



The Consistory Minutes in Brief April 8, 2024

Treasurer's Report: Tammie Vosburg, Treasurer Report accepted as presented.

Hiahliahts:

- Operating deficit for 2024 YTD ending March 31 is \$732.
- We have had larger-than-expected expenses not funded by remembrance or investments: plumbing, \$1,177, and Electric Repairs, \$347.
- Our investments for the month showed excellent returns.
- We received an additional donation from Norine Haas toward the Scholarship in memory of her husband and son.

Discussion: Was the data recorded for years 22 through 24 comparing the exact dates? Tammie explained they all compare the financials for each year's March.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Becky

Report accepted as presented. Highlights:

- Hours Dedicated to Worship: 39, Hours Dedicated to Pastoral Care: 11, Continuing Education Hours: 1, Office Hours: 24, Meetings: 6, Other: • Co-led confirmation class.
- The PNEC Conference meeting will be from 6/7 to 6/9. Andy Spear is preaching on 6/9.
- Vacation 6/24-6/30, Total Hours: 95

Faith Formation Report: Marji Hughes

The report was accepted as presented. Highlights:

- April 7—Holy Humor Sunday. A Pancake brunch and pancake games followed worship. Over 60 people attended.
- In the fall, Sunday School needs at least two teachers for the older class and two teachers for the pre-K class.
- We plan to hold special communion education for children and their families in the fall. The start date for open communion is possibly the first Sunday in October—Worldwide Communion Sunday.
- Camp Firelight VBS is July 29-August 2. Adult and teen leaders are needed. Registration is open online.
- Our youth will lead the Pentecost Sunday Worship Service on May 19 (Youth Sunday) service. No communion.

Trustees' Report: Ann Brown

- Acorn Stairlift Service/inspection completed.
- Roof Completed The Electrician, Plasterer, and Painter are scheduled to begin in April.
- A new timer box that controls front spots and the sign was replaced.
- Church Yard Clean up April 20 We need bags of mulch donated.
- A Light Bar to replace the center spotlight in the front is needed to provide more light for the choir and to highlight the lectern speaker. We have requested estimates.

Tech Committee:

- Mark Mixa and James Rosenberger have been asked to reset the balcony camera and wiring.
- James Rosenberger completed the installation of the new sound system. We need to plan an education day or days to introduce the new controls to everyone.

Tech Committee (cont.)

After this is completed, we can move everything over to the new system.

Stewardship/ Fundraising: Georgie Stuempfle Stewardship/Fundraising - I met with Pastor Becky on March 25 to discuss sharing 10% of our fundraising profits to special causes. **Special Causes:**

- 1. March/April— Autism Society of the Lehigh Valley
- 2. May—Children's Oraan Fund
- 3. June—Family Promise of Lehigh Valley (families facing homelessness)
- 4. July—Victory House (homeless veterans)
- 5. August—Suicide Prevention

New Business:

• Scholarships: Tom Snyder (Education), Dan Deysher (Music), and our new Rev. Haas and son, Robert Haas (Education), Scholarships for 2024. Each Scholarship of \$1000 will be offered to our student members in 2024.

• Community Day—Third weekend of August. Keith will spearhead this committee and register paperwork with the Borough for two booths this year. The estimated cost is \$20 a Booth, and Keith suggests we have two booths for more room. Again, we plan to serve Strawberry Shortcake.

Scholarship Opportunities

We come to another year of scholarship opportunities. The **Dan Deysher Music Scholarship** and the Tom Snyder Academic Scholarship are both \$1000 - Scholarships sponsored by Jim Santo, a former member of First UCC. Dan and Tom were mentors to Jim, now living in Florida. Dan and Tom have now passed. Dan and Tom were so dedicated to our church. Dan performed over 3000 tributes to veterans in his playing Taps at their funerals and attended and played Taps at the Arizona Memorial Anniversary in Hawaii. The Music Scholarship is open to any member who is an active participant of First UCC, grades K-12 who is studying voice, instrument, dance, or pursuing music in college. "Uncle Tom", as we called him, was a dedicated Sunday School teacher and church volunteer. The Academic Scholarship is open to any high school senior who is a member and active participant of First UCC pursuing further education after high school, including college, technical school, or business school.

New this year is the **Reverend Theodore and Robert Haas Scholarship.** This scholarship has been established by Mrs. Norine Haas in memory of her late husband and son. Reverend Haas served as Pastor of First UCC from 1955-1975. This scholarship is awarded to assist a student already enrolled in college, trade school or business school. The \$1000 scholarship is awarded annually.

Scholarship Application forms will be available in the Church Office on May 12th and are due by May 31st. Scholarships will be awarded in June.
