has been given for this program to the Arizona Rosary Celebration. The image will be on display in both Tucson and Phoenix during the Rosary celebrations in October. Prayer for Vocations



We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.




Prayer for Our Priests




Novena Prayer - Pray once for nine consecutive days

In 1985, the Knights of Columbus joined the Legion of Mary as primary co-sponsors to Rosary Sunday; with the continued cooperation of many organizations. In 2006, the Knights of Columbus became sole primary sponsor with the close cooperation and assistance of the Legion of Mary.

An impressive and colorful highlight of the annual Rosary event is the Blessing Procession, which includes over 1,000 participants from organizations, families and ethnic groups throughout the Diocese. Bishops, priests and religious have played a vital role in the yearly October Rosary event. The encouragement and support of Most Reverend Thomas J. O'Brien and Most Reverend Thomas J. Please be aware that you may have one or more eMembers looking to join your council. You can find their contact information on the Supreme website's Officers On-Line page. Look for the tab marked "View Assigned Prospects" in the area of your council reports.

You can now find, track and transfer Online Members in Officers Online. If your council accepts that member's application for transfer, they can complete the transfer process without submitting a Form 100. After the eMember attends his Admissions Degree, all you have to do enter the member's first degree date in Officers Online. If men who join online say they want to join a council, please don't make them wait! Let's make sure we make it happen. Remember you council will receive credit and count towards Star Council goals for a new member when transferring an eMember in to your council. Please contact the eMember(s) as soon as possible and invite them to join your council!

Transferring Online Members

Online Members "assigned" as prospects to councils will appear in the council's Prospect tab in Officers Online. This tab will only be seen by grand knights and financial secretaries. Councils will not have an "Unassigned" tab.

Once the council has gone through the admissions process, and the member has taken his First Degree, they can transfer him by simply adding the date read in the "Grand Knight Approval (Date Read)" section, and the First Degree date in the "Financial Secretary (Ceremonial Date)" section, and clicking the update button. These two dates can be added separately, but once the First Degree date is added, the transfer will be processed.

Once the update is submitted, the member will be automatically transferred into his new council. The council will not need to submit a Form 100. Remember: councils will receive a +1 membership quota credit when an Online Member converts into their council. If the Online Member is an insurance client, the council will also receive a +1 insurance quota credit for member.

Rejecting Transfers

If, for some reason, the Online Member is not going to transfer into the assigned council, the council may "reject" the member by clicking "reject" and selecting a reason from the dropdown menu.

State Retention Chairman – Leonard Rheaume – NCDVD Attendee Transport Report

The 2018 National Conference of Diocesan Vocation Directors was hosted by the Phoenix Diocese.

Attendees were scheduled to arrive between Thursday September 13 and Tuesday September 18, 2018.

Fr. Paul Sullivan, Vocations Director for the Phoenix Diocese, with Bishop Olmstead's blessing, requested assistance from the Knights of Columbus with transportation of the attendees from Phoenix Sky Harbor Airport to the Hyatt Regency in Scottsdale, which would include Priests, Deacons, Nuns and Lay persons from the entire United States, Canada and Mexico. The one-way distance was 18 miles.

After an initial meeting with Fr. Sullivan, SD Tom Kalisz, IPSD Sean Halpain and myself, a plan was formed, and a request was sent out through the appropriate District Deputies in the Phoenix area.

The request was for drivers and escorts from various councils in the Phoenix area. The idea being that a two-person team could, after being advised to come to the terminal for pickup, drop the escort in the baggage claim area while the driver would wait in the designated cell phone parking lot. Once the escort had collected the passengers, there may be one, two, three or in a few cases four passengers to be collected for a run to the conference site. The driver would drop the passengers at the conference and return for another load, approximately a one-hour roundtrip. The plan was to have a coordinator (myself) in the terminals, as well as an assistant which would allow us to cover two terminals simultaneously. The attendees were instructed to text the coordinator upon arrival in Phoenix. With two knights in the terminals to direct the attendees to the baggage claim area, the passengers could be collected in a common area to minimize delays in their transport.

The Diocese Vocations office, particularly Ms. Margo Gonzalez, was instrumental in making a list of attendees that included the date of arrival, airline flight number, arrival time, name, cell phone, email address and home city. This allowed us to judge when and which terminal they would arrive at and group the arrivals, so the drivers could be scheduled properly.

Through a six-day period, the knights transported nearly 150 attendees by making approximately 70 round trips which totals a staggering 2500 miles, and over 250-man hours not counting commuting from home to the airport.

A total of 35 knights and their wives participated in this mission. They represented the following councils; 4339, 11738, 9312, 16277, 10062, 15497, 13836, 13286, 13779, and 11675.

Formation and Knighthood Degree Schedule

The next 2nd and 3rd Degree Exemplification are a follows:

October 2018 – Program Spotlight: Marian Icon Prayer Program (KOFC.ORG/marianprogram)

A Higher Purpose

Spread devotion to Our Lady and pray for our brothers and sisters of faith who are at risk around the world through the Marian Icon Prayer Program. As the new Marian Icon is brought on pilgrimage through the jurisdiction, councils will host the Our Lady Help of Persecuted Christians Icon for a prayer service at their parish.

Overview

The 2018-2019 Marian Icon Prayer Program presents the 18th Marian Icon sponsored by the Knights of Columbus. Like its predecessors, the program features a Marian image, this time of Our Lady Help of Persecuted Christians. Each Knights of Columbus jurisdiction receives several Marian images, which serve as the centerpieces for prayer services conducted in churches and council meeting places throughout the Order for the duration of the initiative. This year, the prayer service is intended to raise awareness of the plight of Christians persecuted for their faith and to stand in prayerful solidarity with them.

Chairman Role and Responsibilities

- Work with your pastor and the jurisdiction Marian Icon Prayer Program chairman to obtain their recommendations and to plan for the event.
- Identify council and parish members to fulfill the various roles required in the service.
- Order supplies through Supplies Online, the supply ordering portal available on Officers Online.
- Promote the event!
- Ensure that the Icon is successfully received by your council and handed to the next council.
- In partnership with your council Christian Refugee Relief chairman, consider planning an event in conjunction with your prayer service.
- Complete and submit all associated reporting forms to the Supreme Council Department of Fraternal Mission.

November 2018 – Program Spotlight: Family Full Alive (KOFC-AZ.ORG – Programs – Faith In Action)

A Higher Purpose

Help families place God and the Catholic faith at the center of their lives, year-round. Using the Family Fully Alive Booklet as a devotional guide, this program provides monthly themes, reflections, meditations, and group projects.

Overview

During his visit to the Philippines, Pope Francis cited the need for "holy and loving families to protect the beauty and truth of the family in God's plan and to be an example for other families" (Pope Francis, Address to Families at the Mall of Asia Arena, 2015). The Family Fully Alive monthly devotions are concrete ways that Knights of Columbus, in solidarity with Pope Francis, can support the growth of holy and loving families in the Church.

The Family Fully Alive Program asks families to invite God into their homes and cultivates each family as a miniature domestic church. To this end, the program provides monthly themes, scripture verses and activities. Through prayer and reflection, each family has the opportunity to grow in holiness together. This is a flexible program that can be started at any time of the year and continues year-round. Councils will order physical booklets to distribute or direct parish families to program resources on kofc.org, all available at no cost.

Chairman Role and Responsibilities

- Working with your pastor, obtain his permission and recommendations on promoting Family Fully Alive in your parish and community.
- Plan and carry out an awareness campaign for the Family Fully Alive Program in your parish and community.
- Complete and submit all associated reporting forms to the Supreme Council Department of Fraternal Mission.







December 2018 - Program Spotlight: Food for Families (KOFC-AZ.ORG - Programs - Faith In Action)

A Higher Purpose

Help end hunger in communities across North America. Many in our communities are struggling through hardship and unable to provide food to their families. The goal of Food for Families is to ensure that as few as possible go to bed hungry each night. A featured program, Food for Families counts for two credits toward the Columbian Award.

Overview

Knights of Columbus are committed to helping end hunger through the Food for Families Program which has donated millions of dollars and millions of pounds of food toward this end. Council and parish families will raise funds to support their local food pantries, food banks and soup kitchens. For every \$500 or 1,000 pounds of food donated, the Supreme Council will refund \$100 back to the council – up to a maximum of \$500 per council per fraternal year. Though in-kind donation of food is valuable, leaders of hunger-relief organizations often comment that financial contributions can be stretched even further and allow nonprofits to procure the exact items needed by the organization and its clients.

Chairman Role and Responsibilities

- Set an annual goal for your Food for Families Program.
- Conduct various events in your parish and community in order to reach your goal!
- Promote each event in your parish and larger community through a variety of efforts.
- Ensure that the proper procedures are followed in order to receive the refund for your council.
- Complete and submit all associated reporting forms to the Supreme Council Department of Fraternal Mission.

January 2019 – Program Spotlight: Ultrasound Initiative(KOFC-AZ.ORG – Programs – Faith In Action)

A Higher Purpose

Save lives by help each abortion-minded woman to choose life by viewing their unborn children on ultrasound machines at pro-life pregnancy centers. This initiative is funded by Knights of Columbus state and local councils with matching grants from the Supreme Council's Culture of Life Fund.

Overview

The Knights of Columbus works together as an organization to purchase ultrasound machines for qualifying pregnancy centers. After the state and/or local council raises 50% of the cost, the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council will provide the other 50% to complete funding for purchase of an ultrasound. Or, if the council raises 100% of the cost of a vehicle outfitted to serve as a mobile medical unit for a pregnancy center, the Supreme Council will provide 100% of the funds for an ultrasound machine to be used in that vehicle.

Featured Program Requirements

Councils are required to identify a Pregnancy Center in need of an ultrasound machine that meets the requirements listed on the *Diocesan Evaluation* (#10715). Upon approval from the Supreme Council, a council raises 50% of the cost of the ultrasound machine. The council must then follow the published guidelines for obtaining the remaining 50% from the Supreme Council. Qualification for this program will be determined from the information provided on both the *Diocesan Evaluation* (#10715) and the *Ultrasound Application* (#10716).

At the start of every fraternal year, it has become a long-standing custom in Arizona that the State Deputy introduces a new State Pin and logo design. During the recent organizational meeting, State Deputy Tom Kalisz told the attendees, "This year's pin design is meant to be a visual, daily reminder, of what we stand for and the depth of our commitment to serve God, our parishes, and our neighbors."

Around the outer edge of the pin and logo design we find the guiding principles of the Order: Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism. They remind us of who we are as Knights of Columbus and what we do.

Within the circle, an image of the State of Arizona is found at the center, emblazoned with the Emblem of the Order. This represents the Arizona State Council and its jurisdictional responsibility for all of the State of Arizona.

This year, the Worthy State Deputy has dedicated his administration to Our Lady of Czestochowa. Her image, painted on a wooden plank, can be traced back to the time just after Christ's death. It eventually found a home in Czestochowa at Jasna Gora ("bright hill") in Poland. It and the people of the region survived strife, marauders, religious persecution, and war. Mary was always there protecting her children. State Deputy Kalisz says that he chose this particular Marion symbol because Our Lady of Czestochowa represents hope and protection from evil and persecution, not just for Polish people, but for all people. Her image is seen above the State of Arizona, showing that we are all under the loving protection of her mantel.

Working under the theme of Faith in Action, the cross is included so that we are reminded that we are all children of God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The cross also symbolizes the gift we received through the death of Jesus Christ – forgiveness of sin and a path to everlasting life.

Finally, included in the lower right portion of the logo are two small baby's feet. These are included to remind us that we must always fight to preserve the sanctity of life from natural conception to natural death.

The Worthy State Deputy says that he hopes that the pin and logo will keep us focused on unity and fraternity as we perform works of charity in service to all.
