Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp (reported by **Paul England**) pmk GUILDFORD, SURREY, 12 OC/40. Die in use 1939-1941, and probably been destroyed in the "Blitz" on Sloper's premises in May 1941.

This 1940 date is pre-Blitz, making the die a short-lived Sloper pre-WWII refurbishment die. The only user of "DB", a single headed die, in the Sloper m/s ledger is Dennis Brothers Ltd. This also means that the three suspected post-Blitz *users* in 'Gault' & 'Tomkins' **can be deleted**, as can the two issue 'R' stamps in 'Gault' which are likely to be SWP's covered by D0210.01p.

'Gordon L Jacobs & Co' was in business as Stock & Share Brokers at 61 Old Broad St, London EC, by 1910. **Gordon Lewis Jacobs** (1880-1953).

This is a Standard Alphabet POKO. The company also used another Standard Alphabet POKO, "HL/C" (H4430.01), in use 1932-1939.

'Harrison Bros & Howson', Cutlers in Sheffield and known users of "H.B.&H" (H0640.01) 1885-1915, also had an office in London EC at this time (1884 & 1891 directories), but the similarity in H0635.01/02 make the Stock Brokers the more likely option.

Note: Identity *suspected* from 3 loose stamps (reported by **Dave Finch**) pmk '583' No(t)tingham, JA 2/93. Die in use 1890-1895. This die was likely followed by the full name "PLAYER" (P2910.01), in use 1895-1910.

'**John Player & Co**' established 1877, although John Player was working as a tobacconist & cigar mfr under his own name prior to that. Sometime between 1894 and 1897 the company became '**John Player & Sons Ltd**', becoming part of the '**Imperial Tobacco Co (Great Britain) Ltd**' in 1901.

The entry in the m/s Sloper ledger records a single letter "K" to be used for 'Rolls' of stamps for 'Kon-Tayn-All Ltd'. The 'All' spelling is incorrect as advertisements from as early as 1928 through to 1936/7 all show 'Al'. The spellings used in K1680.01/01p/K1700.01M/02 should all be corrected.

The Corporation moved to the 'Guildhall', High St, in 1935. A 2x2 block points to a single headed die, fitted (probably) to an authority owned perforating press. A 2d stamp used as a receipt has previously been reported with '**Borough**' in mauve printed on it.

The sequence would have been ... "K.C." (K0280.02) 1910-1912, "K.C." (K0270.01) 1915-1928, "K.C." (K0270.01a) 1928-1939, both "RBK" (R5020.01) and "KC" (K0260.01b) 1939-1941, K0260.01p (1941-1943), then K0260.01M (1943-1965). This last die was also used until c2010 after it became a London Royal Borough (leaving Surrey) in 1965. J Sloper & Co and their later incarnations supplied the authority with initialled stamps from c1939 through to the end c2010.

Hardware Merchants, Broad St, Birmingham.

Note: Identity *suspected* without postmark evidence. 'Parker, Winder & Achurch Ltd' were a known customer of Sloper's, both before and after WWII. This is their only customer with these initials. Die in use c1941.

Note: Identity *suspected* from loose stamps postmarked Mainly **London N**. Also **Cardiff**, '447' **Leeds**, **Liverpool**, '67' (Peckham), **London WC**, and London 'Diamond' (Chief Office). Die in use 1871-1900.

Robert Baker (1826-1901) lived in Islington, **London N**, for most of his working life.

T0050.01 T in a rectangle 6 in 26 6 in 8½x11 Ø Robert Tilsed,
Printer & Stationer, High St, Poole,
and High St, Wimborne. [1875, 1880 Dorset
Directories, newspaper reports, BMD records].

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp postmarked '822' (Wimborne). Die in use c1880.

Robert Tilsed (1845-1886) was born in Poole, s/o Robert Tilsed (1809-1884), Master Marriner, and his wife Harriet. Robert Tilsed Jun^r was an Apprentice Printer & Bookbinder aged 15 in the 1861 Census for Poole, and was in business in West St, Poole, by January 1868 as a 'practical bookbinder' - (newspaper advertisement). An 1875 Dorset directory records Robert Tilsed as the printer of the '**Poole Sun & Bournemouth Advertiser**' & Bookseller, in the High St, Poole. Probate records show that he died 1st August 1886, leaving £756 to his wife Maria.

Die in use 1880-1885.

Henry Richardson (1814-1893), inherited the tannery and agricultural merchant's business established in 1780 by his grandfather, Isaac Richardson (1738-1791) and began manufacturing chemical fertilisers. Richardson's factory lay just south of Skeldergate Bridge along the Ouse frontage. Their business was described as '**Chemical Manure Manufacturers, & General Agricultural Merchants**'. Richardson's continued in business until 1973, when it was taken over by 'Hargreaves Fertilisers Ltd', but was closed and demolished shortly afterwards.

The 'Municipal Offices' building ceased to be the local seat of government when the enlarged ***Yeovil District Council*** was formed in 1974, using council offices in Preston Road.

The iconic ‘Brooks Dye Works’ chimney still stands to this day, surrounded by a modern housing complex. The company name on the chimney was built using white bricks, so they never needed painting! A plaque on the chimney tells us that the dye works (on the St Werburghs site) was established by Alfred Brooks in 1862, and didn’t close until 2007.
