Saturday evening, we honored and remembered one of our former leaders, John Tobin, Past State Deputy. This past year we collected through the Persons With Intellectual Disabilities "Tootsie Roll" drive over \$137,719 for distribution to various non-profit 501(c)3 organizations assisting persons with intellectual disabilities. Special Olympics of Arizona received \$29,876 from this Program.

This year, \$5,018 was donated to the Fisher House that provides comfort homes where military and veteran families can stay free of charge while a loved one is in the hospital.
