How does Awards Nomination process work?

- 1. Make sure business meets nomination criteria
- 2. Choose a category A business can only be nominated in one category.
- 3. Prepare nomination
- 4. Submit nomination by December 7, 2023 at 3:00 pm central

Nominators can submit multiple nominations! We encourage it!

Who can submit nominations?

- · Individuals can self-nominate
- An organization that assists small businesses in the U.S (SBA employees <u>cannot</u> submit nominations)

Small Business Award Eligibility

Any legal resident of the United States or its territories who owns and operates or who bears principal responsibility for operating a small business for a minimum of **three years** <u>and</u> has received **at least one type of SBA assistance** such as, but not limited to:

- An SBA loan
- SCORE counseling
- Small Business Development Center (SBDC) assistance
- Veteran's Business Outreach Center (VBOC) assistance
- Women's Business Center (WBC) assistance
- Government contracting assistance
- Disaster assistance
- Emerging Leaders initiative/THRIVE
- Boots to Business training

Exception: Start Up Owned - Operating a small business with no more than two years in business

Do they fit the eligibility statement without question?

Do they have supporting documentation to help paint the picture for the judges?

3. Share

Share examples of community service-- How did the small business owner give back to the community?

Share success stories, quotes from local representatives, politicians, customers, reviews, media, etc.

Demonstrate why they are best in industry

4. Submit a complete package

If using a previous nomination package, make sure to update with current information

Include all required forms, the photo and supporting documents

Submit electronically by the deadline!

Deadline

- Nominations are due to the St. Louis District Office via Box.com no later than December 7, 2023 at 3:00pm CT
- Nominations will only be accepted electronically via Box.com
- Every form MUST be filled out completely.

Who selects the winner?

- Winners at any level will be selected by a panel of six judges
- All judges will sign a non-disclosure agreement
