## February Meeting Mental Magic Night

Our February meeting featured the branch of magic that creates the illusion of mind reading. The evening included both performances and explanations of some classic effects in both mentalism and what would better be called mental magic.

Club President **Dave Arch** kicked things off by getting our group interacting with one another after handing out a Discover Magic packet trick called *Funny Fortune Teller*. We were given time to study the instructions and then found a partner to take turns performing the simple effect for each other. While it was a children's magic trick, the principle is used in many forms and was a great warm up for the evening to come.



Next up our own **David Fox, the Midwest Mentalist**, who performed and taught an entertaining version of the 8 Card Brainwave.

**Steve Nespor** shared an idea for mind reading magic with children using equivoque, three paper bags and an eight-foot straw.

**Tom Neddo** showed us a stage filling, multiple-participant version of the Truth Teller and Liar plot. He showed us how six volunteers could be used in a simple, direct handling of the premise.

Newcomer **Aleister Knight** shared a Torn Corner to Impossible Location that he then walked us through and first-timer **Dan Castagnoli** performed his favorite pet trick, Card Warp.

The evening concluded with a brief discussion proposed OMS Constitution changes. Members received copies of the changes to be voted on by members next month. - **Steve Nespor**

Her many talents seem to run in the family; her brother is **The Amazing Arthur**, an Omaha magician. In 1998, he bought her a magic kit that began her journey into adding magic to her repertoire. Under **Arthur's** tutelage via phone, **Penelope** put on her first show at Kirkland Air Force Base in New Mexico, where she lived at the time. Yes, believe it, she learned an entire magic show practicing by phone with her brother!

**Penelope's** interest in magic continued while living in Norwich, England, where she joined two magic clubs! Those English magicians were real task-masters, teaching their European style and techniques. They expected practice in return and, although it was a lot of work, **Penelope** met the challenge and learned many new skills.

When **Penelope** returned to the states, joining the Omaha Magical Society was a natural fit for her. She has been a member of the club for twelve years. **Penelope** told me how indebted and thankful she is for the support she received early on and continues to experience from our members. Two mentors really stand out from her first few years attending meetings. She is indebted to **Peter The Near Great**, for taking her under his wing. **Jeff Quinn** welcomed her to the group and proceeded to give her several of his tricks and helped her learn them.

Adding balloon tricks and art to her shows really took her to a new level and **Poppin' Penelope** was born.

Currently, she maintains a full-time career with family friendly shows at county fairs, and company and other private events where she also performs mentalism and hypnosis.



But the pinnacle of her many talents just might be highlighted in an exciting new juggling, comedy, escape show that she and her fiancé and juggler, **Peter Brunette**, are creating. In the footsteps of Houdini, she will perform Metamorphosis. **Denny Rourke** sold her his custom-made escape box for that routine and has assisted her with that difficult trick. Also, **David Arch** has been instrumental with the rope and other important elements and props for her upside-down, straight jacket routine, rope escape from 20 feet high!

**Poppin' Penelope** must maintain great physical strength and mental stamina for her shows. **Penelope Fratelli** exudes enthusiasm and energy for her profession. It was so interesting interviewing her for this article. She is a true Renaissance woman.


