By the early 1900s the Crescent Lake area south-east of Yorkton Saskatchewan was home to a number of Métis road allowance families. In the late 1930s the officials of the local rural municipalities began to complain about this congregation of about 150 homeless people living in mud huts and without medical services

As a result of this, Crescent Lake became in Métis Colony established by the Saskatchewan Department of Social Welfare and Rehabilitation in the late 1940s. The government moved the number of local Métis "Road Allowance" people to Crescent Lake, located just south of Yorkton. The government purchased this land from the land allotment of the Little Bone reserve based on the understanding that the Indian children would also attend the Crescent Lake School (which they did later). The government and the church conspired to move the Métis people off the land, some to Lebret and other colonies, in the name of progress. In the fall of 1946 Crescent Lake was the site of the first Métis school in Saskatchewan, Allary School. It had an initial enrolment of 48 to 52 students. Interestingly it was not built and run by the Department of Education, but rather it was a project of the Department of Social Welfare and Rehabilitation. In 1966 the school closed down with the encouragement of Roman Catholic priests and the people moved to Yorkton and other towns seeking employment. When the people had left Myles Pelletier says that Father Dales enlisted the help of kids and pulling down the log homes with his truck. They later burnt the people's homes.

²Bredenbury and Kensington Lake School Districts
In 1904, east of the existing town of Bredenbury, a country school was established and named Bredenbury SD #1083. In 1911, the town decided they did not want the school a mile outside of town, so the country school was closed down in 1912 and the town of Bredenbury built a school in town, forming Bredenbury Village SD# 1186. The country school stayed closed for 6 years, but in 1918 the building was moved and reopened as Kensington Lake SD#1083.

3Chastworth School District

In 1955 the area was expecting an increase in enrolment. To accommodate, a second school was moved into the southern part of the district, taking in student from Pennock, Rothbury and Chatsworth districts. Interesting note, Durham was the original name chosen before establishing the district.

*Countryside School This K-9 school was formed in 1974 by the Mennonite community and is still in full operation as of 2019.

This district was formed when the two districts on either side (Meadowvale and Grahame) were too large when the boundaries for school districts were assessed later on. The district decided against building a school and the students were bussed to Saltcoats School.
