Will You Join Me for a Summer Book Study?

Starting later this month, I invite you to join me in reading and discussing the book, UNCLOBBER: Rethinking Our Misuse of the Bible on Homosexuality, by Colby Martin.

As you may know, we held two adult forum sessions this spring to learn about the LGBTQIA+ acronym and how it explains the diversity of sexual orientation and gender identity people experience. As a follow-up to those discussions, I promised to gather us for a book



study to look at the Biblical passages often referenced when exploring how our faith understands diversity in these areas. UNCLOBBER is the book I talked about. In 6-sessions we will dig into the "clobber passages", those verses often used to condemn people. We will examine the context and the language of these texts and discover how we might "unclobber" them and begin to see them differently. We will also hear the author's story of being a pastor serving an evangelical church whose study of scripture led him to new understandings of God's Word.

I hope you will join me on Wednesday mornings from 10:30-Noon on:

May 24, June 7, June 21, July 12, July 26, and August 9 in the Gathering Place at Galilee.

I look forward to being with you in this journey.





METeam May Newsletter

Your METeam is continuing to assemble the many pieces of information required for the Ministry Survey Profile (MSP). To expedite this research and analysis, we've divided ourselves into two teams. One team is exploring the External issues; the other team is exploring the Internal issues. The two teams will regularly meet as a single group to review our results and continue our preparation of the MSP. May is congregation survey



month! Each week you'll find an insert in your bulletin asking you to answer two or three questions about your thoughts, hopes, and dreams regarding your faith journey and the future of Galilee. We look forward to your input and to sharing those responses with you each following week.

On May 7th we invite you to join us at the Adult Education Forum as we update you on our progress. It will be a good opportunity to answer your questions. This month we will also be asking selected Pewaukee leaders about community needs and how Galilee might help meet those needs. Our External team will be inviting members of our congregation to join in reaching out to Pewaukee leaders.

At the Telling the Story history event on March 18th, people were asked to reflect on the timeline we created together and then to name insights or patterns that emerge for them. Once we listed what everyone offered, participants were asked to vote for the three most important statements they feel we need to pay attention to as we continue in our transition process. The top 5 vote-getting statements were:

- 1. The church flourished with a strong pastor.
- 2. Children/youth are important to us and we are aware that we struggle to support this ministry area.
- 3. There has been diminishing interaction with the external community over time.
- 4. When we have a need money-wise, we always fill it.
- 5. Music Ministry is important to us.

Our METeam will keep these in mind as we continue our work. To follow-up on #1, Pastor Jennifer will be leading an adult forum on May 14th to explore the role of a pastor and what makes a strong pastor for Galilee. As congregations might define it differently, it will be important to understand what it means for us.

The MET Team wants to thank the Leadership Board for providing a copy of the Vitality Survey to the members of the MET Team. We have reviewed the results as a group and will utilize the pertinent information to help us complete our MSP. Again, thank you to all 82 members who participated and provided this valuable feedback.

We thank each one of you for your help with our MET processes. Your participation in each of the various activities is vital to preparation of a thorough and honest "picture" of Galilee, our goals, and our pastoral needs. We ask you to continue to pray with us and for us as we seek God's guidance with this important work.

May Update from the Leadership Board

Just catching you up on what the Leadership Board has been focusing on in April:

- As noted in March, Cori Ryta had chosen to step down from her role on the Leadership Board. Luckily for Galilee, Cori is focusing her efforts and time for Galilee as our Worship Volunteer Scheduler as well as continuing her role on the Worship Committee. In April, the Leadership Board asked Mary Dehler to take Cori's place and Mary has accepted. We are all very excited to have Mary join us as she is already jumping in with both feet. Please join us in welcoming Mary and appreciating the talents she will bring.
- Another key focus for April has been the Leadership Retreat for the board members and coordinators.
 The retreat is scheduled for April 29th and will last the better part of the day. We are looking forward to getting to know one another a bit better as well as to review how Galilee's Discipleship model is working within our Congregation. More to come on this following the retreat. The Leadership Board is grateful for Pastor Jennifer's leadership on this retreat and for all of the coordinators for committing to this time.
- Galilee's roof is aging and will need replacement. The Leadership Board has asked a group of Galileans to
 head up a committee to contact potential contractors and to start the process of collecting bids for this
 project. Many thanks to Nick Riegert, Jim Hagen, Bill Rudolph and Tom Drover for agreeing to serve on
 this committee. This will be a big capital project, both in terms of the work required and the funds
 needed. You can expect to hear more on this as this project develops.
- Over the last few months we have been discussing the importance of technology in our worship space. We are learning that live streaming of worship services can be an important tool in terms of keeping and attracting members. We are currently evaluating what this may look like for Galilee. We want to thank Ron DeBlaey who has completed this type of project before and is helping to guide us in this evaluation.
- In April, during the Treasurer's Report, we took a fresh look at the memorial gifts and other special donations made to Galilee that are represented in our monthly financials. Many of these funds/accounts are quite old (counted in years) and in many instances there are newer accounts set-up for the same purpose. With that in mind, and with guidance from our Financial Secretary and Treasurer, we voted to merge some of the funds in an effort to clean up the financials.

One thing that you may not be aware of is that all of the past minutes from Leadership Board meetings are available at Galilee and may be viewed by any congregational member. While the point of this update is to give you an idea of what business is occurring, if you wish more details please feel free to review the minutes of our meetings. Help Serve Dinner to People Experiencing Housing & Food Insecurity



Pewaukee Interchurch Lay Council/Pewaukee Food Pantry is located in the lower level of Gethsemane United Methodist Church. About 200 families a month are served by the food pantry. Because of the current economic conditions, the number of families needing assistance is growing. Each week we distribute 250-300 cans of soup and vegetables, 50-75 cans of fruit, 50 boxes of

cereal, 100 cans of tuna, 50 boxes of pasta, etc. We find that during the extended-summer season – from May through October – is the most difficult time for us to keep food on our shelves.
