Blankets will be available during and after worship. Stay a while and tie a lot or pause a moment and tie one knot. Every set of hands and every knot move us forward in finishing as many blankets as possible. My personal goal for us is to complete 20 blankets, but I will be thrilled with whatever we are able to finish.

Leadership Updates

METeam July News

As expected, June has been a very busy and productive month for your METeam. Both our Internal and External subcommittees have finished their research and are now in the process of digesting and analyzing all this information. During most of July, we will be starting to fill in the basic information required for completion of the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). Some items of our research stand out.

Our greater Pewaukee area is comprised of three areas: the lake community, the Village of Pewaukee, and the City of Pewaukee. As these communities are becoming more affluent, housing is expected to become a greater issue. The quality of the schools is a major draw for both existing and new families. The Pewaukee area leaders feel that a strong sense of community is an important attribute of our community.

Our fellow parishioners also strongly believe that a sense of community and family is an important attribute of Galilee. We love our worship services and especially value strong sermons that guide us in our prayer and faith as we seek God's guidance in our daily lives. We treasure all of the music during worship services including our vocal choir, bell choir, soloists and instrumentalists. We like a variety of liturgies and enjoy lots of congregational singing. We feel it is important that we include children and youth in our services and in our programs.

The METeam thanks you again for taking part in all the opportunities that we have offered as we assemble our information. It is extremely important that the MSP accurately reflects both the congregation that we are and the congregation we want to become. Leadership Board

Here are some thoughts from the Leadership Board:

As I've shared previously, back in April we had a Leadership Retreat with the Leadership Board and Galilee's Ministry Coordinators. This was a very productive time and a number of good conversations and items came out of that time together. One clear item that came out was a need to review and possibly redefine our Mission and Vision statements. The current statements were developed more than 20 years ago and a discussion on how they fit Galilee's ministry today is being had. With the METeam, the Leadership Board will be having meetings coming up on July 24th and 31st. These will be longer (upwards of 3 hours) meetings where we will be gathering to consider updating these statements. From this time together, we hope to find focus and to develop where our energies need to be pointed. Most importantly, we will be considering where God and Jesus are directing us and we are hopeful to discern where we see God's vision at Galilee. Our goal following these meetings will be re-affirm or to have developed updated statements. If you have thoughts on this I would ask you to please share those with members of the Leadership Board or METeam.

I know many of you have noted the educational opportunities around the topic of the LGBTQIA+ communities that are occurring. Some may be wondering why these conversations are happening. There is a point to them and that is related to the Pastoral Call Process. When the Leadership Board first talked to the Synod shortly after Pastor Jay announced his retirement, we were told about the call process and that Galilee will be asked if we would ask the Synod to screen out LGBTQIA+ Pastors who otherwise would match our Ministry Site Profile. Our thought is to give our congregation a chance to learn and reflect biblically and missionally on issues surrounding those who identify as LGBTQIA+ so that we can come to an answer that we believe is faithful to how God is working through Galilee into its next chapter of ministry. From a timing perspective, we will need to have an answer on this, ideally, towards the end of September in order to provide an answer to the Bishop by mid-October. You can expect to hear more discussion on this in the coming months. For now, I would ask everyone to please keep an open mind and listen, as a whole, to what we're saying to each other on this topic. In the end, the decision we make may be yes, no, or we're not there yet but we're working on getting there.

We're still working on a number of other initiatives that I've shared earlier with you, including the roof replacement project, offering live streaming of our services, the development of a Financial Ministry Team and important work on the Stewardship Team. I expect that you will see updates on some, if not all, of these projects soon. One item to note with regards to the live streaming project is that we will likely re-arrange the Sanctuary. For many years the Sanctuary has been configured as you see it currently at Worship but the space and furniture were designed with various configuration options available. The current view is not ideal for video recording so we're going to revisit this and try out a new configuration in July (potentially early July). We will be anxious to hear your reactions.

There have been a fair number of changes happening at Galilee. It is our hope that change is occurring to better meet the needs of our Congregation. I think it's safe to say that in the next few months we'll see many of the current conversations start to gel and coalesce. It should be an exciting time!

The most feared word in the church?

In our journey with Jesus we are called to be good stewards, caretakers of the things and the values of God. Too often we have reduced stewardship to talking about financial giving. Money is a matter of good stewardship, but good stewardship is so much broader and deeper than money.

All that we have is a gift from God. We enter this world with nothing and a caring person will wrap us in a swaddling cloth soon after our birth. We leave this world with nothing, except perhaps the clothes chosen for our burial. Everything in between is a gift from God. How we manage (or steward) these gifts is a matter of our faith and discipleship.

I am looking to gather a team of people here at Galilee to create a wholistic, biblical plan for stewardship that will invite us to strengthen our witness and deepen our walk with Christ, individually and together. Would you consider being a part of team like this for one year? If so, please let me know at your earliest convenience. I hope to have a first gathering with you all some time in July.

Pewaukee Interchurch Lay Council/Pewaukee Food Pantry is located in the lower level of Gethsemane United Methodist Church. About 200 families a month are served by the food pantry. Because of the current economic conditions, the number of families needing assistance is growing. Each week we distribute 250-300 cans of soup and vegetables, 50-75 cans of fruit, 50 boxes of cereal, 100 cans of tuna, 50 boxes of pasta, etc. We find that during the extended-summer season – from May through October – is the most difficult time for us to keep food on our shelves. El Salvador Ministry Team

Do You Know?

Since 2006, Galilee has been in partnership with a small church located in a rural community just outside of San Salvador, the capital city of El Salvador. Our Partner Church is called El Renacer de Los Martires, which in English means "The Return of the Martyrs" or "The Rebirth of the Martyrs." The community where this church is located is called La Comunidad de Mosenor Romero, which in English means "The Community of Monsenor Romero."

Monsenor Romero is one of the best known and beloved Christian figures in Salvadoran history. He was a very popular church leader during the 1960s and 1970s, and ultimately became the Archbishop of El Salvador in 1977. His ministry focused on serving the poor. He also spoke out against social injustice, including the political torture and assassinations that were occurring in El Salvador at that time.

Galilee's "Sister Church" partnership with El Renacer de Los Martires was formed pursuant to a covenant signed in September of 2006. The Pastor at our partner church is Pastor Martir. Through monetary donations from Galilee members, we have provided electricity and a new roof for the church, a fence around the church property, and a Sunday School building for the children. We have also offered resources for worship and education, including teaching materials, technology resources, hymnals, and bibles to assist Pastor Martir in his ministry. Most recently, through some generous donations, we are providing new ceramic tiling for the church and Sunday School buildings. That tiling is currently being installed.

There have been many Galilee delegation visits to El Salvador over the life of the partnership. During those visits, Galilee members worship, share fellowship and conversation, listen to the needs of the community, share meals, and provide support in the Principle of Accompaniment. In short, we come together and build relationships.

Each year, we are pleased to assist with funds for backpacks, school supplies, and socks for the children in the community, many of whom walk quite a distance through fields and over dirt roads to get to the local school. We also provide funds for annual church celebrations, including a Christmas party, a Mothers' Day celebration, and annual celebrations honoring the birthday of our Partner Church and the life of Archbishop Romero.

If you already knew all this, great! If this information is new to you, that's great too! We welcome providing you with opportunities to learn more.

Over the next few months, you will be hearing more about the El Salvador partnership and how you could become involved.
