Procession of the Sardar

- Mikhail Ippolitov-Ivanov

The final movement of the Caucasian Sketches, Suite No.

1, Procession of the Sardar, is often heard by itself. IppolitovIvanov was influenced by the Georgian and Armenian folk songs
that he heard during his years as conductor of the orchestra
in Tbilisi. Sardar, is a title for a feudal lord, military commander,
leader or dignitary historically used in the region.

Orchestral Suite No. 2 (Jean Ainsworth, flute soloist)

- J. S. Bach

Bach composed the second suite for an unknown occasion. Suite No. 2 has three short pieces. The first, Polonaise is a stylized version of a Polish folk song and is a show-piece for solo flautists. The second piece is Menuet, and the third is Badinerie, a rare dance movement and often defined as a piece with a "jocose character." (playful or humorous)

Poem for Orchestra (Liz Kinney, violin soloist)

- John Tatgenhorst

Originally written for and recorded by the London Symphony Orchestra, this is a tender, expressive piece. The gorgeous melody is shared by the strings, flutes, clarinet and trumpets throughout the piece. John has over 600 publications, which include arrangements for Star Wars, Superman, Close Encounters of the Third Kind and The Fugitive.

Star Trek through the years

From the TV screen to the Big Screen, Star Trek has produced hit after hit, each one accompanied by wonderful themes and soundtracks. The score for Star Trek: The Motion Picture was written by Jerry Goldsmith, who wrote the scores for many additional Star Trek movies and TV movies. He has discussed his creative sources for the music: "When you stop and think about it, space is a very romantic thought. It is, to me, like the Old West, we're up in the universe. It's about discovery and new life [...] it's really the basic premise of Star Trek."

Program

Symphony No. 104 in D major (The London)

- Joseph Hadyn

First performance: May 4, 1795, King's Theatre, London. This was the last of twelve symphonies Haydn wrote for English audiences, and it is a fitting capstone to the symphonic tradition he helped to build. At the age of 59, Haydn set out for London at the invitation of German violinist and impresario Johann Peter Salomon. Coming from a relative backwater, near what is still a rural area of the Austrian-Hungarian border, Haydn was aware of the international taste of London audiences and "interested in surprising the public with something new."

O Mio Babbino Caro (Gordon Schmieder Saw soloist)
- Giacomo Puccini

(Oh my dear papa) is a soprano aria from the one-act opera (1918) *Gianni Schicchi* (Ja-knee, ski-kee) by Giacomo Puccini to a libretto by Giovacchino Forzano. It is sung by Lauretta after tensions between her father Schicchi and the family of Rinuccio, the boy she loves, has reached a breaking point that threatens to separate her from Rinuccio.

'O mio babbino caro' is one of the most performed arias of the last 100 years.

Summertime – Porgy and Bess (Gordon Schmieder Saw soloist)
- George Gershwin

'Summertime', is the most covered song in the world. The jazz-inspired song is a lullaby for Clara to sing to her child. Many people think of Porgy and Bess as a musical, when in fact it was written by Gershwin (who came from a musical theatre background) to be his very first opera in 1935.

Por Una Cabeza (Elizabeth Kinney violin soloist and Fusion PAA dancers)
- Carlos Gardel

"Written in 1935, this piece is one of the most well-known Tangos of our time. The song is about a man who lost everything after betting on a horse race, including the woman he admires. "Por una Cabeza," i.e., "to lose by a head," signifies the distance his horse lost in that race. It also carries a tragic story behind it, as both the composer/singer Carlos Gardel and the lyricist Alfredo Le Pera passed away on June 24, 1935 in a devastating plane crash.

Gordon Schmieder - Musical Saw Soloist

Schmieder, known as "THE SAW MAN", has been entertaining audiences in Southern Oregon for over 34 years. Having an interest in music since he was very young, his curiosity with the unusual novelty came into his life when he was a teenager. However, Schmieder was well into his thirties when he taught himself how to coax music from an ordinary handsaw. Now retired, Schmieder continues to enjoy bringing his unique brand of "cutting edge" music to people in all manner of venues. His appearance today with the Three Rivers Community Orchestra completes his dream of presenting a saw as a viable musical instrument in front of a full orchestra.

Elizabeth Kinney – Violin Soloist

Elizabeth moved to Grants Pass in the spring of 2020 from Bakersfield, California. She was a member of the Bakersfield Symphony Orchestra for 25 years and an active church and chamber musician. Elizabeth graduated from UC Santa Barbara, where she studied with Ronald Copes and played in the Santa Barbara Symphony.
