Second Half Per Capita Billing: Brothers, The Second Half Per Capita billing was generated on January 10 and has been sent to council Grand Knights and Financial Secretaries. Also send a copy to the District Deputy. Postmark your payment by February 10 to receive the early payment rebate. Remember, Councils must be current on their Per Capita to seat delegates at the State Convention. Thank you to those councils who have already submitted their payment.

Faith in Action Good Friday Family Promotion: As we approach the most sacred times of the year of Lent, Holy Week and Easter, invite your members and fellow parishioners to join you for the Good Friday services at your parish. Bring families into more robust practice and better understanding of our Catholic faith and the Sacred Triduum.

Good Friday is the day when we remember the passion and death of our Lord Jesus Christ, who gave his life for our salvation. It is a day of fasting and abstinence, a day of prayer and reflection, a day of gratitude and love.

Despite Good Friday's central role in the heart of Christianity, attendance at services remains low. In an effort to increase parish attendance and involvement in Good Friday services, councils can conduct a promotional campaign to educate their parishes on the vital importance of Good Friday.

Setting an example for their community, Knights should attend Good Friday services, and actually all the liturgies of the Sacred Triduum; Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil, with their families and work with their pastors to encourage increased parishioner involvement at these liturgies

Your promotional campaign can include the following activities:

- Beginning on Ash Wednesday, promote Good Friday services at Friday Fish Fries and other
 parish and council meetings and events throughout the Lenten season. Distribute flyers
 and posters in the parish and surrounding areas and use social media and other platforms
 to spread the word.
- Ask council members to take direct action and encourage their family and friends to attend Good Friday services. Consider providing council members and the parish community a copy of **Christ: Lord and Savior**, a booklet that helps contemplate who Jesus is and the sacrifices he made for us.
- Request the contact information for elderly, sick or non-driving parishioners from your pastor and assist them in attending the Good Friday services. Offer transportation and companionship to anyone who needs it.
- Prominently display the promotional Horizontal Poster or Vertical Poster in your parish and council meeting location.
- Explain the central nature of Good Friday in your council's bulletin announcements and post articles on your council website and social media pages.

By attending the Good Friday services and supporting the promotional campaign, we will not only deepen our own faith, but also follow the example of our founder, Blessed Father Michael J. McGivney, who was a man of prayer and action, and a man who cared for the spiritual and material needs of his flock.

We hope to see you and your family at the Good Friday services, and we thank you for your promotion of the Liturgies of the Sacred Triduum. May God bless you and your loved ones.


State Council



In Arizona we have 138 Councils, 37 have completed the Safe Environment Program Requirements. As Knights of Columbus, we recognize that all Catholics, including Brother Knights, share the responsibility to protect children and vulnerable persons in and by the Catholic Church. Like the Church, Knights are committed to the protection of children and vulnerable persons. Knowing this, people often ask why every council is not in compliance with Safe Environment Program requirements. When asked this question in July, August, and September I explained that the system Supreme was using was new and we needed to be patient. Then in October, November and December I explained that it was the holidays, but councils were slowly getting it handled. In early January at our Midyear Meeting, it was said that now is the time to get personal. To ask the man that is not in compliance, what needs to happen to complete the training or and or background? We expressed the need to find a new man for the position if that's what was needed. After another month has gone by with little change in the number of compliant councils, it is clear the needed work is not being done. This must change Brothers.

I am asking all councils to make sure your Form 185 and 365 have been submitted to Supreme and all requirements for Safe Environment are completed. I will repeat myself, in Arizona we have 138 Councils, and 37 have completed the Safe Environment Requirements. If you are a Council Officer in one of the 101 non-compliant councils, it's time to step up and do what Knights do. Handle the problem. If you feel there are obstacles preventing you from this, contact your District Deputy or myself for assistance. If your council has completed the requirements or you are pending approval, thank you.

Brother Knights,

There is a campaign by the pro-abortion supporters to gather signatures so that they can put an extreme abortion amendment on the ballot of the 2024 Arizona elections. The abortion amendment is not as advertised. It is an extreme proposition that greatly expands abortion at the cost of the basic health and safety of girls and women. **It Goes Too Far**. The proposed abortion amendment:

- Allows abortions up to the moment of birth
- Forces taxpayers to pay for abortions
- Shuts parents out of their minor daughter's abortion decision
- Removes the required medical doctor, leaving girls and women in the hands of unqualified providers with no training in obstetrics
- Removes safety standards for abortion clinics, leaving women at risk of uterine perforation, infection, hemorrhaging, incomplete abortions, and infertility

This is similar to the amendment that was passed in Ohio. The Ohio voters were lied to, and most voted for it because they did not know what they were voting for. This included 52% of Catholics in the state.

In Arizona, we have a grassroots movement by pro-life advocates, such ourselves, that are working hard to ensure that this amendment does not make it on the ballot. It is the **Decline To Sign** campaign. You can help by spreading the word through your councils, families, and friends. Tell them to decline to sign their initiative, if approached by the pro-abortion people. You can also talk to your pastor and ask to put flyers in the bulletin and make pulpit announcements. We have brochures, business cards, lawn signs in English and Spanish that I can provide to you.

In doing so, we can take proactive measures to stop this proposed constitutional amendment from reaching the 2024 General Election ballot. It is essential that we act now and not wait until it is too late!
