



# Program

### **Unfinished Symphony No. 8 B minor**

- Franz Schubert

This Symphony is a musical composition that Schubert started in 1822 but left with only two movements—though he lived for another six years. To this day, musicologists still disagree as to why Schubert failed to complete the symphony. Some have speculated that he stopped work in the middle of the scherzo in the fall of 1822 because he associated it with an illness, or that he was distracted by the inspiration for his Wanderer Fantasy for solo piano, which occupied his time and energy during that time.

### West Side Story Selections for Orchestra

- Leonard Bernstein - Arr. by Jack Mason

Inspired by William Shakespeare's play Romeo and Juliet, the story is set in the mid-1950s in the Upper West Side of Manhattan in New York City, then a multiracial, blue-collar neighborhood. The musical explores the rivalry between the Jets and the Sharks, two teenage street gangs of different ethnic backgrounds. The dark theme, sophisticated music, extended dance scenes, tragic love story, and focus on social problems marked a turning point in musical theatre.

#### Mauerische Trauermusik KV 477

- W. A. Mozart

Mozart composed this orchestral work in 1785 in his capacity as a member of the Freemasons. It was performed during a Masonic funeral service held on 17 November 1785 in memory of two of Mozart's Masonic brethren, members of the Viennese aristocracy. The work uses the Gregorian chant psalm-tone

# Program

### **Rhapsody in Blue**

### - George Gershwin, Arr. by J. Brubaker

Rhapsody, 1924, is one of Gershwin's most recognizable creations and a key composition that defined the Jazz Age. Gershwin's piece inaugurated a new era in America's musical history, established Gershwin's reputation as an eminent composer, and eventually became one of the most popular of all concert works.

### Dry Your Tears, Afrika

- John Williams, vocal arr. by Audrey Synder

Inspired by the poem "Dry Your Tears Afrika," by Bernard Dadié (1967). The lyrics are in MENDE a West African language spoken primarily in Liberia and Sierra Leone. This piece is from the movie, **Amistad**, a 1997 historical film based on a mutiny in 1839 by newly captured Mende slaves, who took control of the ship La Amistad off the coast of Cuba, and the international legal battle that followed their capture by a U.S. revenue cutter. It became a United States Supreme Court case of 1841.

#### **Edelweiss**

# - Arr. by Peter Hope, orig. performed by Orquesta Sinfonica De Tenerife

Named after the Edelweiss, a white flower found high in the Alps. The song was created for the 1959 Broadway production of The Sound of Music for the character, Captain Georg von Trapp. This was the final piece of Rodgers and Hammerstein's musical collaboration as well as the last song written by Oscar Hammerstein II, who died in August 1960.

# Symphony No. 9 - Ode to Joy

#### Beethoven

This symphony is regarded by many critics and musicologists as Beethoven's greatest work and one of the supreme achievements in the history of music. One of the best-known works in common practice music, it stands as one of the most frequently performed symphonies in the world. The Ninth was the first example of a major composer using voices in a symphony. Most of the lyrics are from the poem, *Ode to Joy by F. Schiller, 1785*.
