
ATONEMENT IN ACTION

Holy Week at Atonement

Journey with us through the events during the last week of Jesus' life – from the gates of Jerusalem, to the Upper Room, to the foot of the cross, to the empty tomb!

Palm Sunday/Sunday of the Passion ♦ March 24, 10:00 a.m.

We wave palms in celebration today as Christ comes into our midst, then we follow with trepidation as his path leads to the cross.

Maundy Thursday ♦ March 28, 7:00 p.m.

We remember Christ's last meal with his disciples, but our central focus is his commandment to give and receive love in humble service to one another, embodied by Jesus as he washed the disciples' feet.

Good Friday ♦ March 29, 7:00 p.m.

Life and death stand side by side as we enter into Good Friday, joining the disciples at the foot of the cross.

Easter Vigil ♦ March 30, 7:30 p.m.

Together with Common Ground Recovery Community in Lundin Hall, we gather around fire, word, water, bread, and cup, proclaiming through story and song that ours is a God who continuously brings life out of death.

Worship for Sundays in March

Third Sunday in Lent ♦ March 3—10:00 AM ♦ the Rev. Katie Lyon

The third covenant in this year's Lenten readings is the central one of Israel's history: the gift of the law to those God freed from slavery.

The commandments begin with the statement that because God alone has freed us from the powers that oppressed us, we are to let nothing else claim first place in our lives. When Jesus throws the merchants out of the temple, he is defending the worship of God alone and rejecting the ways commerce and profit-making can become our gods.

The Ten Commandments are essential to our baptismal call: centered first in God's liberating love, we strive to live out justice and mercy in our communities and the world.

Fourth Sunday in Lent, Bear Creek Camp ♦ March 10 10:00 AM ♦ Kaitlyn Blend, preaching, the Rev. Art Wyse, presiding

The fourth of the Old Testament promises providing a baptismal lens this Lent is the promise God makes to Moses: those who look on the bronze serpent will live. In today's gospel Jesus says he will be lifted up on the cross like the serpent, so that those who look to him in faith will live. When we receive the sign of the cross in baptism, that cross becomes the sign we can look to in faith for healing, for restored relationship to God, for hope when we are dying.

Fifth Sunday in Lent ♦ March 17

10:00 AM ♦ Seminarian April Mulvey preaching, the Rev. Katie Lyon presiding

God promises Jeremiah that a "new covenant" will be made in the future: a covenant that will allow all the people to know God by heart. The church sees this promise fulfilled in Christ, who draws all people to himself when he is lifted up on the cross. Our baptismal covenant draws us to God's heart through Christ and draws God's love and truth into our hearts. We join together in worship, sharing in word, song, and meal, and leave strengthened to share God's love with all the world.

Sunday of the Passion/Palm Sunday ♦ March 24—10:00 AM ♦ the Rev. Katie Lyon

This week, the center of the church's year, is one of striking contrasts: Jesus rides into Jerusalem surrounded by shouts of glory, only to be left alone to die on the cross, abandoned by even his closest friends. Mark's gospel presents Jesus in his complete human vulnerability: agitated, grieved, scared, forsaken. Though we lament Christ's suffering and all human suffering, we also expect God's salvation: in the wine and bread, Jesus promises that his death will mark a new covenant with all people. We enter this holy week thirsty for the completion of God's astonishing work.

Resurrection of our Lord: Easter Sunday ◆ March 31 NEW TIMES: 9:30 AM & 11:00 AM ◆ the Rev. Katie Lyon

Christ is risen! Jesus is alive, and God has swallowed up death forever. With Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, we may feel astonished and confused, unsure of what to make of the empty tomb. But this is why we gather: to proclaim, witness, praise, and affirm the liberating reality of Christ's death and resurrection.

In word and feast, we celebrate God's unending love, and depart to share this good news with all the world. Alleluia!



We postpone or avoid completing an advance directive/living will, choosing a power of attorney (POA), organizing our finances and estate, discussing funeral arrangements.

- 3. legal concerns (will, trusts, power of attorney, etc.)
- 4. financial planning and organization
- 5. funeral options and planning
- 6. document organization
- 7. spiritual discussion

- Preschool will be closed March 25-April 1 for Spring Break.








